EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY:

PARTNER: AUMAN WEIS ENTERPRISES: May 2008 to Present: Grant writing and business development services. We presently have three monthly contracts for services. At the present time we have had two grants approved, one from the Health Resources Services Administration and one from the Pennsylvania Energy Development Authority.

FUND DEVELOPER/GRANT WRITER: Elk Regional Health System, St. Marys, Pennsylvania – September 2002 – March 2010.

This position involves grant writing for the Elk Regional Health Center and the Community Nurses. Additionally the position was responsible for fund raising efforts for both agencies (i.e. planned giving, fund drives, etc.). Over ten million dollars was realized due to grants from foundations and government agencies and fundraising activities. Monies were received as part of an Alternative Fuels Project. The Health System was the first healthcare agency in Pennsylvania to utilize Biomass, therefore, they were one in twenty-six agencies nationwide to receive a Woody Biomass Grant from USDA Forest Service. The funding package for the project resulted from many federal, state and local sources.

This position also required extensive work with volunteer boards, liaison with governmental officials and interaction with community and industrial leaders.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR: Kane Area Industrial Development Corporation, Kane, Pennsylvania – May 2002 – September 2003. This position involved all aspects of industrial development and grant writing.

SUBSTITUTE TEACHER: St. Marys Area School District, Elk County Christian High School, St. Marys Alliance Schools, St. Marys, Pennsylvania - March 1998 - Present.

POOL MANAGER: St. Marys Country Club, St. Marys, Pennsylvania - May 1999 - September 2000.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR: The City of DuBois Redevelopment Authority, DuBois, Pennsylvania - March 1995 - March 1998.

This position was responsible for the operation of the Redevelopment Authority. Work duties included grantsmanship, coordination of the City of DuBois Community Development Block Grant program, management of properties owned by the Redevelopment Authority, liaison with local agencies and supervision of staff. Over the course of three years the Authority received approximately two and a half million dollars for projects.
