Evidentiary Hearings were held on 8/6/25 and 8/7/25. By Recommended Decision issued on 10/3/25, ALJs Watson and Allensworth recommended, *inter alia*, that Columbia Gas of Pennsylvania, Inc’s (Columbia) requested increase be denied in its entirety or, in the alternative that the Commission approve an increase in NGD revenues in the amount of approximately \$66.424 million. On 10/14/25, Columbia, the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA), and The Pennsylvania State University (PSU) filed Exceptions.
