On 1/17/25, I&E and Peoples filed a Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement (Settlement). By Interim Order dated 10/27/25, ALJ Watson reopened the record and rejected the Settlement. On 12/5/25, I&E and Peoples filed a Joint Petition for Interlocutory Review (Petition) and on 12/12/25 I&E filed an Amended Brief in support of the Petition. Peoples filed a brief in support of the Petition on 12/15/25. By Opinion and Order entered 12/18/25, the Commission returned the matter to Office of Administrative Law Judge for the Issuance of a Recommended Decision (R.D.) on the Settlement. By R.D. issued on 1/29/26, ALJ Watson recommended denying the Settlement. On 2/5/26, I&E and Peoples filed their respective Exceptions to the R.D. By Opinion and Order entered 3/26/26, the Commission granted I&E's Exceptions and approved the Settlement in its entirety (3/26 Order). On 4/24/26, Peoples filed a Petition to Amend the 3/26 Order. By Notational Vote, the Commission granted People's Petition on 5/12/26.

RECOMMENDATION: That, consistent with 4 Pa. Code § 1.43(c), this action be recorded and entered in the minutes of the public meeting.
