The following move reflects charges exceeding the estimate by more than 10%:

Charles Adomanus, estimate was \$800, bill of lading showed charge of \$960. (a)

A common carrier of household goods in use shall file with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Bureau of Transportation and Safety, Motor Carrier Services and Enforcement Division, Harrisburg. Pennsylvania, a quarterly report containing instances wherein charges exceeded the estimate by more than 10% with the explanation of the reasons for the variances in accordance with 52 Pa. Code §31.124. As of the date of this letter, no such report has been received by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

The following six moves reflect violations of 66 Pa. C.S. §1303 by charging a rate other than that specified in the tariff on file with this Commission at Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 8:

- (a) Jennifer Orloff, February 6, 1997, was charged \$672 for a vehicle and four men for six hours including travel time. The proper charge should have been at \$107 per hour for a total of \$642, resulting in an overcharge of \$30.
- (b) Michael Alexander, March 17, 1997, was charged a rate of \$65 per hour as opposed to the proper rate of \$57 per hour for a vehicle and two men for five hours including travel time, resulting in an overcharge of \$40.
- (c) Mary Coon, May 16, 1997, was charged a rate of \$65 per hour for a vehicle and three men instead of the proper rate of \$82 per hour for a van and three men for four hours including travel time, resulting in an undercharge of \$68.
- (d) Ernie Deasey, June 11, 1997, was charged a rate of \$65 per hour as opposed to the proper rate of \$57.per hour for a van and two men for five and a half hours including travel time, resulting in an overcharge of \$44.50.
- (e) Susan Harman, November 7, 1997, was charged a rate of \$65 per hour as opposed to the proper rate of \$57 per hour for a vehicle and two men for five hours including travel time, resulting in an overcharge of \$40.
- (f) Rhonda Kearney, November 28, 1997, was charged a rate of \$65 per hour as opposed to the proper rate of \$57 per hour for a vehicle and two men for five hours including travel time, resulting in an overcharge of \$40.

Continued operations, as described above, may subject you to penalties which may include the assessment of fines up to \$1,000 per violation.
