

PARATRANSIT TARIFF NAMING RATES, RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE TRANSPORTATION OF PERSONS IN PARATRANSIT SERVICE BETWEEN POINTS IN PENNSYLVANIA

To transport, in special operations, as hereinafter described, disabled and physically handicapped persons, in modified motor vehicles, with side-opening doors and ramps, from their homes or their places of business in the city and county of Philadelphia, to points in said city and county, and return.

To transport, as a common carrier, persons in paratransit service (1) between points in the counties of Philadelphia, Bucks, and Chester; provided that no right, power, or privilege is granted to render such transportation originating in said county of Chester; and (2) from points in Philadelphia, Bucks, Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery counties to penal institutions located in said counties, and vice versa.

To transport as a common carrier, persons in paratransit service: from the city and county of Philadelphia, to the following State Correctional Institutions and return: Graterford State Correctional Institution, Skippack Township, Montgomery County; Camp Hill State Correctional Institution, Lower Allen Township, Cumberland County; Dallas State Correctional Institution, Jackson Township, Luzerne County; Muncy State Correctional Institution, Clinton Township, Lycoming County; Rockview State Correction Institution, of Benner, College, Harris, Spring and Potter, Centre County; Huntingdon State Correctional Institution, Smithfield Township, Huntingdon County; Pittsburgh State Correctional Institution, City of Pittsburg, Allegheny County. (2) from the city and county of Philadelphia, to the following State Correctional Institutions and return: Frackville State Correctional Institution, Ryan Township, Schuylkill County; Waynesburg State Correctional Institution, Morgan Township, Greene County; Cresson State Correctional Institution, Cresson Township, Cambria County; Retreat State Correctional Institution, Newport Township, Luzerne County.

To transport, as a common carrier, persons in paratransit service, from points in the city and county of Philadelphia to the following State Correctional Institutions and return: Mahoney State Correctional Institution; Schuylkill County; Coal Township State Correctional Institution, Northumberland County; Houtzdale State Correctional Institution, Clearfield County; and Smithfield State Correctional Institution, Huntingdon County.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Item 1: ADVANCE RESERVATIONS

Advance reservations must be made 24 hours prior to the service being rendered.

Item 2: CONTRACT SERVICES

Contract service provided will be for a term of not less than 30 days for prequalified persons under a federal, state, county or municipal governmental agency contract. Rates for such services will be specified in the respective contracts, copies of which, including any amendments thereto, are to be filed with the Commission as executed to become effective on one day's notice.

Item 3: WAITING TIME

Waiting time shall be assessed only when the passenger requests the carrier to wait for them after arrival at the drop off point.

Item 4: PAYMENT OF OUT OF POCKET EXPENSES

Additional expenses necessitated by or incurred at the request of the party making the reservation, including but not limited to, extra attendants, highway tolls, parking, bariatric equipment, oxygen, stretcher, hydraulic life equipment and devices needed to assure safe transport of client, and all other necessary medical equipment shall be added to the charge for the trip.

Item 5: MILEAGE

The odometer of the vehicle will be used to determine mileage and will be calculated from garage to garage.

Item 6: PROMOTIONAL FARES

Upon presentation of advertising coupons or special promotional offer, carrier will offer rates at a specified discount from the published Tariff rates on dates authorized by the coupon or special promotional offer. Advertised coupons or promotional offers will be filed with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission prior to publication or broadcast. Coupons will be published and promotional offers will be broadcast in one or all of the following: local newspaper, flyers and other printed material, all forms of radio and television advertising media including internet and display advertising.

Item 7: LIABILITY

Carrier will not be liable for delays caused by an act of God, public enemies, authority of law, quarantine, perils of navigation, riots, strikes, the hazards or dangers incident to a state of war, accidents, breakdowns, bad conditions of the road and other conditions beyond its control, and does not guarantee to arrive or depart from any point at any specific time.

Item 6: OBJECTIONABLE PERSONS

Carrier reserves the right to refuse to transport any individual(s) under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or who is incapable of taking care of himself or herself or who shows conduct which is such, and in addition, carrier holds responsible any individual(s) who cause damage to the vehicle.
