

FINDING AND ORDER

The Commission finds:

- (1) The electric, gas, and natural gas companies (utility companies) defined in Section 4905.03, Revised Code, are public utilities in accordance with Section 4905.02, Revised Code, and, as such, are subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission, pursuant to Sections 4905.04, 4905.05, and 4905.06, Revised Code.
- (2) Section 4909.16, Revised Code, provides, in part, that, in the event of an emergency, when the Commission finds it necessary to prevent injury to the business or interests of the public or of any public utility, it' may temporarily alter, amend, or suspend any existing rates or schedules.
- (3) Chapters 4901:1-17 and 4901:1-18, Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.), address, inter alia, the establishment of credit for residential service, the termination and reconnection of residential service by utility companies, and the natural gas and gas Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP) and Graduate PIPP programs. In addition, Chapter 122, O.A.C., addresses the electric PIPP and Graduate PIPP programs. Effective November 1, 2010, all of these chapters were revised to allow for a PIPP Plus program, which provides that, when a customer pays the monthly PIPP Plus payment on time and in full, two types of credits are applied to the customer's account, thus, incenting the customer to make regular payments.

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(4) For more than a decade, prior to each winter heating season, the Commission has voiced concerns about residential customers who, because of limited financial resources, particularly in light of the state of the economy in Ohio, have had their gas and/or electric utility service disconnected during the winter because they are unable to pay their bills and who, because of arrearages, have been unable to have these services restored. Upon contemplation, each year, the Commission has determined that, in accordance with Section 4909.16, Revised Code, in order to prevent injury to these residential customers, it was in the public interest to issue special reconnect procedures for the winter heating season.

- (5) For the 2012-2013 winter heating season, the Commission expects that the utility companies under our jurisdiction will assist customers in every way possible to maintain their service for heating purposes. We expect these utilities to advertise, as much as practicable, the availability of the PIPP Plus programs, as well as the other standard payment plans provided by Commission rule. Moreover, the Commission expects the utilities to err on the side of maintaining service when there is a doubt as to the applicability or the interpretation of a rule.
- (6) In addition, upon consideration of the upcoming 2012-2013 winter heating season, the Commission again finds it necessary and prudent to invoke the emergency provisions of Section 4909.16, Revised Code, in order to prevent injury to affected residential customers and support the public interest. We continue to be concerned about those residential customers who, because of limited financial resources, have had their gas and/or electric utility service disconnected or have a disconnection notice because they are unable to pay their bills. While the Commission believes the residential service rules have substantially assisted customers to keep energy service, in spite of their financial situation, we are aware of the fact that a number of Ohio citizens will enter the winter season without utility service for heating purposes. This, we find, constitutes a continuing emergency.

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(7) Under the new rules that became effective November 1, 2010, to remain on PIPP Plus, customers were required to annually verify their income. Customers have 60 days to reverify income or they are removed from PIPP Plus. In addition, under the new rules in Chapter 4901:1-18, O.A.C., customers are now removed from gas PIPP Plus if they do not pay their missed installments within 30 days of their anniversary date. Once a customer is removed from PIPP Plus for any reason, the customer must pay missed installments or current monthly bills before rejoining PIPP Plus; thus, a customer who is dropped during the winter may have large bills to pay before rejoining PIPP Plus. However, since the 2010-2011 winter heating season was the first season under the new rules, the Commission found it judicious to allow for a transition period, in order to enable PIPP Plus customers to become familiar with the new reverification and anniversary date procedures. In addition, for the 2011-2012 winter heating season, the Commission determined that further transition to the PIPP Plus program was necessary. While this gradual transition over the last two years to the rules which became effective November 1, 2010, was necessary, we believe that, with the upcoming third winter heating season under these rules, it is now appropriate to fully implement the requirements of the rules. To that end, the Commission hereby issues this order to effectuate the special reconnection procedures for the 2012-2013 winter heating season.

Special Reconnection Procedures for Winter 2012-2013

(8) Upon review of the response to the new PIPP Plus program implemented during the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 winter heating seasons, the Commission has continued to see positive changes with regard to customers' payment behavior. Accordingly, for the 2012-2013 winter heating season, in order to prevent injury to the interests of the public, we hereby direct, pursuant to the authority provided by Section 4909.16, Revised Code, utility companies under our jurisdiction to reconnect the service of those who have had their service disconnected for nonpayment or to maintain service, provided that the person seeking to have service restored or maintained does all of the following:

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(a) The person must pay his/her arrearages, as set forth in Rule 4901:1-18-07(A) and (B), O.A.C.; or cure any default he/she may have incurred on a standard payment plan provided, pursuant to Rule 4901:1-18-05, O.A.C., if the customer is on such a plan; or pay \$175, whichever is less (funds for this payment may come in whole or in part from the Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program (E-HEAP) or other energy assistance programs). If the customer's gas and electric service have both been disconnected for nonpayment and different utility companies provided these services, the utility companies involved may come to an agreement as to the apportionment of the \$175 between them. If an agreement can not be reached, the utility companies shall apportion the \$175 based upon a ratio of the arrearages the customer owes each company. If the same company provides both of these services, then the \$175 should be apportioned based upon a ratio of the arrearages the customer owes for each service.

Customers not already on a payment plan who pay the \$175 must also enter into a payment plan to stop disconnection or to reconnect service. The \$175 payment includes any security deposit a utility may require. The utility may add the company's approved tariff reconnection charge to this amount, up to \$36. If the company's approved tariff reconnection charge is greater than \$36, the balance of the reconnection charge may be billed to the customer the following month.

Customers who have had their gas and/or electric service disconnected for a fraudulent practice or tampering shall have that service reconnected upon payment for the amount of service obtained fraudulently, plus any investigation fee or nonsufficient fund check

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charge under the company's approved tariff, plus any defaulted amount not to exceed \$175, plus the company's approved tariff reconnection charge, up to \$36. If the company's approved tariff reconnection charge is greater than \$36, the balance of the reconnection charge may be billed to the customer the following month.

- (b) To reenroll or maintain active status in PIPP Plus, customers will be required to pay the balance of any PIPP Plus default over \$175 or over the agreed-upon split amount before the due date of the customer's next bill to maintain or be reenrolled in PIPP Plus. Thus, the customer can begin making the established PIPP Plus program payment beginning with the next billing cycle, and be eligible to receive incentive credits for on-time and in-full payments.
- (c) The person must apply for the regular Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP). A utility company may require the person seeking restoration of service to represent, either orally or in a written statement, that the person has applied for this program before it restores service to anyone who cannot pay his/her total utility bill. If the application period for an assistance program has lapsed or has not yet begun, it is not necessary for the person seeking to have service restored to show that he/she has applied for that specific program.

Customers who schedule an appointment in order to apply for E-HEAP assistance, as confirmed by fax or electronic communication sent by a community action agency to a utility company, shall be granted a reprieve from disconnection until five business days after the appointment. If the utility has not received confirmation of an E-HEAP benefit by the start of the sixth business day following the

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customer's appointment, the utility may proceed with disconnection. The community action agency shall also notify the utility daily by fax or electronic communication concerning any missed appointments. As confirmed by fax or electronic communication sent by a community action agency to a utility company, if the customer misses his/her appointment with the local community action agency, the utility may proceed with disconnection.

- (d) Customers not enrolled in PIPP Plus shall enroll in a standard extended payment plan provided for in Rule 4901:1-18-05 (A) and (B), O.A.C., or a plan offered by the utility company, whichever is the most appropriate for the customer, provided that the customer will ultimately be able to maintain service. The customer must enroll on a payment plan at the time the special reconnection procedures are invoked.
- (e) To reenroll or maintain active status in Graduate PIPP Plus, customers will be required to pay the balance of any Graduate PIPP Plus default over \$175 or over the agreed-upon split amount before the due date of the customer's next bill to maintain or be reenrolled in Graduate PIPP Plus. Thus, the customer can continue making his/her established Graduate PIPP Plus payment beginning with the next billing cycle, and be eligible to receive incentive credits for on-time and in-full payments. The time period is not extended to participate in Graduate PIPP Plus.
- (f) The act of a customer who makes payment by check to avoid the disconnection of his/her gas and/or electric service immediately prior to the start of the special winter heating procedures, and whose check is then returned for insufficient funds after the special procedures are in effect, will be considered a fraudulent

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Customers under these specific practice. circumstances shall be able to avoid disconnection by paying the amount of the returned check, plus the company's approved tariff return check charge(s), plus any defaulted exceed \$175 prior amount not to If the customer's gas and/or disconnection. electric service are disconnected, then the procedures set forth in finding (8)(a), above, for disconnection due to a fraudulent practice, will apply.

Other Special Procedures Supporting the 2012-2013 Winter Heating Season Procedures

- (9) Customer notification of special reconnection procedures, and the fact that customers can have their service restored and the procedures set forth herein must be provided by each utility company in writing, by bill insert, or any other form of customer communication, to those customers whose service continues to be disconnected because of nonpayment. These special reconnection procedures shall become effective no later than Monday, October 15, 2012. If the Commission determines that a utility is not following these procedures, we will take those steps we deem appropriate to protect the customers served by that utility.
- (10) Customers requesting service at a new address who have an outstanding balance with the utility company can establish new service upon payment of \$175. The customer must also enter into a payment arrangement on the balance before service is connected, in either one of the standard extended payment plans provided for in Rule 4901:1-18-05(B), O.A.C., or, if eligible, in the PIPP Plus program, whichever is the most appropriate for the customer. If this outstanding balance is a PIPP Plus default, the customer must follow the process set forth in finding (8)(b) above.
- (11) Customers requesting new service with no previous outstanding balance may establish new service upon payment of \$175, in lieu of paying the required security deposit, if the

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required security deposit would be more than \$175. When the customer elects this option, the utility company may add the remaining balance of the required security deposit to the customer's next bill. If the required security deposit is less than \$175, the utility shall not count the customer's payment of the lesser amount as the customer's one-time use of the special reconnection procedures described above.

- (12) Customers with multiple residential accounts who wish to utilize the winter reconnect order to maintain or reconnect service may do so only at the property where the customer resides. In addition to payment of \$175 to maintain or reconnect service, the customer must enter into a payment arrangement on the balance of that residential account, in either a standard extended payment plan provided for in Rule 4901:1-18-05(B), O.A.C., or, if eligible, in the PIPP Plus program, whichever is the most appropriate for the customer.
- (13) Utility companies must inform a residential customer of the payment plan options under Rules 4901:1-18-04, 4901:1-18-05, and 4901:1-18-06, O.A.C., or similar provisions, and other available payment plans and options for financial assistance, as well as all the payment plan options provided by the Commission herein, when the customer contacts the utility concerning the disconnection of service or payment arrangements.
- (14) For current residential customers not enrolled in the PIPP Plus program, who request reconnection and arrearage treatment under the special reconnection procedures, as soon as the \$175 payment for reconnection is paid, the utility shall place the remaining unpaid balance into the arrearages for that customer so that the customer can begin making payment under the terms of the agreed extended payment plan beginning with the next billing cycle, as if it were a new plan, subject to the arrearages already incurred. For customers disconnected for fraudulent practice or tampering, the payments required in finding (8)(a), above, will apply. As noted previously, the extended payment plans are described in Rule 4901:1-18-05, O.A.C.

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(15) With regard to the maintenance or reconnection of service for existing customers who do not utilize the special reconnect procedures, the Commission notes that the intent of the special reconnection procedures is to permit customers, with an outstanding balance greater than \$175, who have been disconnected or who are facing disconnection to pay less than their balance to have their service restored or maintained. Therefore, when an existing residential customer makes a payment of less than \$175, which cures any default previously owed to the utility in order to maintain service, or requests reconnection of service, the utility shall not count this payment as the customer's one-time use of the special reconnection procedures described above.

- (16) With regard to reconnection of service, the utility company involved shall reconnect service as described in Rule 4901:1-18-07(A) and (B), O.A.C, which provides that a customer whose service has been disconnected for nonpayment for 10 business days or less can request service be reconnected the same business day by providing proof of payment by 12:30 p.m. If payment is made after 12:30 p.m., the service will be reconnected the following business day. However, where a customer's service has been disconnected for nonpayment for more than 10 business days, the reconnection of the customer's service will be scheduled as if it is a request for new service which allows five business days for gas service and three business days for electric service.
- (17) A reconnection charge, as described in Rule 4901:1-18-07(C), O.A.C., shall not be assessed by the utility company, unless the company has actually disconnected the service.
- (18) A customer can only use the special procedures provided pursuant to this order once from Monday, October 15, 2012 through Monday, April 15, 2013, to:
 - (a) reconnect service under the special reconnection procedures, if the service has been disconnected;
 - (b) avoid the disconnection of service under the special maintenance procedures; or

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(c) request the connection of new service under the other special procedures.

(19) The Commission recognizes that its jurisdiction does not extend to those utilities owned or operated by municipalities, nor do we regulate cooperatives. However, we hope these entities will adopt the program laid out above so that together we can limit the number of Ohioans who will suffer from a lack of heat this winter.

Application for Energy Assistance and Weatherization Programs

- (20) Rule 4901:1-18-12(C)(2), O.A.C., requires anyone applying for the PIPP Plus program to also apply for all energy assistance and weatherization programs for which he/she is eligible. Included among these programs is the Home Weatherization Assistance Program (HWAP), the largest weatherization program in the state of Ohio. The Ohio Department of Development (ODOD) hopes that the HWAP program will result in the increased weatherization of eligible homes, both reducing energy usage and the arrearages accruing to the account of the PIPP Plus customer.
- (21) The Commission finds that the utility companies subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission should continue to assist ODOD by providing the data requested in ODOD's customer information report.
- (22) As a final matter, the Commission notes that PIPP Plus program customers are required to apply for weatherization services, if they are individually solicited by a provider affiliated with a utility or a ODOD-sponsored weatherization program. If a customer refuses weatherization, he/she will be removed from the PIPP Plus program.

Data Collection

(23) One of the primary reasons the Commission continues to find it necessary to collect data to determine the number of customers using the special procedures is that customers have had their gas and/or electric service disconnected or are facing the impending disconnection of their service for

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nonpayment as we approach the winter heating season. As the Commission continues to evaluate the reason for these nonheating season disconnections of service, we need to track the number of customers who have gas and/or electric service reconnected each month, the types of payment plans entered into, and the length of time that customers were without gas and/or electric utility services. To aid us in making this determination, each utility company under the Commission's jurisdiction is directed to complete the Winter Reconnect Order Report, attached to this finding and order as Appendix A, and electronically submit it to Staff each month. Each utility company, with the exception of small gas companies, should upload its Winter Reconnect Order Report data to the Commission's database by the 20th of the following month, except that data for October 2012, shall be reported with the data for November 2012. companies should file monthly data with the via an Excel template provided by the Commission.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That, effective no later than Monday, October 15, 2012, each utility company under the Commission's jurisdiction shall restore the service of those customers whose gas or electric utility service has been disconnected for nonpayment, in accordance with the terms set out above in finding (8). It is, further,

ORDERED, That, effective no later than Monday, October 15, 2012, each utility company under the Commission's jurisdiction shall maintain the service of those customers, who have received a notice that their service is to be disconnected for nonpayment, in accordance with the terms set out above in finding (8). It is, further,

ORDERED, That, effective no later than Monday, October 15, 2012, each utility company under the Commission's jurisdiction shall establish service for customers who request new service, in accordance with the terms set out above. It is, further,

ORDERED, That the utility companies comply with the Commission's directives set forth in this finding and order. It is, further,

ORDERED, That the special procedures in this order to maintain, reconnect, or establish service are available to a customer only once from Monday, October 15, 2012 through Monday, April 15, 2013. It, is further,

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ORDERED, That each utility company under the Commission's jurisdiction provide the data requested in finding (23) and Appendix A to this finding and order, for the preceding month by the 20th day of the following month, except that data for October 2012, shall be reported with the data for November 2012. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this finding and order be served upon each gas company, natural gas company, and electric distribution utility, and all other interested persons of record.




