Dear Mr. Bennett,

I am aware that there is no record of my gas well in Ridgway, Pa. I have been to the office in North Warren Pa and talked with your geologist, Jason Shoemaker and he showed me maps of well locations in Pa; and there are no records of my gas well on your map.

I had your ofc. send a representative to inspect the sight, and it was determined that the hole in the ground was a capped well.

We did a GPS location for determination, so that I could register the well in my name. This is not a new well; this was drilled to the best of my know,edge in the 1900's for gas exploration in Pa.

I was again up to the Warren Ofc. in May/April of 2012 and the ofc. personnel was confused as to what to do!

I saw Scott Motter your EPA rep. and he got back to me, after I had requested that I wanted the well registered. I have the original papers from your Warren Ofc. with the GPS and code Krupl.

And give back a small portion of what they have gained financially on the backs of the working man?


Mr. Bennett, I am a simple man attempting to file a complaint with the powers that be.

Dear Mr. Krupski:

Thank you for your letter, postmarked May 17, 2012, to Administrator Lisa P. Jackson of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regarding a possible capped gas well located on your property. In your letter, you expressed concern that National Fuel Gas of Pennsylvania previously operated a gas well on your property without your knowledge. You have asked EPA to look into this matter. Your letter was referred to EPA's Region III office for response because Pennsylvania is within our jurisdiction.

EPA does not have regulatory authority over drilling or plugging of gas production wells. Oil and gas production wells are regulated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and records of wells are maintained by the Department of Environmental Protection. EPA has access to the State gas well record database and a search of this database found no evidence of a well located near the latitude and longitude you provided. Listed below are two publicly available websites on gas wells in Pennsylvania that may be helpful:
