ORDER CERTIFYING THE RECORD

On December 3, 1996, the Electricity Generation Customer Choice and Competition Act, 66 Pa. C.S. §2801 et seq. was adopted, with an effective date of January 1, 1997 ("the Act"). This Act amends the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. §101 et seq., by restructuring the provision of retail electric service so as to phase-in customer choice of generation supplier commencing January 1, 1999. Section 2806 of the Act (66 Pa. C.S. §2806) requires that Pennsylvania's jurisdictional electric utilities file restructuring plans with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("Commission") for approval. By Order entered January 24, 1997 at Docket No. M-00960890F0005, the Commission established a schedule for the filing of these plans. PECO Energy Company ("PECO") was directed to file its restructuring plan on April 1, 1997.

In accordance with the Commission's January 24, 1997 Order, PECO on April 1, 1997 filed a comprehensive Restructuring Plan in which it requested the

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Commission to approve: (1) the imposition of unbundled rates, Competitive Transition Charges (CTCs) and specific tariff provisions designed to ensure direct customer access to all licenced electric generation suppliers; (2) the recovery of \$6.8 billion of stranded and transition costs; (3) a proposed plan to implement PECO's universal service obligations, including a mechanism to recover the associated costs; and (4) a proposed Customer Education Program.

Notice of the Restructuring Plan was provided to customers via bill inserts and in newspapers of general circulation in PECO's service territory. Copies of the filing were served on all parties to PECO's securitization proceeding at Docket No. R-00973877 and on all active participants in PECO's last general base rate proceeding at Docket No. R-00891364. The Restructuring Plan also was posted on PECO's Internet website.

By hearing notice dated April 3, 1997, a prehearing conference was scheduled for April 15, 1997 and the proceeding was assigned to the undersigned Presiding Officers.

The first prehearing conference was held in Harrisburg on April 15, 1997. At this prehearing conference, procedural issues were addressed and a schedule adopted, as set forth in Prehearing Order #1 dated April 25, 1997.

A second prehearing conference, also in Harrisburg, was held on May 21, 1997. A revised schedule, as set out in Prehearing Order #2 dated June 11, 1997, was adopted.

Through the filing of either Complaints or Petitions to Intervene, thirty-five parties were permitted to intervene.¹ Most of those parties requested and were granted active party status. In addition, the Office of Trial Staff (“OTS”), Office of Consumer Advocate (“OCA”), and the Office of Small Business Advocate (“OSBA”) actively participated.

With its proposed Restructuring Plan, PECO submitted the direct testimony and exhibits of seventeen witnesses. Pursuant to the litigation schedule set forth in Prehearing Order #2, on June 20, 1997, thirteen parties submitted the direct testimony and exhibits of thirty-seven witnesses. On July 18, 1997, PECO filed rebuttal testimony and exhibits of twenty-two witnesses. Surrebuttal testimony was filed by OTS, OSBA, the Philadelphia Area Industrial Energy Users Group (“PAIEUG”), and the Mid-Atlantic Power Supply Association (“MAPSA”).²

As a result of on-going settlement discussions among PECO and various parties, the litigation and briefing schedule was suspended by Order Granting Continuance dated July 31, 1997, Order Granting Motion for Suspension of Administrative Schedule

dated August 14, 1997, Order Granting Request for Extension of Time dated August 12, 1997 and Prehearing Order #3 dated August 28, 1997.

On August 27, 1997, a Joint Petition for Partial Settlement of PECO Energy Company's Proposed Restructuring Plan and Application for a Qualified Rate Order (the "Partial Settlement Petition" or "proposed settlement") was filed on behalf of PECO, Senator Fumo, Community Legal Services ("CLS") on behalf of its various clients³, OTS, OCA, OSBA, PAIEUG, the American Association of Retired Persons ("AARP"), Lance Haver and the Navy. Statements in Support of the proposed settlement were filed by PECO, OTS, OCA, OSBA, AARP, CLS (on behalf of its various clients), PAIEUG, Senator Fumo and Mr. Haver. Subsequent to the prehearing conference, Allegheny Power filed Comments on September 15, 1997, and Revised Comments on September 16, 1997. By letter dated August 28, 1997, the Pennsylvania Petroleum Association and the Pennsylvania Association of Plumbing, Heating and Cooling Contractors, Inc. indicated that they did not oppose the settlement. By letter dated September 8, 1997, the Pennsylvania Retailers Association withdrew its support of the proposed settlement.

