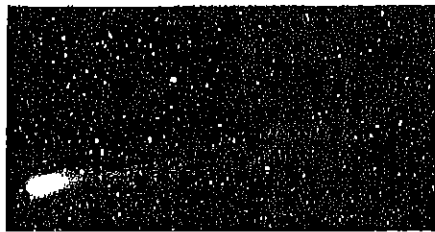

LOOKING UP

Maybe you will find the next comet



Comet O/1996 B2, better known as Comet Hyakutake, was a spectacular sight in the evening sky. In 1996, its tail stretched across several constellations.

Who will be the next to discover a comet? It could be you. If you are looking!

Beware: most comets don't show up as a brilliant glow with a long tail. Most in fact, better resemble a barely seen flick of a dust bunny.

Hardy enthusiasts of the night sky have discovered a vast amount of known comets, asteroids, supernovae and even meteor showers not known before. Comet discoverers have generally come about after hundreds of hours of methodically exploring the heavens at the eyepiece of a telescope.

Serious hobbyists proceed with determination and patience that seems to be rarely found anymore. Have carefully examined cross-sections of the sky with each sweep followed by another with the telescope swung slightly higher or lower.

Star atlases are readily available which feature detailed, close-up charts of sections of the sky, revealing thousands of faint stars and here and there, positions of dim galaxies or wisps of cosmic cloud known as nebulae. Galaxies do not appear to the eye as bright glowing objects like you see pictured in magazines; rather, except for a few exceptions, they will look like fuzzy pinkish pieces of dust just barely you may have even under your bed.

Comets, when far away from the Sun, appear very

much like a faint galaxy—a dim fuzzy spot without a tail. If you don't know where the brighter galaxies are, you will wonder if you are viewing a comet. Most likely, it is a galaxy, but how can you be sure? You will need to check your star atlas to see if a galaxy is plotted in that part, next to those dim little stars you see in your eyepiece.

Another real good way is to very carefully note its position, perhaps by sketching a little map. Then come back later that night and look again to see if it has moved.

Many observers search with long exposure photographs.

Discoverers of comets get the distinction of having their name officially attached, as well as an alphanumeric number. In recent years, it has been harder for amateurs to catch their comets, because of satellite, professional sky patrols which continually photograph the sky, as well as an unmanned solar observatory in space that continually studies the region next to the Sun, picking up a great many of small comets that has become bright as they pass near the Sun but escaped detection otherwise. Nonetheless, dedicated enthusiasts once in a while still make discoveries.

Most comets never become very bright and go unnoticed by most people, but a few become show stoppers, like comet Hyakutake in 1996 or Comet Hale-Bopp in 1998, both which thrilled

the world and didn't require a telescope. Comet Holmes also was amazing when it suddenly brightened last October. Not that anyone is in it for the money, but there is even a monetary prize offered for comet discoveries, the Edgar Wilson Award. Each year it divides about \$20,000 among amateurs who have found new comets.

Amateur astronomers can report discoveries online at www.cfa.harvard.edu/iau/submit.html and scroll down to "How do I report a discovery?"

Though I've never "discovered" something in the sky, my enthusiasm is undimmed, for finding something "new" is not what it should be all about. A couple times or more I was startled. One night last year I came across in the telescope a definite comet, unknown to me. It turned out to be Comet Orrenda, a dim patch in binoculars still visible near the Big Dipper.

New Moon is on April 21.

Enjoy bright Venus high in the west the next clear evening, and bright Jupiter far below. Between them, see the patch of stars known as the Pleiades Star Cluster. Right and red-orange. Mars curiously dances high up in the east in the evening.



However, the two circuits will initially be operated at 69 kilovolts until load growth in the area makes an increase in operating voltage appropriate.

On March 15, 2012, PPL Electric filed a “Letter of Notification” with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC), which must approve the project before work can begin.
