LETTER OF NOTIFICATION

TO THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (“PPL Electric” or the “Company”), hereby files, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 57.72(d), this Letter of Notification to request that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) approve the reinsulating of the South Akron - Prince #1 & #2 138 kV Transmission Line (“South Akron - Prince Line”) along its entire approximately 12 mile length to address reliability concerns in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. In addition, PPL Electric seeks approval for the replacement of the existing steel overhead shield wire with optical shield wire and the replacement of 15 structures with new steel poles. Some additional steel lattice towers will be reinforced by the replacement or addition of members. Subject to the Commission’s approval, construction is scheduled to begin in September, 2012 in order to meet a scheduled in-service date of April, 2013. PPL Electric has reviewed the project with representatives of the townships of West Earl, Warwick, Manheim, Upper Leacock and East

Lampeter, the City Of Lancaster and Lancaster County regarding the Project. There were no objections to it. In support the Letter of Notification, PPL Electric states as follows:

I. INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW

1. This Letter of Notification is filed by PPL Electric, a public utility that provides electric distribution, transmission, and provider of last resort services in Pennsylvania subject to the regulatory jurisdiction of the Commission.

3. PPL Electric's attorneys are:

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PPL Electric's attorneys are authorized to receive all notices and communications regarding this Letter of Notification.

4. PPL Electric furnishes electric service to approximately 1.4 million customers throughout its certificated service territory, which includes all or portions of twenty-nine counties and encompasses approximately 10,000 square miles in eastern and central Pennsylvania. PPL Electric is a "public utility" and an "electric distribution company" as defined in Sections 102 and 2803 of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. §§ 102, 2803.

5. PPL Electric owns approximately 5,000 miles of transmission lines operating at 69 kV¹ or higher, approximately 375 substations with a capacity of 10 MVA² or more, and approximately 43,000 miles of distribution lines operating at less than 69 kV.

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7. This Letter of Notification and accompanying Attachments, which are incorporated herein by reference, contain all the information required by 52 Pa. Code § 57.72(d)(4).

II. THE EXISTING SYSTEM

8. The South Akron – Prince Line was constructed in the 1950's. Under normal operating conditions, The Line supplies four substations owned by PPL Electric and three customer-owned substations. The Line normally supplies electricity for approximately 19,675 customers. Load projections indicate that, during the summer of 2012, the Line will serve a total load under peak demand conditions of approximately 130 Megawatts.

9. Presently, the South Akron – Prince Line is supported by a total of 114 structures. The structures are a mix of wood poles, steel lattice towers and steel monopoles. There are 10 wood poles, which range in height from 50 to 70 feet; 80 steel lattice towers which range in height from 80 to 115 feet and 24 steel monopoles which range in height from 65 to 125 feet.

III. THE PROJECT

10. As explained in greater detail in Attachment I to this Letter of Notification, this Project is required to increase the operating reliability in order to meet standards set forth in PPL Electric's Reliability Principles and Practices ("RP&P") guidelines. It will also improve the safety of the electric system and add a reliable communication path between the South Akron and Prince Substations which will permit the remote operation of certain equipment.

11. PPL Electric plans its system in accordance with the guidelines found in the RP&P guidelines so that PPL Electric can sustain probable contingencies and disturbances with only minimal customer service interruptions and so that it can adequately serve each customer's needs with regard to capacity, voltage and reliability for all load levels throughout

the daily load cycle. System Planning is the process which assures that PPL Electric's regional system can supply electricity to all customer load in a manner that is reliable and economic. In addition, the system is planned so that system reliability can be maintained to prevent large scale, long term, or frequent service interruptions in order to avoid adverse effects and hazards to the public.

12. Under PPL Electric's RP&P guidelines, a load-serving line should not experience more than approximately 2 outages per year per 20-mile circuit, including both momentary and extended outages. This is equivalent to 1.2 interruptions per year for this 12-mile Line.

13. In recent years, the South Akron - Prince Line has exceeded the RP&P guidelines because it has experienced an average of 2.1 and 2 outages per year.

14. In investigating these outages, PPL Electric determined that most of the insulator assemblies are the original ones installed in the 1950's. Most of the suspension towers are insulated with six bell porcelain insulator assemblies which do not meet PPL Electric's current 138 kV design standards. In addition, the insulators have deteriorated due to their age and exposure to the elements. They no longer function properly.

15. Before beginning the process of replacing the insulators on the Line, PPL Electric also investigated the Line's structures to determine whether they meet PPL Electric's structural loading design standards for a 138 kV line. PPL Electric determined that 15 structures need to be replaced and that additional structures need to be reinforced.

16. In the process of investigating the condition of the Line, PPL Electric determined also that the steel shield wire, which was the original shield wire, was in a deteriorated condition. The deteriorated steel shield wire could cause outages if it broke and fell down into the conductors.