A third prehearing conference was held in Harrisburg on September 10, 1997, at which a revised litigation and briefing schedule was adopted both for consideration of the proposed settlement as well as for the issues not resolved by the proposed settlement. Also,

the Application of the Action Alliance of Senior Citizens for Leave to Withdraw Complaint at Docket No. R-00973953C0004 was granted. See, Prehearing Order #4 dated September 16, 1997.

On September 10, 1997, the parties supporting the proposed settlement filed with the Commission a Petition of the Joint Signatories to Forego Use of a Recommended Decision in Evaluating the Joint Petition for Partial Settlement Recently Filed in this Docket. This Petition, which was unopposed, was granted by the Commission by Order adopted October 2, 1997, which also revised the schedule adopted at the third prehearing conference to require that briefs be filed within six days after the close of the record and conform to certain requirements concerning length and format. Also on September 10, 1997, the parties supporting the proposed settlement filed with the Commission a Petition of the Joint Signatories To Suspend Consideration of Certain Issues Pending a Commission Determination of Proper Forum. An Answer opposing this Petition was filed by the Pennsylvania Electric Competition Coalition⁴ on September 18, 1997. The Petition also was substantially granted by the Commission by Tentative Order adopted October 2, 1997, which directed that Comments be filed on or before October 6, 1997.

Designation of previously filed testimony which supported the proposed settlement were filed by PECO, OTS, OCA, OSBA, MAPSA, the Municipal Intervenors

Groups ("MIG"), AARP and PAIEUG. In addition, further testimony intended to support or address terms of the proposed settlement was filed by PECO. Indiana Power & Light Company ("IPL") designated testimony in this proceeding, which was the same as that filed in the securitization proceeding (at Docket No. R-00973877) as well as the entire record of that proceeding. Testimony in opposition to all or part of the proposed settlement was filed by PECC, MAPSA, MIG and the environmentalists⁵ on September 29, 1997.

By hearing notice dated September 24, 1997, public input hearings were scheduled for Media (on October 9, 1997) and Philadelphia (on October 10, 1997).

On October 7, 1997, Enron Energy Services Power, Inc. ("EESPI") filed with the Commission a Petition for Approval Pursuant to Section 2807(e)(3) of the Public Utility Code to Serve as the Provider of Last Resort in the Service Territory of PECO Energy Company ("Enron Choice Plan") docketed at P-00971265, along with a Motion to Consolidate consideration of that Petition with the restructuring proceeding at R-00973953.

On October 8, 1997 surrebuttal testimony in support of the proposed settlement proceeding was filed by Lance Haver, PAIEUG, PECO and jointly by Senator Fumo, CEPA, TAG, ACORN, and John W. Long, Jr.

On October 9, 1997, the Commission adopted and entered an Order which granted EESPI's Motion to Consolidate consideration of its Enron Choice Plan with the restructuring proceeding and which directed that all relevant issues be developed for Commission consideration at a public meeting to be held on December 11, 1997 (unless PECO voluntarily agreed to an extension).

The public input hearings were held as scheduled. The first was held in Media on October 9, 1997 at 4:00 p.m. There were many attendees; 23 witnesses presented sworn testimony. At the Philadelphia public input hearing, held on October 10, 1997 at 11:00 a.m., many people also were present. Approximately forty witnesses were sworn in and testified.

Technical hearings addressed to the proposed partial settlement were held in Philadelphia on October 14 - 16, 1997. Prior to the start of the hearing on October 14, 1997, a prehearing conference was held to address scheduling and other issues. Prehearing Order #5 dated October 17, 1997, encompassed those procedural matters.

At the technical hearings held on October 14 - 16, 1997, witnesses were presented by PECO, MAPSA, PECC, CEPA and PAIEUG. In addition, Mr. Haver testified. Also, on October 16, 1997, the testimony and exhibits identified on revised Appendix H to the proposed Partial Settlement were admitted into the record by stipulation.

On October 20, 1997, Answers to the Enron Petition were filed by PECO, OCA, OSBA, PAIEUG, Senator Fumo, MAPSA, the "Marketers Group,"⁶ Electric Clearinghouse, Inc. ("ECI"), CNG Energy Services Corporation ("CNG"), and CEPA.

On October 21, 1997, PECO filed a Petition for Clarification/Reconsideration of the October 9, 1997 Order. Also on October 21, 1997, several signatories to the proposed partial settlement (OSBA, OTS, OCA, PAIEUG, Sen. Fumo, CEPA et al, AARP, and Lance Haver) filed a Joint Petition for Reconsideration or Clarification of the October 9, 1997 Order.

