

PREHEARING MEMORANDUM
OF THE
OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE

Pursuant to Section 333 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 33 and the Prehearing Conference Order issued by Administrative Law Judges Mary D. Long and Jeffrey A. Watson on June 4, 2013, the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) provides the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On January 23, 2013, Peoples TWP, LLC (Peoples TWP or Company) filed a Long Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan (LTIIP) pursuant to Section 1352 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 1352. On February 12, 2013, the OCA filed Comments on the LTIIP. On March 4, 2013, Peoples TWP filed Reply Comments.

On January 31, 2013, pursuant to Section 1353, Peoples TWP filed a Petition for Approval of a Distribution System Improvement Charge (DSIC). 66 Pa.C.S. § 1353. On February 19, 2013, the Pennsylvania Independent Oil and Gas Association (PIOGA) filed a Petition to Intervene. The OCA filed an Answer, Notice of Intervention, and Formal Complaint and Public Statement on February 20, 2013. Also on February 20, 2013, the Office of Small

Business Advocate (OSBA) filed an Answer, Notice of Intervention and Public Statement. Customer, William Guntrum, filed a Formal Complaint against the DSIC on April 11, 2013.¹ Seven customers also filed letters in opposition to the implementation of a DSIC.

On February 1, 2013, Peoples TWP filed a Petition for Approval of the Limited Waivers of Certain Tariff Rules Related to Customer Service Line Replacement (Waiver Petition). On February 21, 2013 and February 22, 2013, respectively, OCA and the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (I&E) filed Comments on the Waiver Petition.

On May 23, 2013 the Commission issued a combined Opinion and Order regarding the Waiver Petition, LTIP, and the DSIC. By the Order entered May 23, 2013, the Commission approved Peoples TWP's LTIP. The Commission also approved the Company's proposed DSIC, consistent with its Order, subject to recoupment and/or refund pending final resolution of certain issues raised in the parties' Petitions and Answers. With regard to the Waiver Petition, the Commission approved the inclusion of the customer-owned lines in Peoples TWP's LTIP and referred the issue relating to the DSIC recovery of costs related to customer-owned service lines to be addressed in this proceeding.

The OCA now files this Prehearing Memorandum to set forth the procedure and issues that the OCA believes are relevant to this proceeding.

II. ISSUES

In its May 23, 2013 Order, the Commission directed that the following issues be assigned to the OALJ for hearing and preparation of a Recommended Decision:

1. DSIC recovery of costs related to customer-owned service lines, reliability improvements, special meter technology, information technology support, and vehicles, tools and equipment;

2. Impact of accumulated deferred income taxes associated with DSIC investments;
- and
3. Calculation of the state income tax component of the DSIC revenue requirement.

In addition, the OCA intends to address an issue regarding the applicability of the DSIC to all customer classes. 66 Pa. C.S. § 1358(d)(1). In its May 23, 2013 Order approving the DSIC subject to refund and recoupment, the Commission allowed Peoples to implement a tariff that would allow the Company to reduce or eliminate the DSIC for customers with “potential” competitive alternatives. Order at 57. In a the recent Order addressing the DSIC tariff proposed by Philadelphia Gas Works, the Commission directed the utility to file a tariff that removed the term “potential.” Petition of Philadelphia Gas Works for Approval of a Distribution System Improvement Charge, Docket Nos. P-2012-2337737, C-2013-2346939 (Order entered May 9, 2013). The OCA intends to present testimony in support of the Commission requiring Peoples to make a consistent change to its DSIC tariff.

Also, the OCA intends to address another issue, which was raised in its Answer but not addressed in the Commission’s May 23, 2013 Order: whether the Company may treat the costs of gathering lines as “distribution system” property for the purposes of DSIC recovery.

The OCA reserves the right to address any additional issues that arise during the course of the proceeding.

III. WITNESSES

The OCA intends to present the Direct, Rebuttal and Surrebuttal testimony, as may be necessary, of Thomas S. Catlin regarding the accounting and policy issues identified above. Mr. Catlin will present testimony in written form and will also attach various exhibits, documents,

and explanatory information, which will assist in the presentation of the OCA's case. His contact information is as follows:

IV. DISCOVERY

The OCA proposes no changes to the Commission's discovery regulations. To date, the OCA has served and the Company has provided responses to two sets of interrogatories.

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
VI. PROPOSED SCHEDULE

The OCA will work with the parties to develop a litigation schedule that is acceptable to the Presiding Officers and the parties. The OCA proposes the litigation schedule attached as Appendix A, which it understands to be acceptable to Peoples TWP.

VII. MOTION TO CONSOLIDATE

The Commission did not address the OCA's pending Formal Complaint, in its May 23, 2013 Order. The issues underlying the OCA's Formal Complaint against Peoples' proposed DSIC are the same issues the OCA has identified in this Petition proceeding. At the June 21, 2013 Prehearing, the OCA intends to make an oral Motion to Consolidate the two proceedings to avoid unnecessary duplication of administrative resources and financial costs associated with litigating the proceedings separately. As of the time of serving this memorandum, the OCA has been advised by counsel for PIOGA that they do not oppose consolidation of these proceedings.
