Pursuant to the Commission's May 7, 2004 Final Rulemaking Order amending Electric Service Reliability Regulations (52 Pa. Code §§57.191 - 57.197) at Docket Nos. L-00030161 and M-00991220, UGI Utilities, Inc. - Electric Division ("UGI") hereby files an original and six copies of its Quarterly System Reliability Report. This report contains SAIDI, SAIFI, and CAIDI results on a 12-month rolling basis for the period ending September 30, 2010 along with the raw data from the same period. The actual statistics continue to be favorable to both the benchmark and standard adopted for UGI. Also included is a breakdown of outages by cause for the 12 months ending September 30, 2010.

SAIDI

The SAIDI value for the 12 months ending September 2010 is 51. This result is 11% lower than results reported through June 2010.

SAIFI

The 12-month rolling SAIFI index increased 4% from 0.49 in our last quarterly report to 0.51 for the period ending September 2010.

CAIDI

The CAIDI result of 98 for the 12-month reporting period ending September 2010 is down 16% from our last report.

The results for each of the three reliability indices remain well below their respective standard and benchmark levels. The most significant reason has been the absence of any type of storms during the past eight-months. Weather conditions have a considerable impact on these results.
