


Dear Governor Ridge,

**SUMMARY OF  
MUNICIPAL INTERVENORS GROUP POSITION  
IN PECO RESTRUCTURING CASE**

**BACKGROUND**

PECO currently charges municipalities that purchase street lighting service under rate SL-E, a "location charge" and certain other "energy charges". The location charge has nothing to do with the amount of electricity used to illuminate the streetlight. The location charge is a per light, per month charge. Rate SL-E municipalities own and maintain the streetlights themselves.

Twenty-seven municipalities have joined the Municipal Intervenor Group. These municipalities pay PECO over \$3,493,707 annually in "location charges". The other "energy charges" paid to PECO by members of the Municipal Intervenor Group is approximately \$506,896. In other words, the municipalities pay about 12.7% of their street light costs for "energy charges" and about 87.3% for "location charges".

PECO's "location charge" is a huge portion of the municipalities' street lighting bill. For reference, attached is an actual bill from Upper Darby Township, one of the participating municipalities in the Municipal Intervenor Group. Upper Darby was billed \$46,196.15 in location charges during the month of October 1997. The municipality's other "energy charges" were \$8,549.56, 15.6% of its total bill. 84.4% of the township's October street light bill had nothing to do with the amount of energy used to illuminate its street lights.

PECO plans to retain the location charge under the restructuring proposal and under its settlement proposal recently filed with the PUC. Municipalities will continue to pay huge "location charges" under PECO's proposals and therefore the Municipal Intervenor Group opposes PECO's proposals. The Municipal Intervenor Group has filed testimony in the PECO restructuring case and has proffered a counterproposal for settlement of the street lighting issue to PECO. PECO has not responded.

**PECO should not be allowed to continue to charge excessive rates for street lighting service to municipalities who own and maintain the lighting facilities.**

- \* PECO has been charging excessive street lighting rates for years. As of calendar year 1996, those rates were providing PECO with a level of profit that was 62% higher than PECO's overall profit from electricity rates.
- \* This case may be the last real opportunity to correct the inequity.
- \* The amount of rate reductions needed to correct the inequity would not be significant

**PECO's proposed "unbundled" rate for street lighting service will not give municipal customers any real opportunity to reduce their electricity bills through participation in the competitive market for electricity.**

- \* More than 80% of the street lighting bill paid by a municipal customer currently is a monthly charge that is not affected by the amount of electricity that a customer consumes. PECO's proposed rate unbundling will not change that situation.
- \* The only savings opportunity that the competitive market will provide is through a charge that is affected by a customer's energy consumption.
- \* Even if a municipal customer was able to save 10% on that energy consumption charge, it only would be able to reduce its electricity bills for street lights by around 1/2 of 1%. That means, if a municipality's bill for street lighting service was \$120,000 per year, competition would reduce the bill by only \$600.




To Whom It May Concern:

Chester City, through discussions with third parties, has recently become aware of the proceeding regarding the restructuring of PECO. To date, a study as to the impact on the City of Chester, has yet to be developed. As a geographic area that has deservedly received special designations as an Enterprise Zone, it should be apparent to the Commission that Chester City indeed has a unique status. Given the current state of the record, it is likely that Chester City will be forced to contribute monetarily to a private enterprise while being denied the opportunity to seek favorable relief of its own and its citizens purchases of electricity.
