PREHEARING MEMORANDUM OF THE WEST PENN POWER INDUSTRIAL INTERVENORS

As requested by Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Wayne L. Weismandel in the May 24, 2010, Prehearing Conference Order, the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors ("WPPII") hereby submit this Prehearing Memorandum.

I. HISTORY OF THE PROCEEDING

On May 14, 2010, West Penn Power Company d/b/a Allegheny Power ("West Penn"), Trans-Allegheny Interstate Line Company ("TrAILCo"), and FirstEnergy Corp. ("FirstEnergy") (collectively, "Applicants"), applied for a Certificate of Public Convenience under Section 1102(a)(3) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 1102(a)(3), requesting, among other things, that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("PUC" or "Commission") approve a "change in control" of West Penn and TrAILCo ("Merger Application"). Through the Merger Application, the Applicants request that the control of West Penn and TrAILCo be transferred from Allegheny Energy, Inc. ("Allegheny Energy"), the parent company of West Penn and

TrAILCo, to FirstEnergy, via a merger of Allegheny Energy with Element Merger Sub., Inc. ("Merger Sub"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of FirstEnergy.

On June 14, 2010, WPPII filed a Petition to Intervene in this proceeding. A description of WPPII is set forth in Paragraph 3 of its Petition to Intervene. A Prehearing Conference has been scheduled in this proceeding for June 22, 2010, before ALJs Wayne L. Weismandel and Mary D. Long. WPPII's Petition to Intervene awaits disposition by the ALJs.

II. ANTICIPATED ISSUES AND SUB-ISSUES

WPPII is concerned with issues regarding the terms and conditions of their electricity service. Specifically, WPPII is concerned that the proposed merger could adversely impact service reliability in the West Penn service territory and may also result in a negative impact on its transmission and distribution rates. WPPII also questions whether the merger is prudent and in the public interest. In addition, WPPII is concerned that the proposed merger will have anticompetitive effects on Pennsylvania's retail electricity markets and PJM Interconnection, L.L.C.'s ("PJM") wholesale electricity markets. WPPII anticipates pursuing these issues during this proceeding, and also reserves the right to raise further issues and to respond to issues raised by other parties.

III. PROPOSED WITNESSES

WPPII is still evaluating whether it will present any witnesses in this proceeding. If WPPII determines that it will present such witnesses, WPPII will inform the ALJs and the other parties as soon as possible. WPPII also intends to participate in this proceeding through the submission of discovery, cross-examination of other parties' witnesses, and the submission of briefs, exceptions and reply exceptions, if necessary.

IV. PROPOSED SCHEDULE AND DISCOVERY RULES

WPPII will cooperate with the ALJs and the parties at the Prehearing Conference to

develop an appropriate procedural schedule and discovery rules in accordance with the

Commission's regulations and any directives issued by the ALJs.

V. POSSIBILITY OF SETTLEMENT

WPPII is willing to participate in discussions with the other parties to amicably resolve

the issues in this proceeding.
