Re: Joint Petition for Consolidation of Proceedings and Approval of Energy Efficiency and Conservation Plans of Metropolitan Edison Company, Pennsylvania Electric Company and Pennsylvania Power Company Docket Nos. M-2009-2092222, M-2009-2112952, M-2009-2112956

Dear Secretary McNulty:

On February 5, 2010, in accordance with the Commission's Opinion and Order entered on January 28, 2010 in the above-captioned matter, Metropolitan Edison Company, Pennsylvania Electric Company and Pennsylvania Power Company ("the Companies") submitted final Energy Efficiency and Conservation Plans for Commission review and approval. The final plans incorporated only the revisions that were directed by the Commission in its Order dated January 28, 2010. No additional changes were made to the plans. The plans were blacklined to show the changes made from the previously submitted plans, and a description of the changes along with page number references was included in the Companies' cover letter.

The Companies also included tariff supplements for each of the Companies in the filing of February 5, 2010. The tariff supplements included an updated cost recovery calculation reflecting rates to become effective on March 1, 2010. Due to the fact that certain charges will be recovered over a fixed time period through a rate based on the number of months in said time period, the Companies requested that the Commission approve their final plans at the Public Meeting of February 25, 2010 and enter an Order immediately thereafter so as to minimize the monthly charge to customers.

On February 12, 2010, a Secretarial Letter was issued confirming the due date of February 16, 2010 for parties to file Comments on the Companies' plans. In addition, and in order to expedite the consideration of the Companies' plans, the Secretarial Letter assigned February 23, 2010, as the due date for Reply Comments. The Companies appreciate the Commission's expediting of this process.

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On February 16, 2010, the Met-Ed Industrial Users Group, the Penelec Industrial Customers Alliance and the Penn Power Users Group ("the Industrials") filed Comments raising concerns about a specific aspect of the implementation of the Companies' commercial EE&C programs that were not modified and approved by the Commission's prior orders in this proceeding. In a subsequent discussion with the Industrials, the Companies committed to address this implementation issue to ensure that there is no limit on available program incentives per metered account for individual customers under the Companies' commercial EE&C programs. The Companies recognize that if they wish to consider proposing such a cap on program incentives per metered account in the future, such a modification would require a filing with and approval by the Commission. On February 19, 2010, the Industrials filed a letter stating that their concerns have been resolved by the Companies and that they were withdrawing their Comments of February 16, 2010.

Inasmuch as no other party has filed Comments to the Companies' plans submitted on February 5, 2010, and the Industrials' Comments have been withdrawn, the Companies hereby confirm that they will not be submitting any further Reply Comments. The Companies are hopeful that the Commission and its Staff will have adequate time to address the Companies' plans at the Public Meeting of February 25, 2010 and enter an Order immediately thereafter.

The Companies respectfully request that the Commission issue an Order with specific ordering paragraphs that:

- 1. Approve the Companies' final Energy Efficiency and Conservation Plans, dated February 5, 2010;
- 2. Approve each of the Companies' tariff supplements; and
- 3. Authorize the Companies to implement their respective Energy Efficiency and Conservation Change Rider and rates, effective March 1, 2010.
