Dear Judge Dunderdale:

In accord with the status conference call on Friday, June 21, 2013, concerning the above-captioned complaint proceeding, West Penn Power Company submits a status memorandum describing the vegetation maintenance activities on West Penn's transmission easement on the Complainant's property. The vegetation maintenance activities occurred June 21 following the conference call.

Jerry K. Swink, FirstEnergy Service Corporation's General Supervisor of Transmission Vegetation Management and Nick Weston, a Vegetation Management Specialist employee of Davey Resource Group, along with a Davey Tree work crew, met Marlene Broman on Friday afternoon, June 21, 2013, at her residence at Patterson Road, Butler, Pennsylvania. Mr. Swink confirmed the scope of the work with Ms. Broman as follows: removal of a dead ash tree (Tree K, Exhibit 9), removal of a live white pine tree (Tree H, Exhibit 9) and top trimming of a pin oak tree (Trees F, Exhibit 9) beneath north side conductors of the Cabot to Lawson Junction and Cabot to Bull Creek Junction 138 kV circuits.

Ms. Broman requested that the crew totally remove the east side leader branch of the pin oak and top trim the west side leader branch of the pin oak. Mr. Swink agreed to this request for the pin oak tree but suggested that the crew preliminarily top trim both leader branches and allow Ms. Broman to view before removing the pin oak's east side leader. After preliminary top trimming of both pin oak leaders Ms. Broman again requested removal of east side leader branch of the pin oak.

Work on the pin oak tree was completed to Ms. Broman's request. The dead ash tree and live white pine tree were removed at Ms. Broman's request. Wood and all limbs of ash and white pine trees were removed from the property. Limbs of the pin oak tree were either the chipped or cut into firewood size and stacked.

A photograph of the pin oak prior to topping is attached as Status Report Exhibit No. 1 and a photograph of the pin oak after preliminary topping is attached as Status Report Exhibit No. 2. A photograph of the pin oak with its east side leader removed, as requested by Ms. Broman, is attached as Status Report Exhibit 3.

