Notice of Proposed Rulemaking Order (NOPR) intended to review the Commission's current rules relating to cybersecurity, including 52 Pa. Code §§ 57.11 (accident reporting for electric utilities), 59.11 (accident reporting for gas utilities), 61.11 (accident reporting for steam utilities), 61.45 (security planning for steam utilities), 65.2 (accident reporting for water utilities) and 101.1–101.7 (Chapter 101, public utility preparedness through self-certification), and to propose regulations requiring jurisdictional public utilities to report covered cybersecurity incidents and conform to specific standards and frameworks, namely the National Institute of Standards and Technology Cybersecurity Framework (NIST CSF), as well as maintain and adhere to specific evaluations, programs, and plans based on the number of customers each public utility serves. The proposed regulations mandate each public utility to file annually with the Commission a certification that the public utility is in compliance with the specified standards and requirements and consolidate cybersecurity incident reporting requirements into a singular chapter of its regulations.