Pursuant to Prehearing Order #5, testimony in support of the Enron Petition was filed by EESPI on October 24, 1997. Testimony opposing in whole or in part the Petition was filed on November 7, 1997 by PECO, AARP, CEPA et al., the environmentalists, PAIEUG, and NEV. Responsive testimony was filed on November 12, 1997 by EESPI and PECO.

By separate Orders adopted and entered November 6, 1997, the Commission clarified the scope of the issues to be addressed and the schedule as set forth in the October 9, 1997 Order. PECO on November 10, 1997 responded by letter to the Commission. The schedule was not extended due to the filing of timely objections by Conectiv, NEV and

MAPSA. Therefore, briefs were to be filed and the record certified to the Commission on December 2, 1997.

By Prehearing Order #6 dated November 20, 1997, the Petition to Intervene of Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA) was granted, and PECO's ~~Motion to~~ *Strike the testimony submitted by NEV and the environmentalists* was denied.

Further hearings were held on November 17 - 19, 1997 in Philadelphia. Testimony was admitted into the record, either through stipulation or through adoption by witnesses on cross-examination, on behalf of PECO, OCA, EESPI, the environmentalists, PAIEUG, NEV, CEPA et al., and AARP. NEV's Motion for release of certain financial analysis (Tr. 2096-2131) made by PECO in connection with the proposed partial settlement was granted as the Presiding Officers rejected PECO's claim that the sought-for data was privileged. Tr. 2158-59. However, the Presiding Officers recognized that the documents contained extremely sensitive financial information and directed NEV, PECO, and EESPI to work together to develop a means of getting the information into the record.⁷ EESPI filed brief financial impact testimony on November 25, 1997.

NEV renewed its motion at a conference call held on November 24, 1997, where again the Presiding Officers granted the Motion to the extent that PECO's claim of privilege was rejected but held that the data provided, along with certain stipulations, constituted sufficient compliance in light of the sensitive nature of the data.

Surrebuttal testimony, responding to the rebuttal testimony submitted on July 18, 1997, was filed on November 21, 1997 by OCA, NEV, and PAIEUG. Previously, surrebuttal testimony had been filed by OTS, OCA and the Navy. By agreement of the parties to waive cross-examination, these documents will be admitted into the record by stipulation.

Three sets of Commissioner data requests were served on the parties, with instructions that responses were to be made part of the record in this proceeding. These responses will be admitted into the record as PECO Exh. 8, CEPA Exh. 3, NEV/Conectiv Exh. 1, EESPI Exh. 2 (already admitted into the record) and Exh. 2 (rev), and PAIEUG Exh. 1A.

On November 25, 1997, PECC filed the testimony of David Boonin (PECC St. SR-1) and Paul Reising (PECC St. SR-2). By letter dated November November 26, 1997, PECO moved to strike the testimony of Mr. Boonin's testimony as untimely.⁸ PECO also objected to admission of Mr. Reising's testimony. Mr. Boonin's testimony was withdrawn by agreement of the parties; Mr. Reising's testimony was not admitted. Also, PECO's objection to the admission of Supplemental Exh. 1 to EESPI St. 8-R was denied on November 26, 1997.

In accordance with the Commission's November 6, 1997 Order, briefs are to be filed (both hard copy and electronically) on December 2, 1997 with the Commission's Prothonotary, Law Bureau, Office of Special Assistants and each Commissioner and served on each party of record. Briefs are limited to 45 pages in length, using a font not less than 12 point. Briefs are to contain proposed findings of fact (with specific record references) and proposed conclusions of law, which may be included as an appendix which will not be included in the page count. Any other attachments or appendices will be included in the page count. No reply briefs are permitted.

The record in this proceeding contains a transcript of 2280 pages, as well as the statements and exhibits admitted into the record. This matter is ready for Commission review. Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That admitted into the record of this proceeding are EESPI Exh. 2 (rev), NEV St. DMB 1-S, OCA Sts. 1S, 2S, 3S, 4S, 5SE and 6S, NEV/Conectiv Exh. 1, PECC Exh. 5, CEPA Exh. 3, PECO Exh. 8, PECO Exh. 9, Supp. Exh. 1 to EESPI St. 8-R, OCA Exhs. LS-13 and DCS-11 and PAIEUG St. 1S and Exh. 1A.

2. That the consolidated record at Docket Nos. R-00973953 and P-00971265 is certified to the Commission for its consideration.
