


RE: Michael Burgis v. PGW, Docket NO.F-2012-2298385

1. 2. I requested that a PGW tech come to the apartment to check to make sure nothing was amiss with the meter or meter reading capability. No person has been sent as of this writing.

Perhaps you can get PGW to address these questions and if not give me the relief I seek by invalidating their charge less the \$1,213 and any subsequent new charges that are fairly outstanding.


