

Dear Chairman Quain,

I am writing this letter as an employee of Duquesne Light Co., Pittsburgh's major utility provider. My reason for taking the time to write is to express my concerns from an employee's standpoint in this very complicated matter of Electric Deregulation. I have been an employee of Duquesne for 8 years. Unfortunately, my tenure of service has not gone without interruption, as I was laid off in 1994 through 1997. I am a member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. Along with my fellow union brothers and sisters, I have grave concerns regarding our employment outlook. Our concerns are as a result of not only the recent decisions Duquesne Light has had to make, in order to satisfy the Pa. Public Utility Commission's standards for survival in a competitive market, but also Duquesne's decisions on the way it considers it now has to treat it's employees in order to remain competitive.

Duquesne Light has been awarded, by the Pa. PUC, an extremely large amount of Stranded Cost Money. I believe that the figure approaches or slightly surpasses the 1 billion-dollar mark. Duquesne Light is also in the process of selling all of it's generation plants. They have decided to exchange ownership with First Energy, agreeing to swap it's Beaver Valley Nuclear Plant, in exchange for about 5 of First Energy's Coal Powered Generating Plants, of which Duquesne will sell at a later time. Duquesne has also decided that perhaps they should explore auctioning off their "company of last resort" status, which obligates them to provide electric service to those customers not choosing to pick from the list of Companies wishing to sell power in the State of Pa. These decisions, although prudent ones from a company forced to adapt to competition, has put thousands of good paying union jobs in jeopardy. My job is one of them.

The Thousands of jobs that are being threatened need a voice that can be clearly heard. A voice that will stand up and fight for the fair treatment of employees in the electric industry. I urge you to join with your fellow colleagues and become vigilant in your support for the thousands of Pennsylvania jobs that are currently being threatened. As you know, these are not just jobs that are being affected. These are jobs that provide us with the opportunity to make a decent living and to support our families. These are jobs that allow us to spend money in our local communities, helping to grow our economy.

We need voices that will stand in strong support, not against companies being awarded large amounts of money in stranded costs, but in support against the Company's subsequent decision to not utilize any portion of that money to provide job security for it's current employees. This voice needs to speak clearly, that these stranded costs also "represent" the fair treatment of current employees. These costs should not just be handed off to corporate shareholders as a windfall of unexpected wealth, but should be used to reinvest to building a stronger company that will not be eliminating good paying jobs, but will be "saving" and "creating" more of them in the future.

I urge you to contact our Union Representatives (Tim Moran/412-922-6969) and educate yourself to just what is transpiring between Duquesne Light and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. We have a current contract that runs until the year 2001, and the company is not living up to it's agreements. Although they say they are committed to the fair treatment of employees, they are falling short in their commitment. Please contact our

officials and commit yourself to standing up for the thousands of jobs that are in jeopardy. There have been many cases that have recently received attention, for the loss of jobs in the region, and it's affects on communities. I can point to the Nabisco case, and most recently, the US Air case regarding enlarging maintenance facilities. Both of these cases warranted intervention from our officials. However, I never see the urgency from our officials to protect the jobs affected by deregulation in the utility industry. Our situation is of great importance, because Duquesne Light is a major employer in the Pittsburgh area. There are literally thousands of jobs at stake here, and a huge projected impact on the local economy.

Please be the voice that stands in support of keeping good paying jobs in this area. Join with many other voices to protect our union workers who are in desperate need of support.

Dear Mr. Bick:

You recently sent electronic mail to Chairman John M. Quain of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission indicating your concerns about the anticipated divestiture of generation assets by Duquesne Light Company and the possibility of the Company bidding out their provider of last resort obligations. Specifically, you urged Chairman Quain to contact the representatives for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) regarding these matters.

The proposed generation auction plan was filed by Duquesne Light Company in August of 1998 in accordance with the Commission's restructuring order of May 29, 1998. The System Council U-10, IBEW, actively participated in Duquesne's restructuring proceeding and has sought appellate review of the Commission's order. In the May 29 order, the Commission outlined the various items for inclusion in Duquesne's divestiture plan, specifically requiring Duquesne to "set forth transitional issues and the resolution of those issues in a manner that is fair to customers, investors, the employees of the Company, local communities, and other affected parties." Order at 81. Additionally, by the divestiture plan, Duquesne was required to address its continuing obligation to serve.

Currently, Duquesne's proposed generation auction plan is undergoing review by the Commission, and comments to the plan have been filed by several interested parties, including the System Council U-10, IBEW. The Commission will consider all comments before issuing a final order approving, modifying or rejecting Duquesne's proposal. Further, the Commission is presently reviewing Duquesne's agreement with FirstEnergy providing for the exchange of certain generating assets.

Dear Mr. Quinn:

Local 270, of the Utility Workers Union of America, AFL-CIO, is the exclusive bargaining representative in all matters pertaining to wages, hours, working and all other conditions of employment for all Operating, Maintenance and Construction employees.

Through the Internet and local newspapers, we have heard that FirstEnergy and Duquesne Light Company are going to transfer generating assets, and Duquesne plans to auction off their assets. These transfers of assets include our members at the Perry Power Plant and the Avon Lake Plant. The assets that are to be auctioned will include our members at the Avon Lake Plant. We also understand that transmission assets are being transferred into a new subsidiary called American Transmission Systems Inc.

In the filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission, we understand that in regard to labor, the parties will cooperate to resolve labor-related matters, including, with respect to Union contracts, workforce levels, severance, and employee benefits, in a manner that treats employees fairly and equitably apportions any related costs between the parties. The definitive agreements for the Generation exchange shall clearly define and equitably apportion the rights and obligations of the parties regarding these matters.

One of our concerns is how the Duquesne Light Company plans on resolving this issue? Local 270 and FirstEnergy are currently involved in several legal battles pertaining to the Company's illegal implementation of their terms and conditions of employment. We have filed charges with the National Labor Relations Board seeking 10(j) injunction relief. We have a suit filed in Federal Court pertaining to labor issues and many of our illegally laid-off members have sought legal counsel to address their individual concerns.

Another one of our concerns is how the sale of this plant will affect the service in Northeast Ohio? Local 270, along with our National Union, has been active on the deregulation front. This area suffered a shortage of power this summer and our fear is that this could add to the problem.

I am in receipt of your October 23, 1998 letter to Chairman Quain regarding the anticipated divestiture of generation assets by Duquesne Light Company.
