


Dear Governor Ridge:

I am writing regarding the Enron and PECO proposals which will be decided upon at the end of the year. I believe it is in the people's best interest to choose the Enron Choice Plan because it will accelerate Philadelphia's move to a competitive energy market which means better service and less money for us, the consumer. 



Dear Mr. Ridge,

I volunteered to participate in Duquesne Light Co.'s pilot program to choose my electric supplier at the first opportunity which was presented. Unfortunately, I was not chosen to participate. I am very anxious to escape from Duquesne Light's excessively high rates.

Much to my dismay, I learned that all customers will not be assimilated into the program until January 1, 2001. To me, this is absolutely ridiculous. In addition I believe that it is discriminatory to allow some customers to pay lower rates while others must continue to pay higher rates.

So far, during your administration, we have been subjected to a gasoline tax increase, a 50% increase in automobile registrations, and a pay increase for a legislature which is too large and, in my opinion, already overpaid. Also, from the size of the budget surplus, it appears that we are being overtaxed. How about a break for the consumer (taxpayer)? Someone in Harrisburg needs to light a fire under the Public Utility Commission (which rarely if ever does anything for the public) and speed up this process. Columbia Gas did it for all of its Allegheny County customers on the same day. How about stepping up to the plate and doing something for the citizens of Pennsylvania!!!!
