I have received your decision regarding
our PUC case with Peco Energy.
I respect your decision and I am
trying to act in a good faith
manner with PECO,

I received a shut off notice for
February 9, 2010, (please see attached)
if I do not pay the entire balance
before then.

I have tried to negotiate with
the company in a reasonable manner
and offering to pay Five Hundred Dollars
over and above each monthly bill
and increase this payment to
\$600¹⁰ Dollars after 12 months and
700-800 dollars after 24 months,

I have made each and every payment since our hearing with you in April 2009. Our balance has not increased since then. In fact I made a payment of \$896 = two days ago.

Since our hearing with you I have been forced to file a lawsuit against my former employer in United States Federal District Court (In Trenton)

In retaliation my former employer has stopped paying me. See attached. They are punitively trying to punish me for suing them.

I have no income right now and have been only able to pay my bills by loans from my family.

I realize that the perception is I live in a large home in an

better neighborhood, so that I am affluent. This is not the case and I am trying to work this out so that my family will not be in a cold house next week.

I am respectfully requesting a stay of this shut off notice from PECO and acceptance of my revised payment offer.

I have tried to work something out with PECO's attorneys who have told me that anything less than $\frac{1}{3}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ of the balance is not acceptable, Peco has also said they will not accept any medical certifications either.

I can file for bankruptcy immediately and PECO will have to keep my power on and essentially get almost nothing. I don't want to do this, I used their service and would like

to do the right thing and pay
for it.
