

BALLARD. Continued from NEWS 1. Merli's aunt, told of two children who will no longer have their mother. Merli, 10, missed their 'book box' and his beautiful brother.

Luther Marsh, 73, said he has nightmares about the last moments of his brother Alvin Marsh, who faced capital in the 'Saw' during World War II. The lives of three generations of the family were taken by Ballard, Luther noted. Geraldine Dorwart, Merli's mother, said she wants to stay strong for her grand children, 14 and 12, when she is raising in the same 1917 Lincoln Ave. home where their mother and the others were killed.

Janet Zernelt, Zernelt's daughter, was at a birthday party for her daughter when she learned her father had been attacked. Her future husband had been planning to ask his permission to marry her the next weekend, she recounted. Dressed in her home in Maryland to Pennsylvania she found out through a phone call that her father was dead. Janet said, "Now all I have is a voice message on my parents' answering machine of my dad talking. Jamie said, 'And I call it just to hear his voice again.'"

The statements came after prosecutors and Ballard's defense team met with Judge Edward Smith without the jury and went paragraph by paragraph through the writs the family members because of Ballard's extensive references to Ballard and details of the crime, as the lawyers. "The charges -- for instance, deletion of 'brutally' and 'violent and tragic' -- brought gasps and frustration from relatives in the audience. Smith said some of the editing was difficult for him to order, but that it was necessary under constitutional principles.

Also Tuesday jurors heard from two of Merli's former boyfriends. Brian Miller said he was twice engaged to her, but saw both engagements end because of Ballard. Peter Hoff said he had rekindled a romance with Merli the night before the murders. District Attorney John Morganelli says a death sentence is appropriate for Ballard, who sought not only to kill his girlfriend, but to "punish her" by also murdering her family.

Ballard's public defenders, Michael Costello and James Costello, are seeking a life sentence, arguing their client's tough childhood, brain damage and overbearing parents helped lead him to snap. The evening before the killings, Ballard learned that Merli had been seeing others, according to testimony.

Merli's friend, Marilyn Rivera, said Tuesday he called her many times in the lead-up to the murders, asking about Merli and where she was. In one of the calls, Rivera recounted, Ballard said he loved Merli "so much, he couldn't let her go." Ballard was "agitated" and said he was angry and "had never felt that way before," Rivera recalled. Ballard also told her that he had "fallen in love" and "didn't know what to do about it."


