Your Honor:

The above issue is about getting an Invoice Number on the front of the billing statement, which Met-Ed has failed to do. In addition, I need help to get my employer to pay what is owed for my performance on a contract.

Since the Uniform Commercial Code is recognized as international contract law and not in conflict with the Constitution of the United States, I request that you order me back to work at the Naval Inventory Control Point (NAVICP) in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania—so that I can pay my utility bill. Attached is a copy of the fourth and final notice of Invoice No. 125643 dated 12/08/2011 to NAVICP-Mechanicsburg and they have failed to respond.

Unfortunately, this is a long story for which the MSPB heard my case on 3/08/2007 and dismissed it, claiming they had no jurisdiction—after my attorney caught the Navy's lead witness (Craig Hinkle) in a lie. The case can be found on the internet at MSPB's website. The point of the matter is that I refused to accept a \$500 bonus and had it returned to the Navy, telling them to stick it were the sun didn't shine—since they were conducting a 2003 Reduction-In-Force (RIF) that separated about twenty (20) employees. RIFs and bonuses did not make sense, since \$1,355,500.00 was paid out to 2,711 employees between Philly and Mechanicsburg..

To keep this story short, I filed criminal charges against William Lavage of Human Resources charging him with the theft of \$1.8 billion dollars from 10/01/1998 to 9/30/2003. The Navy refused to accept my complaint. Therefore, I went to the U.S. District Court in Harrisburg and filed my complaint under PENALTY OF PERJURY in Docket No. 1:CV-11-1352. The Navy failed to respond to the charges, except the judge dismissed my case at the end and said it was frivolous. The judge was notified that his ruling was erroneous and that if he wanted to rule for the Navy, I had to go to jail for lying. To date, the judge has not responded and it appears the case is still open awaiting his decision and trying to figure out what to do with me.

As it stands, my claim is that I am a full-time federal employee who was issued a debarment order in late February 2004 to keep off the installation for refusing to accept a \$500 bonus. The Navy is claiming that I was a RIF casualty effective 10/01/2003, except there is no signed presentment and no RIF notice in the contents of my Official Personnel File (OPF) to prove separation.

If the separation by the Navy wasn't bad enough, their RIF Authorization Letter proves some laws were broken. First, by a third party (B. Houdershall) who signed for Stephen P. Slocomb. Second, by William Lavage who accepted the third party signature and issued RIF Notices of Separation. Third, by an unsigned Meritorious Group Award Certificate of Commendation that resulted in a \$1.8 billion dollar savings over a 5-year Defense Plan, which I claim was theft and the Navy has yet to disprove it.

As a judge, you could either support "states rights" or dismiss this case and rule for Met-Ed—except that really is not going to solve the problem. I'm sure you know our laws are in conflict with each other and the reason is because we brought the "law of the sea" onto dry land and called it admiralty law or statutory law. Jesus Christ has been removed from our legal system and judges no longer carry the Holy Bible into the courtroom. When a judge enters his court, people are expected to stand for the man—instead of standing for the man who carries his Bible. At 60-years of age, I am unemployable and recently applied for a purchasing specialist position at the Annville-Cleona School District. One of the requirements was to submit three (3) letters of reference recommending me for the job. Ms. Martha Kew thanked me for applying and offered the job to someone else without giving me an interview. This is the kind of nonsense that I've had to tolerate at the expense of time, postage, stationary, and a waste of gasoline—not to mention the hundreds of other jobs that I applied for. How long will it take our courts to figure out that you can't get blood from a turnip?

For unpaid attorney fees during a 3/08/2007 hearing with the Merit Systems Protection Board that was undecided and the illegal reduction-in-force (RIF) for which USDC Case No. 1:CV-11-1352 is still open for a ruling in accordance with 28 USC 1746, as NAVICP failed to respond.

For the debarment order as a contract in lieu of the desk audit prior to 10/1/2003 and email application for the DAPS-08-3632 position through William Lavage's office, after he told U. S. Senator, Arlen Specter that Jacob Larry Shope could apply for any job.

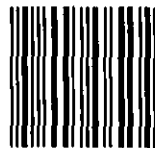
