# STATEMENT OF THE WEST PENN POWER INDUSTRIAL INTERVENORS IN SUPPORT OF THE JOINT PETITION FOR PARTIAL SETTLEMENT

### I. BACKGROUND

The West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors ("WPPII"), by and through its counsel, submit that the Joint Petition for Partial Settlement ("Joint Petition" or "Settlement") filed in the above-captioned proceeding with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("PUC" or "Commission") on October 25, 2010, reflects a settlement among the Joint Petitioners with respect to the Application filed by West Penn Power Company d/b/a Allegheny Power ("West Penn"), Trans-Allegheny Interstate Line Company ("TrAILCo"), and FirstEnergy Corp. ("FirstEnergy") (collectively, "Joint Applicants"), requesting that the control of West Penn and TrAILCo be transferred from Allegheny Energy, Inc. ("Allegheny Energy"), the parent company of West Penn and TrAILCo, to FirstEnergy, via a merger of Allegheny Energy with Element Merger Sub., Inc. ("Merger Sub"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of FirstEnergy.

On June 14, 2010, WPPII filed a Petition to Intervene in the above-captioned proceeding. As noted in WPPII's Petition, WPPII members receive electric service from West Penn and use substantial volumes of electricity in their manufacturing and operational processes. As a result, WPPII members were concerned with the effects of the proposed merger on retail competition and retail markets in Pennsylvania, as well as the effects on transmission and distribution rates. Additionally, WPPII was interested in the calculation of synergy savings created by the merger and the allocation of these savings among customers.

WPPII submits that the Joint Petition addresses the aforementioned concerns, as well as provides additional benefits to all West Penn customers. As such, WPPII concludes that the Joint Petition is in the public interest. For reasons set forth in the Settlement, as well as those highlighted herein, WPPII respectfully requests that Administrative Law Judges ("ALJs") Wayne L. Weismandel and Mary D. Long and the Commission endorse the terms and conditions of the Joint Petition and approve the merger.

### II. STATEMENT IN SUPPORT

As a direct result of settlement discussions, the Joint Petitioners in this proceeding have agreed upon the terms embodied in the foregoing Joint Petition.

- 1. As a result of the Joint Petition, WPPII members will benefit through the post-merger FirstEnergy's commitment to, among other things:
  - a. Procure 40% of West Penn's solar requirements for the period 2011 through 2021 using long-term contracts and contract with credit-worthy industrial customers to purchase Solar Photovoltaic Alternative Energy Credits ("SPAECs") from those customers producing SPAECs within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania;

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- b. Maintain the availability section and the distribution rate design of Schedules 44 and 46 of the currently existing West Penn retail tariff and any conjunctive billing agreement in effect for distribution rates on the effective date of this agreement for five (5) years from the date of the merger's consummation; and
- c. Establish a joint technical committee to identify, discuss and address local power and service quality issues impacting industrial customers served by West Penn and, specifically, service issues that can be addressed through technical, operational or equipment changes that can be made on equipment used directly in furnishing service to the impacted customer or on the customer's side of the interface.
- 2. The Joint Petition also benefits WPPII members and is in the public interest because the post-merger FirstEnergy will:
  - a. Increase in scale, scope and diversification;
  - b. Increase its financial strength and flexibility;
  - c. Experience enhanced expertise in competitive energy markets, energy technologies and regional issues;
  - d. Maintain a commitment to employees and seek to enhance employee opportunities;
  - e. Produce synergies, efficiencies and cost savings that will, at least in part, flow to ratepayers; and
  - f. Benefit from strong leadership in local communities, including FirstEnergy's commitment, for a period of three years, to maintain at least Allegheny's

current levels of charitable support in local communities, and, thereafter, to

continue to support local charities at levels consistent with FirstEnergy's

commitments to other communities it serves.

3. In addition, the Settlement is in the public interest because the Joint Petitioners

and Commission will incur less expenses than they otherwise would have if the proceeding had

been fully litigated.

4. WPPII hereby adopts the representations offered by the Joint Applicants with

respect to the twelve questions posed by the PUC, as set forth in the Commission's June 3, 2010,

Secretarial Letter.

WHEREFORE, the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors respectfully request that

Administrative Law Judges Weismandel and Long and the Pennsylvania Public Utility

Commission approve the foregoing Joint Petition for Settlement.
