Aqua Pennsylvania, Inc. (Aqua) has issued a precautionary boil order for customers in the vicinity of Beatty Road between Crum Creek Road and Barry Drive in Springfield Township, Delaware County, served by the Crum Creek Water Treatment Plant.

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a full boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until further notice. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.

What happened? What is being done?

A water line break occurred today (Saturday, May 15, 2010) at the Crum Creek Water Treatment that caused a loss of pressure. The affected line has been repaired. When water service is restored, Aqua will flush the mains and collect bacteriological samples.

It is not expected that the boil water notice will be lifted until Monday morning, May 17, 2010 at the earliest when results of the bacteriological samples are available.
