

**APPEAL AND FORMAL COMPLAINT OF PPL ELECTRIC UTILITIES CORPORATION  
FROM THE DECISION ON INFORMAL COMPLAINT  
BY THE BUREAU OF CONSUMER SERVICES**

PPL Electric Utilities Corporation, by its attorney, hereby makes the following Appeal and Formal Complaint from the Decision on the informal Complaint by the Bureau of Consumer Services at BCS Case No. 1688519, pursuant to Section 56.173, Title 52 of the Pennsylvania Code, 52 Pa. Code § 56.173, and in support thereof avers as follows:

1. Complaint Appellant is PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (hereinafter "PPL"), with its principal office located at 2 North Ninth Street, Allentown, Pennsylvania 18101.
2. Complaint Appellee is David Hoffman (hereinafter "Appellee"), whose address is 606 Edwin Street, Williamsport, Pennsylvania 17701.
3. Complaint interested party is Beau Taby, 722 First Avenue, Second Floor, Williamsport, Pennsylvania 17701.
4. On May 20, 2005, the Bureau of Consumer Services (hereinafter "BCS") issued a Decision at Case No. 1688519 on an informal Complaint filed by Complaint Appellee David Hoffman; a

true and correct copy of said Decision is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.

5. The informal Complaint of Appellee alleged that he was not liable for an outstanding balance of \$372.26 for electric service provided to 722 First Avenue, Williamsport, which balance had been transferred on September 13, 2001 by PPL to Appellee as owner of the subject property upon PPL's discovery of a foreign load. The service was subsequently transferred to the Tenant's name in 2002 when the Appellee notified PPL that foreign load as corrected.

6. Appellee's informal Complaint further disputed PPL's decision to place electric service back in his name effective June 8, 2004, for service at 722 First Avenue based upon PPL once again finding foreign load.

7. The aforesaid Decision of the BCS sustained Appellee's informal Complaint, concluding that there never was any foreign load on the meter for the premises at 722 First Avenue, that service for the meter at 722 First Avenue should never have been placed in Appellee's name, that Appellee is not liable for the balance of \$372.26 for service provided to 722 First Avenue, and that Appellee is not liable for electric service provided to 722 First Avenue.

8. PPL appeals the Decision of the BCS for the following reasons:

A. Appellee's informal Complaint should have been dismissed on the grounds that such issues were addressed or should have been addressed in prior BCS proceedings at No. 1035946 and 1035964, as to all issues pertaining to PPL's discovery of foreign loads on September 13, 2001.

B. Complainant's informal Complaint should have been dismissed on the grounds of waiver and estoppel as to all issues pertaining to PPL's discovery of foreign loads on September 13, 2001.

C. The Decision of the BCS is contrary to Act 54, 66 Pa.C.S.A. § 1529.1, as well as the Decision of the Public Utility Commission in Elizabeth Santos v. Metropolitan Edison Company, Docket No. C-00967757 (Order entered August 7, 1997), which required PPL to place the account of Appellee's tenants in Appellee's name upon discovery of foreign loads at 720<sup>1</sup> and 722 First Avenue, Williamsport on September 13, 2001.

D. The Findings of Fact of the BCS that only the tenant at 722 First Avenue had access to the basement is factually incorrect and contrary to PPL's investigation, which discovered the existence of a common-use basement and foreign load on the meters of both the tenants at 720 First Avenue and 722 First Avenue.

E. The BCS erred in relying upon the fact that both the accounts for 722 First Avenue and 720 First Avenue were placed back in the tenants' names on March 14, 2002, as such action did not release Appellee from his obligation for the prior transferred balance existing on September 13, 2001 under Act 54 of 1993 and Santos, supra.

F. The BCS further erred in finding that there was never a foreign load on the meter for 722 First Avenue, and that service for the meter at 722 First Avenue should never have been placed in Appellee's name; to the contrary, PPL discovered the existence of a foreign load on the meter for 722 First Avenue on both September 13, 2001 and June 8, 2004, and as a result was required to transfer the account balance to the name of Appellee David Hoffman.

G. The BCS further erred in concluding that David Hoffman is not liable for either the balance of \$372.26 or for service to 722 First Avenue as of June 8, 2004.

H. The Decision of the BCS was otherwise erroneous and contrary to law.

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<sup>1</sup> The BCS Decision at issue in this appeal does not appear to involve the foreign load discovered at 720 First Avenue, but to the extent that it does PPL disputes any finding that there was no foreign load.

