#### **NAME AND SUBJECT: FIRSTENERGY PENNSYLVANIA ELECTRIC COMPANY**

Petition filed on 11/26/25, requesting that the Commission approve: (1) FirstEnergy Pennsylvania Electric Company's (FEPA) Act 129 Phase V Energy Efficiency and Conservation (EE&C) Plan (Phase V Plan); and (2) its proposed tariff to recover the Phase V Plan costs. Numerous Parties filed comments and intervened in the proceeding. On 2/19/26, a Joint Petition for Full Settlement of Issues and Statements in Support was filed. The Commission's Phase V Implementation Order states that the Commission will approve or reject all or part of a Phase V EE&C Plan (Plan) at a Public Meeting within 120 days of the filing of the Plan. The matter was assigned to the Office of Administrative Law Judge for hearing and ALJ Arnold certified the record to the Commission on 2/20/26.
