Tariff Electric – Pa. P.U.C. No. 9 (Tariff No. 9) filed on 3/30/26, to become effective 5/29/26, containing proposed changes in rates, rules, and regulations calculated to produce approximately \$429 million (11%). As proposed, the total bill for a residential customer using 700 kWh per month would increase from \$160.37 to \$180.45 (12.5%). On 4/1/26, Ross Wexler filed a Formal Complaint. On 4/7/26, Tenant Union Representative Network and the Coalition for Affordable Utility Services and Energy Efficiency in Pennsylvania filed a Formal Complaint.