9. PPL respectfully submits that the Decision of the BCS should be reversed, and PPL requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission direct that the account balance in question for accrued electric service at the premises located at 722 First Avenue, Williamsport, as well as the prior balance of \$372.25, be placed back in the name of Appellee David Hoffman, the owner/landlord of the premises.

WHEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, PPL respectfully requests that its Appeal and formal Complaint be sustained, that the Decision of the Bureau of Consumer Services be reversed, and that such other relief be granted as is appropriate.

**Decision On Informal Complaint By The Bureau Of Consumer Services:****Statement Of Complaint:**

A summary of the customer's complaint is as follows:

This customer is disputing a bill in the amount of \$372.00 from 722 First Avenue. The customer is also disputing the company establishing service in his name at 722 First Avenue as of June 8, 2004.

**Investigation By Staff Of The Bureau Of Consumer Services Revealed:**

- 1) That this customer is the property owner of this residential rental property.
- 2) That per the property owner, the tenant at 722 First Avenue has sole access to the basement at this property.
- 3) That on September 13, 2001, the company completed an investigation at this property. The company did find three lights bulbs in the basement that are connected to the meter for 720 First Avenue.
- 4) That as of September 13, 2001, the accounts for 720 and 722 First Avenue, were transferred to the property owner's name. At that time there was a balance of \$372.26 on the account for 722 First Avenue.
- 5) That per written notification to the company from the property owner, as of October 6, 2001, the three light bulbs in the basement are no longer connected to the meter for 720 First Avenue.
- 6) That per an addendum provided to the Pa Public Utility Commission, dated January 28, 2002, an investigation of this property on January 23, 2002, revealed only the tenant at 722 First Avenue had access to the basement and that there was no foreign load on the meter for 722 First Avenue.
- 7) That per contact with company representative, Tushanna Hamilton (documented on BCS# 1035964), on March 14, 2002, both the accounts for 720 and 722 First Avenue, were placed back in the tenant's names.
- 8) That company records show on June 8, 2004, the company completed an inspection of this property and verified foreign load on the meters for both 720 and 722 First Avenue.

- 9) That the company report to the Pa Public Utility Commission, dated July 9, 2004, did not indicate what foreign load was discovered on June 8, 2004.
- 10) That per the company inspection on June 8, 2004, the company set up new accounts for 720 and 722 First Avenue in the property owner's name.

**Based On These Findings, The Bureau Of Consumer Services Concludes:**

- 1) That only the tenant at 722 First Avenue has access to the basement at this location.
- 2) That the company investigation on September 13, 2001, revealed foreign load on the meter for 720 First Avenue. No foreign load on 722 First Avenue, since only 722 had basement access.
- 3) That there never was foreign load on the meter for 722 First Avenue.
- 4) That the service for the meter at 722 First Avenue should never have been placed in the property owner's name.

**Therefore It Is Decided:**

- 1) That the informal complaint of DAVID HOFFMAN is sustained.
- 2) That David Hoffman is not liable for the balance of \$372.26 for service to 722 First Avenue.
- 3) That David Hoffman is not liable for the service to 722 First Avenue since it was established in his name without his request, as of June 8, 2004.


1. You have twenty (20) days from the date on which this complaint is served to either satisfy this complaint or to file with the **Secretary of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, P. O. Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265**, an answer (original and three copies), in writing, under oath, which, as required by Section 5.61 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 5.61, either affirms or specifically denies the allegations in this complaint. You must also serve a copy of the answer upon the complainant. The date of service is the mailing date as indicated by the date at the top of this Notice. Section 1.56(a) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 1.56(a).

2. If you fail to either satisfy this complaint or to file answer or other responsive pleading within twenty (20) days, you will be deemed to have admitted all the allegations in this complaint in accordance with Section 5.61 of the Commission's Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 5.61. In that event, the Commission may, without hearing, enter an order which either revokes or suspends any certificate or permit held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. The Commission is not limited to the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

3. If you elect to satisfy this complaint you must file, within twenty (20) days from the date on which this complaint is served, affidavits executed by each complainant that this complaint has been satisfied. Such affidavits must describe the basis on which this complaint was satisfied; any settlement agreement between the parties must be reduced to writing and attached to the affidavit. 