17. PPL Electric planned the Project proposed in this Letter of Notification in order to address the problems explained above. The Project involves three principal activities.

a. First, all insulators will be replaced. Many of the presently-installed insulators date back to the original installation of the Line in the 1950's. The condition and age of the insulators, coupled with the operating voltage of the Line, have been linked to outages. PPL Electric will use a mix of porcelain and polymer insulators depending on the type of structure and required clearances. On most structures, an insulator bell will be added to the middle and bottom insulator assemblies.

b. Second, select structures will be replaced or reinforced. Approximately 15 structures will be replaced. Certain others steel lattice towers will be reinforced by adding or replacing members. The structures will be replaced or reinforced to bring them up to current structural loading criteria. Eight wood poles will be replaced by eight steel monopoles. These structures will be directly embedded at approximately the same location as the existing structures and will be approximately the same height, about 60 to 70 feet, as the existing structures. Five steel lattice towers will be replaced by one or two pole steel structures which will be installed on concrete foundations. The new steel structures will be approximately the same height as the existing structures, approximately 80 to 90 feet, and they will be installed in approximately the same locations. In addition, two light duty steel monopoles will be replaced by two custom steel monopoles. The new poles will be approximately the same height as the existing poles, 75 and

120 feet respectively. They also will be installed in approximately the same location as the existing poles.

c. Third, PPL Electric will replace the existing steel overhead shield wire with optical shield wire. The new optical shield wire will replace old and deteriorated steel shield wire and will provide a communications path for operating data and permit remote operation of certain equipment between the South Akron and Prince substations.

18. The South Akron – Prince Line is, and will continue to be, operated as a double-circuit 138 kV Line.

19. Spans along the existing Line vary but will remain approximately the same when the Project has been completed.

20. The conductors for the Line will remain in place. They consist of 556.5 kcmil,³ 24/7 ACRS⁴ stranding, 795 kcmil, 30/19 ACRS stranding and 795 kcmil 37 ACSR stranding, depending on the type of construction.

21. The Engineering Description of the proposed construction of the South Akron - Prince Line is provided in Attachment 2 accompanying this Letter of Notification.

22. The construction for the Project will take place in part on existing rights-of-way and in part on land owned by PPL Electric in fee.

23. Figure 1 on page 4 of Attachment 1, the Necessity Statement, shows the existing transmission system configuration. The transmission system configuration will not change as a result of the Project.

24. The total estimated cost of the proposed Project is \$3.9 million. Subject to the Commission's approval, construction is scheduled to begin in September, 2012, to support the Project's in-service date of April, 2013.

IV. HEALTH AND SAFETY

25. The proposed construction of the South Akron - Prince Line will not create any unreasonable risk to public health or safety. The proposed line sections will be designed, constructed, operated, and maintained in a manner that meets or surpasses all applicable National Electric Safety Code ("NESC") minimum standards and all applicable legal requirements. Descriptions of NESC standards, PPL Electric's design criteria, and PPL Electric's safety practices are provided in Attachment 4.

26. Attachment 5 accompanying this Letter of Notification explains PPL Electric's program for Magnetic Field Management. PPL Electric has determined, as a matter of policy, to design its new and rebuilt transmission lines to reduce magnetic fields when that can be done at low or no cost, consistent with functional requirements. PPL Electric's Magnetic Field Management Program has been developed to implement that policy decision. To reduce magnetic field exposures, the program generally prescribes the use of a line design that provides for five feet higher ground clearance than NESC standards and reverse phasing of new double-circuit lines where it is feasible to do so at low or no cost.

27. Increasing the ground clearance by 5 feet for this Project PPL Electric would not be economically feasible because only about 15 of 114 structures are being replaced. Existing ground clearances will remain unchanged after the Project.

28. The South Akron – Prince Line presently has two circuits and employs reverse phasing. The South Akron – Prince Line will continue to employ reverse phasing upon completion of the Project.

V. RIGHT-OF-WAY STATUS

29. The proposed construction of the South Akron - Prince #1 & #2 Line will be located in part within existing rights-of-way and in part on land owned in fee by PPL Electric. PPL Electric does not need any additional right-of-way or other property interests to complete the Project.

VI. ENVIRONMENTAL EVALUATION

30. Because the proposed South Akron - Prince Project includes reinsulating the Line, replacing a limited number of structures with structures of approximately the same heights in approximately the same location, reinforcing certain other steel lattice towers structures by adding or replacing members and replacing the overhead shield wire, it is anticipated that the proposed Project will have only minimal incremental impacts on the area.

31. Land use in the area is mixed. Uses include agricultural, residential, recreational, commercial, and industrial. Impacts on land use are anticipated to be minimal due to the fact that the Project involves primarily replacing existing facilities with similar facilities in the same locations and reinforcing existing facilities.

