Mr. Judge:

Your latest letter and some of its contents are contrary to my letters and help U.G.I. You say U.G.I. does not owe me anything for damages to my kitchen. Then why did U.G.I. Corp. pay for plumber, shutoff their labor, water heaters, furnaces and busted water pipes. This nightmare occurred when U.G.I. switched to natural gas. This same company used to make gas from coal. U.G.I. begins to travel into waters they know nothing about. What also happened is an industry using chemicals they knew even less about. Gas pipe which does NOT leak. Their line goes up and down two mountains and a long length of State Route 309 and leads into Hazleton. No leaks for nearly 53 years.

Everything is horizontal, except one pipe. This pipe goes to the furnace, then goes horizontal into the furnace creating what U.G.I. thought was the perfect hook-up. Their liquid seal already inside all that pipe! What was about to happen proves U.G.I. did not know enough about a chemical that created a costly nightmare for three years. People went to FL, CA, South Carolina and other places and left sometime in October or November and stayed longer than two weeks. When they returned they walked into a house that was very cold.

The furnace doesn't work? No. Turns on. The pipes will freeze and that's exactly what happen. *Why? U.G.I. now has to make hotel arrangements and PAY for the room or rooms.

After about two years, U.G.I. began to lose customer after customer.

U.G.I. paid for this damage and also lost some customers, many customers. They can't pay me. Why?

I recently had a new heating system installed. The chimney is no longer used. This creates a new nightmare. The chemical used to create a liquid seal in a natural gas line is now going on my vinyl siding, kitchen window and its capping. It's also going on brand new railing. The vinyl is not that old either, installed in 2007. A white birch tree also died about 7 feet from the gas duct. The color matches the color on the inside kitchen wall perfectly. Please tell someone (Plum-Air) that I do not want this on my vinyl siding, railing, kitchen window and capping. And please, send someone here and take U.G.I.'s drip pipe off since it was not properly inspected the first time U.G.I. came to my residence.

They can create health problems, ruin kitchens and now U.G.I.'s chemical is not only on the inside, now its on the outside. You owe me the benefit of doubt. I am interested in the health problems created by this liquid seal. You want to know why nobody knew for 52 years its because they are all making money! Who made a lot of money during U.G.I.'s three year nightmare just hotels, plumbers companies who sold furnaces, water heaters, pipe, parts needed for repairs, stores, restaurants, laundromats, gas for their car, bus rides, maybe even room service. People that sold diesel fuel.
