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Enclosed herewith are two (2) copies of 13th Revised Page 48 to Tariff Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 50, issued by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Confenence, Inc., Agent for its members under power of attorney, and sent to you for filing in compliance with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Law.

13th Revised Pages 488to Tariff Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 50 provides for an increase in hourly rates from \$101.00 for a van, addiversand two (2) helpers to \$105.00 for the same crew per hour. The only Tristate domiciled member is McNaughton Bros., Inc. in Indiana County.

Transportqation Rate Table H applies to shipments of household goods in use originating in Indiana County and transported distances of forty (40) miles and less.

Also enclosed in view of the fact that McNaughton Bros., Inc.'s 2011 Pa. Gross Revenues exceed \$500,000 we have provided additional supporting financial information.

Attached is a completed Wage Cost Study Form prepared by McNaughton Bros., Inc. comparing the wages and fringe benefits between 2007 (last increase in hourly rates) and 2012. The cost per man hour has risen from \$26.87 to \$28.64, or an increase of 6.5%, andsmarkedcExhibit 1: Alsohattached is Exhibit 2 that summarizes McNaughton's revenues and expenses from calendar year 2011 providing an operating ratio of 94.7%. Lastly, attached is a copy of McNaughton's 2011 Assessment Report-Motor Carriers reflecting \$737,486.

Rate Table H applying on shipments of household goods in use, originating in Indiana County and transported distances of forty (40) miles or less were last increased effective June 30, 2008 through the filing of 12th Revised Page 48 to Tariff Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 50.

The present van and three (3) man charge is \$101.00 per hour. Proposed charge for a van and three (3) is \$105.00 per hour, which produces a \$4.00 per hour increase in rates, or a 3.9% increase.

(d) Using the formula of 46% labor cost to revenue dollar which have been accepted by the Commission in previous filings, a needed increase in rates to just offset increases in labor costs alone would be as follows:

46% X 6.5% equals 3.0%

The applicant is seeking this increase primarily due to length of time since seeking an increase in its hourly rates which was 2008.

The amount of projected local moving revenue (under 40 miles) is \$4,566. Refer to Exhibit 2.

◆ TRANSPORTATION RATE TABLE H - CLASS 1 SHIPMENTS (ITEM 3)

Subject to Notes AA and BB and 1 to 6 below, the transportation charges on any shipment shall be a <u>COMBINATION</u> of the applicable <u>TRAVELING CHARGE</u> named in Column 1 plus <u>HOURLY CHARGE</u> at applicable rates named in Columns 2, 3 and 4.

Hourly rates apply only <u>from</u> time of arrival of vehicles and men at first point of origin (continued during all loading), transportation from first point of origin to final destination, and unloading) <u>until</u> completion of unloading and dismissal of vehicles and men by shipper at destination.

Traveling charges cover traveling to first point of origin and traveling from final destination, irrespective of actual time involved in such traveling.

NOTE 1 - Traveling Charges (Column 1) are in addition to Hourly Rates (Columns 2, 3 and 4).

NOTE 2 - Hourly Fates (Columns 2, 3 and 4), are based on the day or days, or periods of days, as indicated, during which services are performed.

NOTE 3 - Hourly Rates (Columns 2, 3 and 4) computed in half-hour periods; fractions of one-half hour considered one-half hour.

NOTE 4 - MINIMUM TRANSPORTATION CHARGE: Sundays and Holidays: 8 hours at rates named in Columns 1 and 2. Saturdays (any hour) or Weekdays 4:31 PM to 6:00 AM: 4 hours at rates named in Columns 1 and 4.

NOTE 5 - Rates in Column 4 apply only from 4:31 PM to 12:00 Midnight on any day when a higher rate is shown for the following day.

NOTE 6 - Carrier will supply and charge for supervisor or supervisors as requested by shipper. Hourly rate for each supervisor will be computed from time of arrival of vehicles and men at first point of origin until completion of unloading and dismissal of vehicles and men at final destination unless other time of arrival or dismissal of supervisor is provided by agreement between shipper and carrier.

NOTE AA - When distance from original point of origin to final destination is 10 miles or less, the flat charge shall be for one-half hour at the rates applicable.

When distance from original point of origin to final destination is over 10 miles but less than 20 miles, the flat charge shall be for one hour at the rates applicable.

When distance from original point of origin to final destination is 20 miles and less than 30 miles, the flat charge shall be for one and one-half hours at the rate applicable.

When distance from original point of origin to final destination is 30 miles and over (to 40 miles inclusive), the flat charge shall be for two hours at the rates applicable.

NOTE BB - A flat charge based on two hours at the applicable transportation rates shown in Columns 2, 3 or 4 will be assessed by carrier when travel from carrier's place of business to original point of origin is more than 25 miles. Charges applicable under Note AA will not apply when carrier assesses traveling charge under Note BB.


