PETITION TO REOPEN THE RECORD

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.571 and 5.431, Verizon Pennsylvania Inc., Verizon North LLC, MCImetro Access Transmission Services LLC d/b/a Verizon Access Transmission Services and MCI Communications Services Inc. (together, “Verizon”) respectfully request that the record be reopened for the limited purpose of accepting into evidence the public documents attached to and described in this petition. In support of this petition, Verizon avers as follows:

1. On November 9 and 10, 2011, evidentiary hearings were held in this matter. The record was closed at the end of the day on November 10, 2011. (Tr. at 278).
2. On November 18, 2011 the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) entered an order adopting “a prospective intercarrier compensation framework” for Internet Protocol (“IP”) originated and/or terminated traffic that “bring[s] all VoIP-PSTN traffic within the section 251(b)(5) framework,” sets “[d]efault intercarrier compensation rates for toll VoIP-PSTN traffic . . . equal to interstate access rates,” and

sets “[d]efault intercarrier compensation rates for other VoIP-PSTN traffic [at] the otherwise-applicable reciprocal compensation rates.”¹ Because it was issued after the close of the record, this order and its impact on the case were not addressed in the testimony or at hearing.

3. In its Initial Brief, Verizon contended that the FCC Order and accompanying regulations now determine the rates to be paid for the disputed traffic in this case and that Armstrong’s prospective claims are rendered moot by the FCC Order and should be dismissed. (Verizon Initial Br. at 9). Armstrong contended in its Initial Brief that “[i]t would preliminarily appear” that the FCC Order does not apply to Armstrong’s cable voice traffic. (Armstrong Initial Br. at 49).

4. Verizon files this petition to request entry into the record as late-filed exhibits of certain public documents that Verizon intends to cite in its Reply Brief, also filed this date, to rebut Armstrong’s argument that the FCC Order does not apply to its traffic. Each of these documents is a public document under 52 Pa. Code § 5.406, which “need not be produced or marked for identification, but may be offered in evidence as a public document by specifying the document or part thereof and where it may be found.”

5. Under the Commission’s rules, “[a]fter the record is closed, additional matter may not be . . . accepted into the record unless allowed for good cause shown by the presiding officer or the Commission upon motion.” 52 Pa. Code § 5.431(b).

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.571(a). “[a]t any time after the record is closed but before a final decision is issued, a party may file a petition to reopen the proceeding for the

purpose of taking additional evidence.” Such a petition may be based on “material changes of fact or of law alleged to have occurred since the conclusion of the hearing.” 52 Pa. Code § 5.571(b). For the reasons specified below, good cause exists to admit the attached documents into the record and they are needed to respond to material changes of fact or of law that have occurred since the close of the record due to the issuance of the FCC Order. Each document is independently admissible as a public document under 52 Pa. Code § 5.406.

A. FCC Form 499 Database Report for Armstrong

6. FCC regulations require all telecommunications carriers and interconnected VoIP providers periodically to file a reporting worksheet known as Form 499, selected portions of which are made available to the public. 47 C.F.R. §§ 54.706, 54.711, 54.713. The FCC maintains on its website a database that provides public access to certain entries from current Form 499s on file with the agency. A copy of the FCC’s database entry depicting the Form 499 filing for April 1, 2011 for Armstrong Digital Services, Inc., along with a blank copy of the signature page of the FCC’s Form 499, is attached hereto as Supplemental Exhibit A. The FCC’s database entry shows that the filer classified Armstrong Digital Services, Inc. (which Armstrong’s witnesses testified offers the identical service and is “as one” with its parent Armstrong Utilities Inc., Tr. at 47) as an “Interconnected VoIP” provider in its Form 499 reporting to the FCC. In filing that form Armstrong was required to certify that “all statements of fact contained in this Worksheet are true and that said Worksheet is an accurate statement of the affairs of the above-named company.” This database entry is publicly available at

<http://apps.fcc.gov/cgb/form499/499detail.cfm?FilerNum=825987> and the blank form is publicly available at <http://transition.fcc.gov/Forms/Form499-A/499a-2011.pdf>.

7. This FCC-published database report is a public document under 52 Pa. Code § 5.406(a)(2) because it is “[a]n official report, decision, opinion, published scientific or economic statistical data or similar public document which is issued by a governmental department, agency, committee, commission or similar entity which is shown by the offeror to be reasonably available to the public.”

