PA PUC Order from February 28, 2013 Opinion and Order:

That within thirty (30) days of the entry of this Opinion and Order, PECO Energy Company shall file an explanation with the Commission's Bureaus of Consumer Services and Technical Utility Services to address the inconsistency in the energy savings estimates presented in its Phase II Energy Efficiency and Conservation Plan for the Low-Income Energy Efficiency Program.

PECO Response:

PECO appreciates this opportunity to respond to the Commission's February 28, 2013 Opinion and Order regarding a perceived "inconsistency" in the energy savings estimates presented in its Phase II Energy and Efficiency Conservation Plan for the Low-Income Energy Efficiency Program (LEEP). With respect to LEEP, PECO provided two energy savings estimates. The first estimate, 49,364 MWh, is PECO's estimate for total MWh savings by customers participating in LEEP with incomes up to 200% of the federal poverty income guidelines (FPIG). The second estimate, 47,884 MWh, is PECO's estimate for total MWh savings by customers participating in LEEP with incomes up to 150% of the FPIG. PECO will only count MWh savings from participating customers at or below 150% of the FPIG for purposes of meeting the 4.5% low income sector target.
