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

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

Harvard learns how to buy power at wholesale

Learns to like it

Retail competition has brought countless benefits to large customers — even Harvard University — but what if you can't get a retail marketer to make an attractive offer?

Harvard energy buyer, Mary Smith, tried to buy at wholesale and got a quick education in a different way of life.

Scott Bryant, top power buyer from the paper firm Mead Westvaco, told why his firm prefers the risks and gain from buying direct from generators.

Scott Helm, president of American PowerNet, a pioneer of direct buying at wholesale, joined a Restructuring Today audio conference yesterday exploring the value and process of buying power from in the wholesale market.

Mead Westvaco just couldn't find a

retail marketer that met the firm's needs, Bryant said.

The company's unusual load profile didn't entice much savings from retailers, so Bryant explored the wholesale market, with Scott Helm's guidance.

What he found was a range of benefits, including more willing suppliers and greater flexibility and a lot more offers.

It's easier to buy at retail, Helm admitted, but the "name of the game now is flexibility."

Wholesale buying best positions customers to take advantage of all the benefits of open markets, he added

Wholesale buying gives customers greater opportunity to take advantage of market prices, Helm noted.

The wholesale market lets customers buy in portfolios to hedge against market timing.

By splitting load on different schedules
— an option not available at retail —
customers have leverage in the market and
spread risk among several providers.

Customers are never fully in or out of the market with portfolio buying.

Wholesale buying exposes customers to negative prices — when dispatchers scare generators off the gird by making them pay power buyers for the power they use

Wholesale buying spreads credit risk, expands price transparency and boosts liquidity, panelists noted.

The start-up costs and process of wholesale buying were explained along with how to set up hedges.

CEC has grim outlook for state's energy

Transmission congestion and related reliability services cost California over \$1 billion last year, the California Energy Commission (CEC) found.

California, said CEC, lacks a wellintegrated grid-planning and permitting process.

The process would merge G&T needs, evaluate non-wire alternatives, plan for grid corridors long before they're needed and allow access to renewable resources.

CEC wants a transfer of linesiting authority from the PUC to itself

It listed challenges facing the state from high prices to thin reserves.

The report blames inaction on earlier unheeded CEC warnings.

CEC gave its sister agency a pat on the back for progress in setting resource adequacy for IOUs but cited the PUC's lack of authority over government generation.

Government utilities provide up to 25% of the state's power, CEC added.

The CEC urged lawmakers to

adopt resource adequacy requirements for all load-serving entities.

More than 7,000 mw of approved generation is in limbo, the CEC warned, because generators won't build without long-term power contracts.

IOUs are vulnerable to wild price spikes without long-term agreements, CEC claimed.

Short-term contracts keep IOUs reliant on aging plants that are costlier than new, more efficient plants.

Hotter summers and drier winters could doom the state to more blackouts, CEC cautioned, with boosted demand and less hydro output while retirement of aging plants could cut reserve margins.

The CEC urged more DG incentives as a solution.

Meanwhile cogenerators are struggling to find power buyers and utilities are unwilling to renew existing QF contracts, the CEC noted.

Some cogenerators, CEC added, have even scrapped their systems in favor of less efficient boilers.

Requiring utilities to buy DG power at prevailing wholesale prices could solve

the problem, the report argues.

The CEC offered rate incentives for utilities promoting cogeneration.

Demand-response programs, CEC claimed, are the most promising and cost-effective options to cut peak use.

The commission thinks California power demand will grow 1.2% to 1.6% annually. We've heard higher. New metering technology will be

the main way to implement either voluntary or mandatory demand response, the CEC forecast.

The state's process for getting green power is overly complex and is delaying the ability to meet renewable deadlines, the CEC discovered.

The report urged the PUC and CEC to simplify, streamline and expedite the Renewable Portfolio Standard (RPS) process.

The two agencies should set RPS rules to let energy service providers and community choice aggregators participate in the program.

CEC thinks rules for limited trading of renewable energy certificates should be adopted.

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