32. No nearby communication towers, pipelines or other utilities will be affected by the proposed construction. The closest point of the Smoketown Airport is approximately 1.8 miles from the construction. PPL Electric will file the appropriate documentation, if necessary, with both the Federal Aviation Administration and the PennDOT Bureau of Aviation to ensure that the proposed Project will not be a hazard to the airport's flight operations. PPL Electric

does not anticipate any problem due to the pre-existing electrical facilities in the vicinity and the fact that the structure heights will remain the same.

33. The proposed South Akron – Prince Project was reviewed by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission (PHMC). The PHMC has determined that there may be historic buildings, structures, and/or archaeological resources in the project area. Correspondence from the PHMC, dated January 23, 2012, however, indicates that the proposed activities associated with this Project should have no effect on these resources (File No. ER 2012-0517-071-A). No further investigations are required. If, however, PPL Electric becomes aware of any previously unidentified resources that would be affected by the Project, it will notify the Bureau for Historic Preservation promptly.

34. The Project will not affect any unique geological, scenic, or natural areas.

a. The Fruitville Quarry Fossil Site is located approximately 3.5 miles from the project area. This feature will not be affected due to its distance from the Project, the extensive development between the feature and the Project, and the fact that PPL Electric is proposing only limited modifications to existing facilities.

b. Conestoga Pines Park, a City of Lancaster Park, is located near the proposed project. No impacts are anticipated due to the fact that PPL Electric is proposing limited modifications to existing facilities which are located in this area.

PPL Electric did not identify any other National Natural Landmarks, parks, recreational facilities, or natural areas located near the project area.

35. Limited vegetation management may be required for this Project. Only minimal vegetation removal may be needed because the Project is being completed entirely within existing PPL Electric right-of-way and on land owned by PPL Electric in fee. All of the land

for the Project previously had been cleared of trees for the existing Line. In areas where vegetation management is required to complete the Project, if any, PPL Electric will apply its “Specifications for Initial Clearing and Control of Vegetation On or Adjacent to Electric Line Right-of-Way Through Use of Herbicides, Mechanical and Hand Clearing Techniques” to mitigate any impacts.

36. PPL Electric has retained DiGioia Gray & Associates to identify and delineate all wetlands and watercourses within the existing right-of-way. These features have been identified, delineated and added to the construction plans. None of the structures to be replaced are in wetlands or watercourses. PPL Electric will obtain all permits necessary from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection and the United States Army Corps of Engineers and will comply with all conditions placed on the permits. In addition, PPL Electric will acquire any required soil erosion and sedimentation control permits and comply with any conditions placed on those permits.

37. PPL Electric has coordinated with state and federal agencies to obtain information regarding threatened and endangered species in close proximity to the Project. Rick Mellon of Mellon Biological Services has been retained by PPL Electric to coordinate with these agencies. To date, a review of the Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (“PNDI”) records under the jurisdiction of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR), the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PAFBC), and the Pennsylvania Game Commission (PGC) have been completed. These agencies indicate that there are no impacts to species of special concern under their jurisdiction (PNDI # 021641). These findings are documented in correspondence from the DCNR dated January 3, 2012, the PAFBC dated January 31, 2012, and the PGC dated February 10, 2012.

38. PPL Electric is awaiting a response from the United States Fish and Wildlife Service in reference to PNDI records under its jurisdiction. Any conflicts with species of concern will be resolved prior to starting construction in areas of potential impacts.

VII. NOTICE

39. The proposed construction of the South Akron - Prince #1 & #2 Line was reviewed with representatives of townships of West Earl, Warwick, Manheim, Upper Leacock and East Lampeter, the City Of Lancaster and Lancaster County. The townships, the City and the County had no objection to the Project.

40. Attachment 6 accompanying this Letter of Notification identifies the owners of property within the existing right-of-way. A copy of this Letter of Notification is being served on the property owners listed in Attachment 6 in accordance with 52 Pa. Code § 57.72(d)(3).

41. Attachment 7 accompanying this Letter of Notification contains a list of the involved governmental agencies, municipalities, and other public entities. Copies of this Letter of Notification are being served on the agencies listed in Attachment 7 in accordance with 52 Pa. Code § 57.72(d)(3).

42. As soon as practicable after the filing of this Letter of Notification and the assignment by the Commission of a docket number, PPL Electric will publish notice of the filing in newspapers of general circulation in the area of the proposed Project for the South Akron - Prince Line. Such notice will contain: (a) the date this Letter of Notification was filed with the Commission; (b) a brief description of the proposed Project and its location; and (c) an instruction that interested parties should contact Secretary Rosemary Chiavetta, at the Commission's Harrisburg address.

VIII. LETTER OF NOTIFICATION

43. PPL Electric is proceeding by means of a Letter of Notification, instead of a full Application, pursuant to the Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 57.72(d). The proposed South Akron - Prince Line Project qualifies for use of a Letter of Notification because it will be entirely in rights of way and land owned in fee by PPL Electric and because the Project will not substantially alter the right-of-way.






