Responding to correspondence, letters and appearances for the hearings requested by Robbie Chatman for some relief of Peco energy charges.

Your letter states I requested the hearings for my benefit, but I failed to respond to the hearing dates provided and inconvenienced hearing judge, Christopher Pell and others for both hearings, January 11, 2011 and March 3, 2011.

It is true I was unable to attend the January meeting as I was following up with a surgical procedure I had had in late December for cataract removal in my right eye. I had just had my left eye done several months before, and after each procedure I had to follow up for check up the next day and several days a week for three weeks thereafter.

I called for another hearing date and was granted the March 3rd date. Unfortunately for me I miss read the date and also spoke to one of the clerks at the hearing office. I was under the impression the meeting was set for March 31st, which is the date I went down to the Philadelphia hearing room at 801 Market Street in Philadelphia, so of course there was no hearing that day. I called the office at that time and spoke to the receptionist, who told me I would be getting a letter from the judge of the disposition.

I can not tell you how sorry I am to have missed speaking to Judge Pell. I am still interested in getting my issues resolved. Part of what I don't understand is how several years ago this bill seemed to have simply increased enormously suddenly and if the CAP or any other program caused the increase after I was taken off of those benefits.?

Secondly, I want to know, if there is a way for me to ever get any of those benefits again. I truly want to get a better handle on this account.

I believe from your correspondence, you have good understanding of my health issues and age, so I am extremely grateful for all your tolerance and patience. I do have documentation of all my medical procedures if you need them, but I would like to just proceed with getting all of this delay behind me and move into a more favorable position with Peco.

At age 78, I am grateful to my employer for continually allowing me to work (part-time), so with this part-time income and my social security (my only income) I want several things:


1. To have some of this balance forgiven with some sort of plan which would allow me to pay **NOT** more than \$350.00 monthly, adding more as I can.
2. Please keep in mind, I have good health insurance, but I am paying nearly \$600.00 monthly for medical coverage alone plus prescriptions, I am not complaining, simply stating what happens each month.

When I went to the hearing office, I had four (4) copies of bills and letters of complaints and other correspondence of which I wanted to discuss, but I am not enclosing that information in this letter, but if you would like to see what I have, I would be more than agreeable to send it to you. I think, however, copies of most of it are already in your possession.

Please notify me of your decision.

Thank you and your staff for all the efforts made in my behalf.
