O R D E R

BY THE COMMISSION:

This application was filed January 12, 1993. Public notice of the application was given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of February 13, 1993. The record, which consists of statements entered by the applicant and the supporting shipper is now certified to the Commission for its decision without oral hearing.

The applicant, Henry L. Taylor, an individual is domiciled at 1280 Nawaskwa Road, Biglerville, Adams County. Applicant's terminal facility is located in Menallen Township, Adams County. The facility is on more than ten acres of ground and includes office space and a six bay garage. Communications with drivers and shippers is conducted by commercial telephone service. Applicant owns and operates thirteen (13) tractors and forty-two (42) trailers.

Taylor's safety program consists of booklets or pamphlets which are distributed and discussed. Four general safety meetings are held each year. Awards are presented in conjunction with the meetings. Maintenance is performed

in the company garage and each vehicle is inspected daily. An unaudited financial statement submitted by the applicant shows the trucking company's financial standing as follows: total assets of \$293,383.66, total liabilities \$300,312.47, leaving net worth of (\$6,928.81). An income statement for the year 1992 shows net income of \$52,037.82.

Warren S. Driscoll, Jr., customer service manager of Weyerhaeuser Paper Company (Weyerhaeuser) submitted a statement in support of the applicant. Weyerhaeuser is a manufacturer of corrugated shipping containers. Weyerhaeuser recently established a distribution center in Adams County from which it ships materials used to pack fruit and vegetables. Destinations include: Lancaster, Lancaster County; Orangeville, Mercer County; Aspers, Adams County; Sunbury, Northumberland County; Berwick, Columbia County; Fishertown, Bedford County; Waynesboro, Franklin County; Cashtown, Adams County; Quarryville, Lancaster County; Mount Pleasant Mills, Snyder County and Dalls, Luzerne County. Shipments are received from Red Hill, Montgomery County.

A review of the record shows that the applicant has the ability, equipment, experience and fitness necessary to provide the proposed service. Although the support shown is not overwhelming in nature it appears sufficient to establish need for the proposed service, THEREFORE,

We find:

1. That the applicant currently operates pursuant to a common carrier certificate granted December 13, 1985.
2. That the applicant has the necessary equipment, experience, and fitness to provide the proposed service.
3. That approval of the application, as amended, is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application be and is hereby approved, and that the certificate issued on December 13, 1985 as amended, be further amended to include the following right:

To transport, as a Class D carrier property for
Weyerhaeuser Paper Company from its facilities in Adams
County, to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa;

subject to the following condition:


That no right, power or privilege be granted
to transport commodities in bulk and household
goods in use.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation granted herein until it shall have complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code and the rules and regulations of the Commission relative to the filing and acceptance of a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.