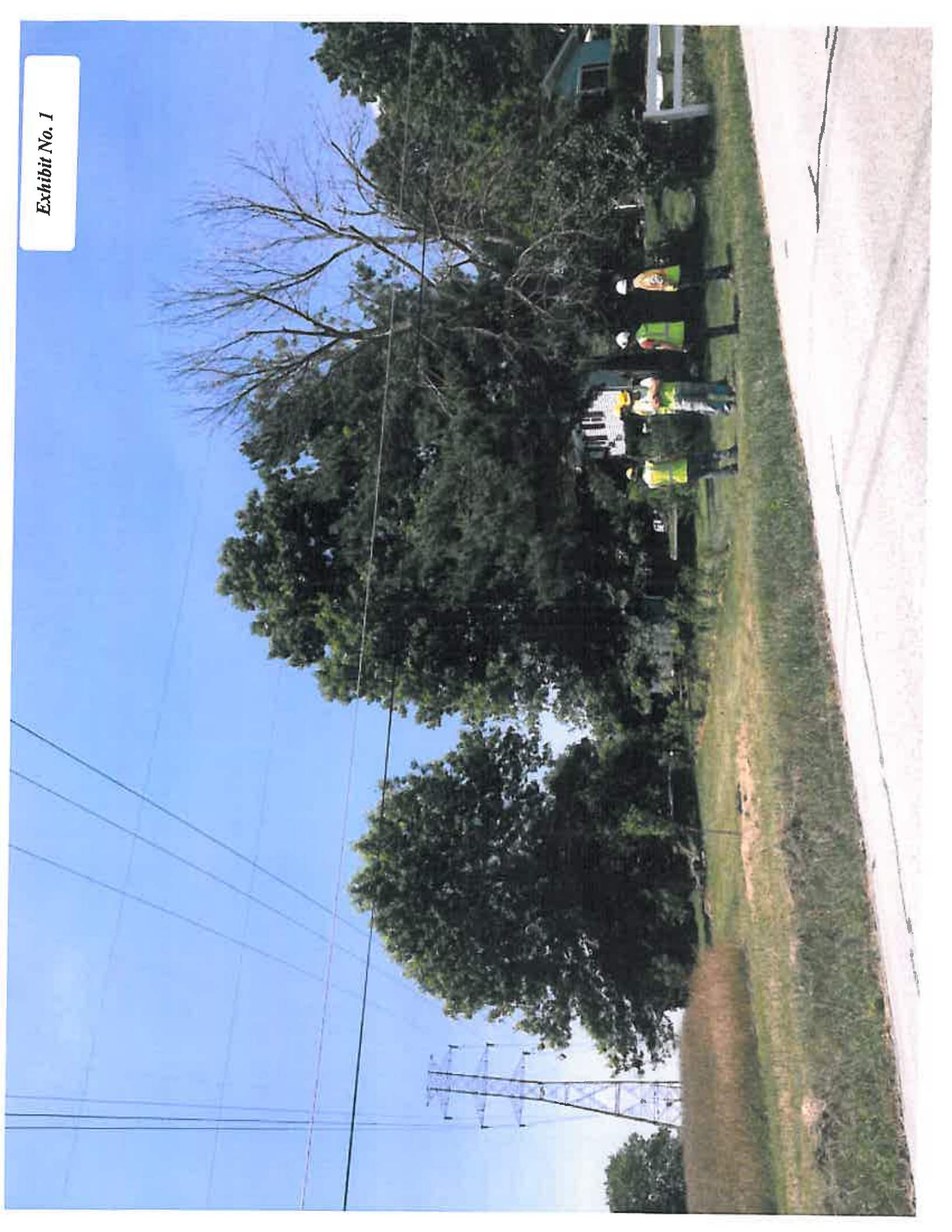
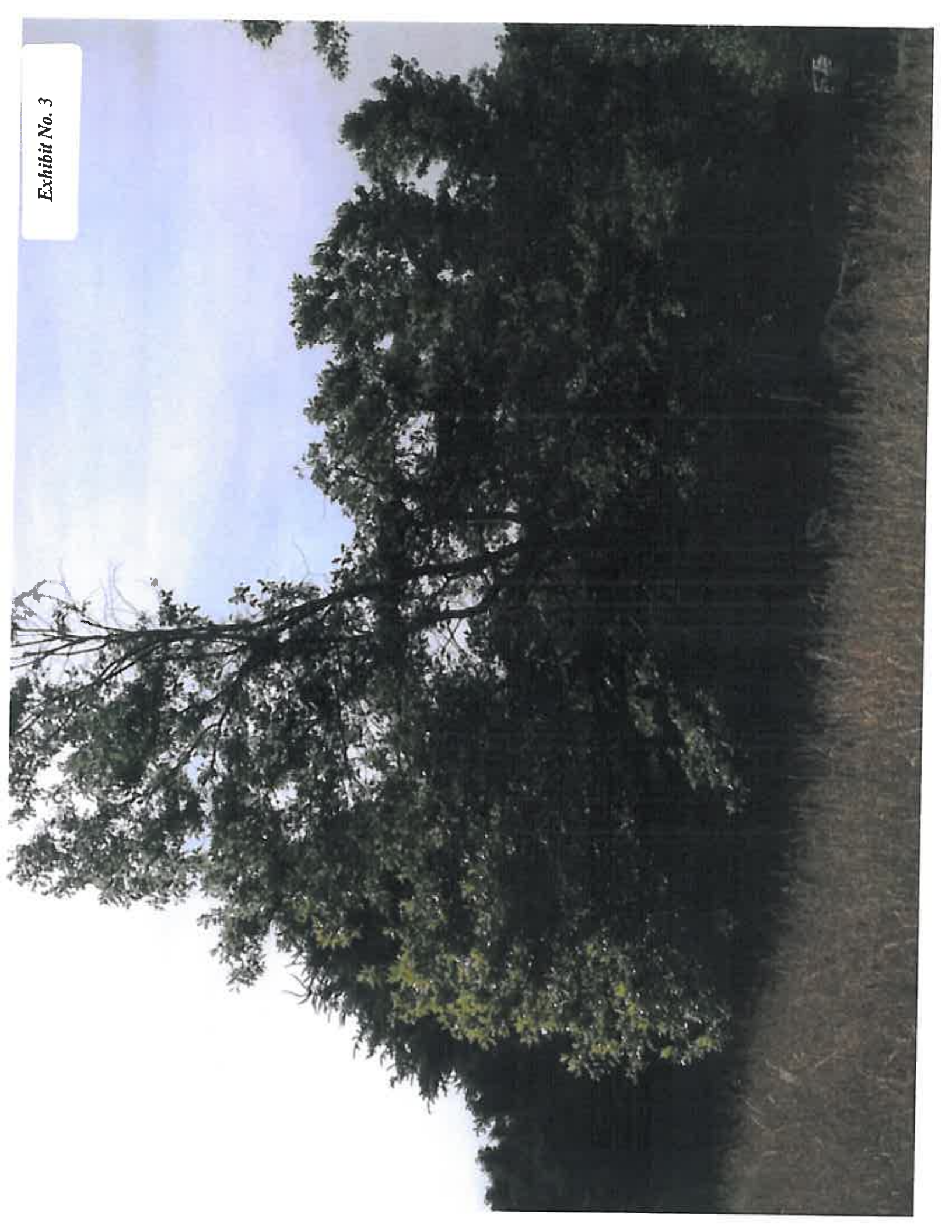


