Informal Investigation instituted on or about 6/1/22, regarding UGI Utilities, Inc. - Gas Division's (UGI) compliance with Chapter 56 regulations involving personal contact requirement prior to the termination of residential service. On 3/24/25, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (BIE) filed a Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement (Settlement). The Commission entered an Opinion and Order on 5/8/25 soliciting comments on the Settlement. On 6/17/25, the Coalition for Affordable Utility Services and Energy Efficiency in Pennsylvania (CAUSE-PA) filed Comments. On 6/18/25, the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) filed Comments. BIE filed Reply Comments on 7/3/25 and UGI filed Reply Comments on 7/22/25. On 10/9/25, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order asking the Settling Parties to address several questions to assist the Commission in determining if the Settlement Agreement is in the public interest (October 2025 Order). The October 2025 Order gave the Settling Parties 30 days to submit additional information. On 11/7/25, the Settling Parties submitted additional information that responded to the October 2025 Order (Supplemental Filing). On 11/26/25, CAUSE-PA filed a Letter in response to the Supplemental Filing. On 12/19/25, both BIE and UGI filed Letters in response to CAUSE-PA's Letter.

Formal Complaint (FC) filed on 2/6/23, timely appealing an informal decision of the Bureau of Consumer Services, alleging that UGI Utilities Inc. – Gas (UGI) improperly charged the Complainant for gas service after demanding additional payments for past service, after UGI discovered that the meters used to bill the Complainant for service and the residents in another unit had been improperly identified, installed, and monitored. On 4/28/23, UGI filed an answer. On 4/23/25, following several hearings, the Commission issued the Initial Decision of ALJ Farren, wherein the ALJ found that UGI failed to review the repayment options under Section 56.14, or render a billing statement that complied with Section 56.15, of the Commission’s rules and regulations and imposed a \$1500 penalty. UGI filed Exceptions on 6/3/25. No Replies to Exceptions were filed. By Opinion and Order entered 3/12/26, the Commission sustained the FC, denied the Exceptions, and imposed a civil penalty on UGI. On 3/27/26, UGI filed a Petition for Reconsideration. The Commission issued an Opinion and Order to retain jurisdiction of the matter on 4/3/26.

On 6/18/25, Evitts Creek filed responses to TUS Data Requests that included a revised LSLR Plan, a revised pro forma tariff supplement (Pro Forma Tariff), and revised Data Responses to 52 Pa. Code § 53.52. Evitts Creek submitted proof of service to the appropriate entities. Except as discussed above, no other answers or comments were filed, and no additional hearings were held.
