
Dear Sir,

This letter is to dispute the ruling regarding the rate changes of waste water in Claysville by The Pennsylvania American Water Company. We have a well that has no shortage of water supply, so we do not intend to switch to city water, but we do use city sewage do to a septic system that no longer works.

We have long been over-charged for our sewage water, based on a local household average, when we are only two in our household. We find this to be unacceptable.

Those that have 'city water' are charged for their water usage based on metered information. We want the PAWC to install a meter on our well so that we are billed for our actual water usage and not a local average that we have never been the benchmark of.

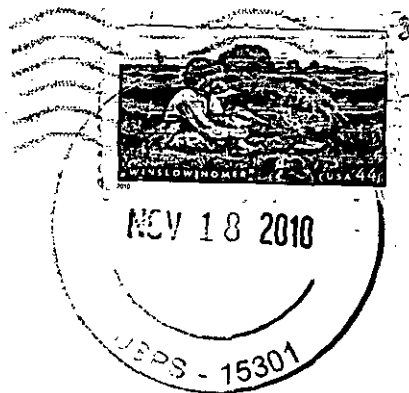
