AMERICAN WATER COMPANY - WATER AND WASTEWATER**

Supplement No. 58 to Tariff Water-PA P.U.C. No. 5 filed on 11/14/25, proposing an increase in rates calculated to produce approximately \$152.4 million in additional annual water service operating revenues. On this same date, the Company also filed Supplement No. 61 to Tariff Wastewater-PA P.U.C. No. 16, wherein it proposed an increase in rates calculated to produce approximately \$16.3 million in additional annual wastewater service operating revenues. Both proposed increases were based on data for the fully projected future test year ending 6/30/27. An evidentiary hearing was held on 3/23/26. By Recommended Decision issued on 5/15/26, ALJs DeVoe and Watson recommended, inter alia, that the requested increases be denied in their entirety or, in the alternative that the Commission approve an increase in annual water revenues in the amount of approximately \$51.49 million, and an increase in annual wastewater revenues in the amount of approximately \$31.18 million. On 5/26/26, the Company, the Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (BIE), the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA), the Office of Small Business Advocate, and Cleveland-Cliffs Steel filed Exceptions. On 6/2/26, the Company, BIE, the OCA, the Coalition for Affordable Utility Services and Energy Efficiency in Pennsylvania, and Victory Brewing Company filed Replies to Exceptions.
