Dear Prothonotary McNulty:

The purpose of this letter is to clarify the position of the Office of Consumer Advocate ("OCA") concerning Enron's Supplemental Exhibit No. 1 (ITC Shortfall Agreement) to the Rebuttal Testimony of Andrew S. Fastow. This Exhibit is the subject of a pending Motion of PECO Energy to Strike Enron's Late-Filed Exhibit. PECO Brief, Appendix B. The OCA feels obligated to respond because certain representations have been made by Enron regarding OCA's cross-examination of Mr. Fastow and the assertion has been proffered that via this questioning, Enron's Supplemental Exhibit was "submitted with all parties knowledge and apparent consent." Enron Letter of November 26, 1997.

Previously, the OCA has taken no position on PECO's Motion, in part, because the OCA did not receive either the Enron Supplemental Exhibit nor the letter arguing for its admission into the record until December 1, 1997. Perhaps more importantly, it is the OCA's position that Enron's entire Plan is so unworkable that it makes little difference whether this particular Exhibit is admitted into the record at this time. With or without the ITC Shortfall Agreement, the Enron Plan cannot be lawfully adopted by the Commission. Now, however, following a review of the correspondence from Enron and PECO, the OCA does not want its silence to be construed in any way as "consent" for the admission of this Enron Exhibit.

When the OCA asked Enron Witness Fastow if the ITC Shortfall Agreement "will be prepared in time before the close of the record" it was done because parties such as the OCA had questions regarding its details and wanted those questions answered on the record. Tr. 2182.

Contrary to the claims of Enron in its November 26, 1997 letter, Mr. Fastow did not answer that "the Supplemental Exhibit would be prepared and submitted for the record." Rather, he stated that "[a]t this point I do not know when it will be prepared." Tr. 2182-2183. Enron's assertion in its November 26, 1997 letter that "[a]ll of the parties clearly understood that the Supplemental Exhibit would be submitted for the record and none of the parties objected to the submission at that time" is erroneous since Mr. Fastow did not indicate that this Exhibit would be "prepared" prior to the close of the record. Mr. Fastow merely indicated that he did "not know" when it would be prepared.

The OCA did not receive this Enron Exhibit until December 1, 1997. By that time, OCA's Brief in this proceeding was nearly completed and there was certainly no ability for OCA or any other party to question Enron regarding the details of this Exhibit. The OCA, therefore, supports PECO's Motion to Strike Enron's Supplemental Exhibit No. 1 at this time. In the alternative, the OCA would suggest that if this Exhibit is permitted into the record, that the Affidavit attached to PECO's Motion in which PECO identifies a number of concerns with the Enron Exhibit, should be admitted into the record as well.

For years PECO (Philadelphia Electric Co.) has had a monopoly on our electric charges. I live in Towamencin Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania. Our next door Township is Hatfield. Hatfield's electric service is PPh (Pennsylvania Power and Light). Hatfield's rates are considerably lower than Towamencin's are.

ENRON Corp. has filed the Choice Plan with the Pennsylvania Public Utilities Commission. The Choice Plan would reduce our electric rate by 20%.
