Re: McCarroll v. UGI Penn Natural Gas, Inc., Docket No. C-2009-2090228

Dear Secretary McNulty:

This letter is filed in accordance with Commission's Order entered December 23, 2010, in the above-captioned proceeding ("Order"). Specifically, in the Order, the Commission required UGI Penn Natural Gas, Inc. ("UGI PNG"), to provide the following:

3. That within sixty (60) days of the date of entry of this Opinion and Order, UGI Penn Natural Gas, Inc. shall modify its service application form and procedures so that before an application is signed by either party, applicants are clearly informed about whether an application for service will or will not require a contribution from the customer for a line or main extension, and if so, the amount of the contribution that will be required from the applicant under the UGI Penn Natural Gas, Inc. tariff. The amount of a customer's contribution, if any, shall be presented on the service application form.

4. That within sixty (60) days of the date of entry of this Opinion and Order, UGI Penn Natural Gas, Inc. shall notify the Commission Secretary that the modifications to its service application form and procedures set forth in Ordering Paragraph No. 3 have been implemented.

Order, Ordering Paragraph Nos. 3 and 4.

With respect to Ordering Paragraph No. 3, UGI PNG hereby represents that it modified its service application forms and procedures to comply with the Order. These forms and procedures now provide that before an application is signed by either party, applicants must be clearly informed about whether an application for


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service will or will not require a contribution from the customer for a line or main extension, and if so, the amount of the contribution that will be required from the applicant under the Secretary McNulty tariff. The amount of a customer's contribution, if any, shall be presented on the service application form.

With respect to Ordering Paragraph No. 4, UGI PNG represents that the modification to its service application procedures and forms discussed in the above paragraph have been implemented, effective March 1, 2010.

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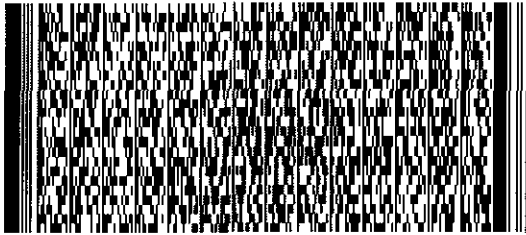
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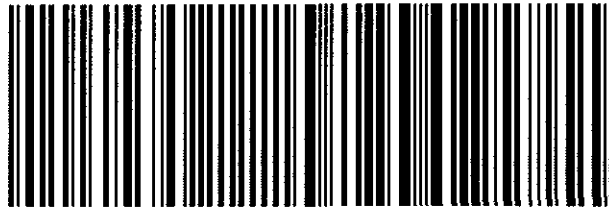


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
