

COMPLAINT

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth. The Commission has delegated its authority to initiate proceedings which are prosecutory in nature to the Bureau of Transportation and Safety and other bureaus with enforcement responsibilities. Pursuant to that delegated authority and Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, the Bureau of Transportation and Safety Prosecutory Staff hereby represents as follows:

- 1. That William C. Stumpf, t/a Stumpf Moving & Storage Co., respondent, maintains his principal place of business at 199 Purity Road, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15235.
- 2. That respondent was issued a certificate of public convenience by this Commission on February 25, 1977, at Application Docket No. A-00099993.
- That respondent, on July 27, and September 1, 2005, performed household goods moves 3. for Bonnie Poole from 920 Saint James Street, Pittsburgh, PA to respondent's storage facility at 199 Purity Road, Pittsburgh, PA, and from respondent's storage facility to 321 Beaver Street, Sewickley, PA, respectively. During the aforementioned moves, damages occurred to Ms. Poole's furniture. Ms. Poole purchased additional insurance in the amount of \$240.00, which is documented on the Bill of Lading. The respondent never provided Ms. Poole with a copy of the insurance information. Ms. Poole filed a claim for damages and provided a detailed estimate of charges for the damages as respondent requested. Ms. Poole contracted with Grimes Interiors who provided her with a detailed estimate of \$4,113.08 dated October 19, 2005. Respondent insisted that their repairman, Bill Ireland, provide an estimate for the damages and make the repairs to the furniture. Due to conflicting schedules, the estimate did not take place until March 13, 2006. Respondent told Ms. Poole that they would be responsible for the difference in cost between their repairman and Mr. Ireland's estimate. Ms. Poole contacted the respondent by letters dated March 7, 22, and April 10, 2006, prior to seeking legal action. Respondent sent letters to Ms. Poole dated March 13, April 28, and June 10, 2006. A settlement of \$1,000.00 was made after Ms. Poole retained legal counsel. Respondent failed to act promptly upon written or oral communications with respect to Ms. Poole's insurance claim and did not attempt to effectuate a prompt, fair and equitable settlement of her claim.
- 4. That respondent, by failing to acknowledge and act promptly upon written or oral communications with respect to insurance claims, and by not attempting in good faith to effectuate prompt, fair and equitable settlement of claims in which the carrier's liability has become reasonably clear, violated 52 Pa. Code \$32.16(2) and (6). Penalty is \$250.00.



WHEREFORE, the Bureau of Transportation and Safety Prosecutory Staff hereby requests that the Commission fine William C. Stumpf, t/a Stumpf Moving & Storage Co., the sum of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for the illegal activity described in this complaint, and order such other remedy as the Commission may deem appropriate.



- D. If you file an answer which admits or fails to deny the allegations of the complaint, the Bureau of Transportation and Safety will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a penalty.
- E. If you file an answer which contests the complaint, the matter will be assigned to an administrative law judge for hearing and decision. The judge is not bound by the optional fine set forth above.

Dear Mr. McNulty:

I am writing in regard to Docket Number A-0009993C0601. I have a dispute with the complaint found in number 3 and contest it as such. We did not sell Mr. & Mrs. Poole insurance, so they therefore did not have an insurance claim. They did purchase \$50,000 in valuation that had a \$500 deductible. Stumpf Moving & Storage did in fact attempt to have the Poole's furniture repaired as soon as we were notified of claim. The Poole's were not cooperative or available to have their furniture repaired. We made many attempts to have their furniture repaired. Our repairman, Mr. Ireland, can also attest to the fact that he himself made several attempts to repair the furniture. Mr. & Mrs. Poole would not let us repair their furniture. They got one estimate for repair that was way out of line and wanted us to pay them a cash settlement based on their estimate. We did in fact send them \$1,000 as a settlement in the end when it was apparent they were not looking for their furniture to be repaired. The \$1,000 was well above what it would have cost to repair their furniture and replace missing items.

Stumpf Moving & Storage did nothing illegal as the complaint suggests. We are a small family owned and operated business that strives to maintain our excellent reputation by keeping our customers satisfied. We have any claims to damaged furniture repaired by the finest repairman in the Pittsburgh area. We would not be in business for four generations if we did not strive for excellence in keeping our customer's satisfied. Again, we dispute the complaint that we did not attempt in good faith to effectuate prompt, fair and equitable settlement of claim. Also, I would like to reiterate that no insurance claim was filed because we do not sell insurance.

I am asking that the penalty imposed in the amount of \$250 be forgiven