8. Good cause exists to admit Supplemental Exhibit A into the record to respond to Armstrong’s arguments regarding the applicability of the FCC Order (a material change in law). Armstrong argues that its traffic is not VoIP-PSTN traffic under the FCC order because it is not a VoIP provider. (Armstrong Initial Br. at 49). The document shows that Armstrong classified itself less than a year ago as an “Interconnected VoIP” provider (a status that requires “Internet protocol-compatible customer premises equipment,” 47 C.F.R. § 9.3, which Armstrong now denies is required for its service).

B. Pennsylvania Cable VoIP Tariff Filings

9. Following the entry of the FCC Order numerous companies filed revisions to their intrastate switched access tariffs to insert terms to distinguish the traffic that is VoIP-PSTN traffic and no longer subject to intrastate access rates.²

10. Attached as Supplemental Exhibit B hereto are the relevant portions of the Pennsylvania tariff revisions filed on December 28, 2011 by Comcast Phone of Pennsylvania, LLC and Comcast Business Communications, LLC. Comcast “affirms

that all of its Pennsylvania traffic either originates from or terminates to a VoIP end user and is therefore, VoIP-PSTN.”³

11. Attached as Supplemental Exhibit C hereto are the Pennsylvania tariff revisions filed on December 30, 2011 by Time Warner Cable Information Services (Pennsylvania), LLC d/b/a Time Warner Cable, which states in its cover letter that “[t]he Company’s access traffic is exclusively VoIP-PSTN and this filing is being made to revise access rates to mirror interstate access rates in compliance with the [FCC Order].”⁴

12. Attached as Supplemental Exhibit D hereto are the relevant portions of the Pennsylvania tariff revisions filed on December 23, 2011 by Sprint Communications Company, L.P., a well-known intermediary CLEC for cable-VoIP providers, which states that “[a]ll traffic between Sprint Communications Company, L.P., and the end user originates and terminates in VoIP format.”⁵

13. These Pennsylvania tariff filings are public documents under 52 Pa. Code § 5.406(a)(1) because they are “[a] report or other document on file with the Commission.”

14. Good cause exists to admit Supplemental Exhibits B, C and D into the record to respond to Armstrong’s arguments that the Commission should find that Armstrong has no VoIP-PSTN traffic compensable under the FCC Order establishing a VoIP-PSTN intercarrier compensation regime (a material change in law). (Armstrong Initial Br. at 49). The documents show that Armstrong’s theory that its cable VoIP traffic

is outside the FCC's VoIP-PSTN compensation regime brands Armstrong as an outlier in the cable telephony industry and that accepting it would lead to a lack of uniformity that would undermine the FCC's rule.⁶

C. Other Cable VoIP Tariff Filings

15. Comcast, Sprint, Cox, and other cable providers and/or their LEC partners have made and continue to make similar tariff filings around the country to treat their traffic as 100% VoIP-PSTN traffic under the FCC rule. Verizon intends to note in its reply brief that such filings have been made in many other states, again to show that Armstrong's position is unique in the industry and acceptance of it will lead to a lack of uniformity that would undermine the FCC's pro-consumer goals. To provide record support for the assertion that such filings have been made in other states Verizon submits Supplemental Exhibit E, which are relevant portions of various other state commission tariff filings by Comcast, Sprint, Cox, Charter-Fiberlink and Time Warner. These documents are public documents under 52 Pa. Code § 5.406(a)(2) because they are pending or effective tariffs before other state commissions and good cause exists to admit Supplemental Exhibit E for the same reasons as for Supplemental Exhibits B, C and D.

This tariff filing reflects Sprint Communications Company, L.P.'s implementation of the intercarrier compensation regime for certain Toll VoIP-PSTN traffic that was recently mandated (absent agreement by the affected companies) by the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") in its November 18, 2011 Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in WC Dockets No. 10-90 etc. In accordance with that Order, these tariff revisions will take effect January 14, 2012.



The revision is consistent with the FCC's Order, for separating Relevant Toll VoIP-PSTN traffic from access traffic which is billed at the standard intrastate access rates. The Toll VoIP-PSTN traffic will be billed at the rates set forth in Sprint Communications Company L.P. Tariff F.C.C. No. 13 interstate access tariff.

The new regime implemented by this tariff will result in rate reductions for many if not all access customers, and will not result in rate increases.




