

SUBJECT: Removal of propane "temporary" tank farm that supplies the Farmington Way Subdivision (25 homes) for the last six years

We believe that this "temporary" propane farm should be converted to natural gas as soon as possible. We were promised that the underground pipelines would be installed within one year. The time has come to make the conversion to natural gas as promised and remove the potential hazard of above ground tanks. New subdivisions have been developed nearby and hooked up to natural gas while our community continues to wait.

We were informed by UGI Amerigas services staff that the company failed to fill the tanks as required for safe operation. As a result, all 25 residences in our subdivision had their gas shut-off by UGI representatives on Sunday, September 6, 2009 because the three tanks were allowed to run dry.


We understand that it is not safe to run propane tanks to below 20% capacity. Lack of proper oversight to monitor the condition and capacity of the tanks is unacceptable negligence and hazardous to the public well being.

We also believe the propane tank farm is far too close to the nearby residences in this subdivision and is a very dangerous condition that needs immediate attention. We look forward to a prompt resolution of this situation.
