PREHEARING MEMORANDUM OF THE MET-ED INDUSTRIAL USERS GROUP, THE PENELEC INDUSTRIAL CUSTOMER ALLIANCE, THE PENN POWER USERS GROUP, AND THE WEST PENN POWER INDUSTRIAL INTERVENORS

As requested by Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Elizabeth H. Barnes in the November 29, 2012, Prehearing Conference Order, the Med-Ed Industrial Users Group ("MEIUG"), the Penelec Industrial Customer Alliance ("PICA"), the Penn Power Users Group ("PPUG"), and the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors ("WPPII") (collectively, "Industrial Customer Groups") hereby submit this Prehearing Memorandum.

I. HISTORY OF THE PROCEEDING

On November 13, 2012, Metropolitan Edison Company ("Met-Ed"), Pennsylvania Electric Company ("Penelec"), Pennsylvania Power Company ("Penn Power"), and West Penn

Power Company ("West Penn") (collectively, "Companies") petitioned the Pennsylvania Public

Utility Commission ("PUC" or "Commission") for approval of their Phase II Energy Efficiency

& Conservation ("EE&C") Plans ("Phase II Plans"). The Companies' Joint Petition for Approval

of their Phase II Plans ("Joint Petition") identifies and describes the Companies' programs to be

implemented to achieve the additional consumption reduction targets adopted by the

Commission's Phase II Implementation Order entered August 3, 2012, at Docket Nos. M-2008-

2069887 and M-2012-2289411 ("Implementation Order"), and requests authorization to

implement proposed tariff riders for cost recovery purposes.

On December 11, 2012, the Industrial Customer Groups filed a Joint Petition to Intervene

and Answer in this proceeding. A description of the Industrial Customer Groups is set forth in

Paragraph 1 of the Industrial Customer Groups' Joint Petition to Intervene and Answer. The

Industrial Customer Groups' Joint Petition to Intervene and Answer awaits disposition by the

ALJ.

II. ANTICIPATED ISSUES AND SUB-ISSUES

The Industrial Customer Groups are concerned with issues regarding the terms and conditions of their electricity service, including any rate increases imposed as a result of the Companies' Phase II Plans. The Industrial Customer Groups anticipate pursuing these issues during this proceeding, and also reserve the right to raise further issues and to respond to all matters raised by other parties.

III. PROPOSED WITNESSES

The Industrial Customer Groups are still evaluating whether they will present any witnesses in this proceeding. If the Industrial Customer Groups determine that they will present such witnesses, the Industrial Customer Groups will inform the ALJ and the other parties as soon as possible. The Industrial Customer Groups intend to participate in this proceeding through the submission of discovery, cross-examination of other parties' witnesses, and the submission of briefs, exceptions and reply exceptions, if necessary.

IV. PROPOSED SCHEDULE AND DISCOVERY RULES

The Industrial Customer Groups will cooperate with the ALJ and the parties at the Prehearing Conference to develop an appropriate procedural schedule and discovery rules in accordance with the Commission's regulations and any directives issued by the ALJ.

V. POSSIBILITY OF SETTLEMENT

The Industrial Customer Groups are willing to participate in discussions with the other parties to amicably resolve the issues in this proceeding.
