**MOTION OF PP&L, INC.
FOR ADDITIONAL TIME
FOR SUBMISSION OF A COMPLIANCE FILING**

TO THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

PP&L, Inc. ("PP&L") hereby submits this motion for additional time for submission of a compliance filing. In support of this Motion, PP&L states the following:

1. The Commission entered an Opinion and Order in the above-captioned proceeding on June 15, 1998 ("Order"). In that Order, the Commission addressed the many complex issues that arose during the course of the proceeding. The number and complexity of the issues involved in this proceeding was inevitable given the enormity of the proceeding's purpose, which was to effect fundamental change in the manner in which electric service is provided to all of PP&L's more than 1.2 million customers, under the Electricity Generation Customer Choice and Competition Act, 66 Pa.C.S. Ch. 28 ("Act").

2. In Paragraph No. 15 at page 167 of the Order, the Commission directed that PP&L submit within twenty (20) days after the entry of the Order a compliance filing incorporating all of the numerous conclusions and directives contained in the Order.

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3. Because the Commission's Order was entered on June 15, 1998, the compliance filing would be due on July 6, 1998.^{1/} PP&L requests additional time for submission of the compliance filing for the following reasons:

a. As the Commission is aware, the compliance filing is a difficult, substantial and complex matter. For example, PP&L must develop specific unbundled rates for each of its many rate classes. In addition, PP&L must design different CTCs for each rate class for each year of the transition period. Under any circumstances, completing the compliance filing within the twenty-day period specified in the Order would be a daunting task.

b. The preparation of the compliance filing, however, has been complicated by the presence of several apparent errors in the Order. Examples of errors include the following:

i. The levels of annual kWh sales set forth in Attachment A to the Order are erroneous. Apparently, such annual kWh sales levels exclude sales for street lighting and sales under the several Price Response Service rate schedules

ii. The pretax return used to calculate the effect of the delay in recovery of stranded costs through the CTC during the multi-year transition period was erroneous. Based on the Order, the Commission apparently intended to use 10.86% as the pre-tax return. In making the actual calculations, however, a 10.68% pre-tax return was applied.

^{1/} The filing would be due on July 5, 1998, but that is a Sunday. Under the Commission's rules, the next business day becomes the filing date. 52 Pa. Code § 1.12(a).

iii. For several years of the later years of the transition period, the sum of the Shopping Credit and the CTC exceeds the generation rate cap under the Act.

4. PP&L intends to file a petition for reconsideration in the above-captioned proceeding. It is presently anticipated that such petition will be filed on or about June 25, 1998. In that petition, PP&L intends to point out errors in the Order in addition to those noted above and seek reconsideration of several important issues.

5. Because the Order contains certain mistakes that will affect the compliance filing, preparation of a filing in compliance with the Order would be unproductive because such filing would be made moot as a result of correcting the errors. In addition, matters which PP&L intends to raise on reconsideration include issues that would affect the compliance filing.

6. As will be explained more fully in the petition for reconsideration, PP&L will request that the Commission act upon its petition for reconsideration at its public meeting on July 9, 1998. PP&L asks that it be permitted submit a compliance filing within twenty days of the entry of the order setting forth the Commission's final action on PP&L's petition for reconsideration.

7. By using these procedures, the preparation and submission of the compliance will be a meaningful exercise that will reflect the Commission's order upon consideration of PP&L's petition that will be filed on or about June 25, 1998, and other parties answers thereto.

8. The granting of this extension will not prejudice any other party as there will be ample time before the advent of customer choice for PP&L to submit its compliance filing after the Commission acts on PP&L's *Petition for Reconsideration*.

WHEREFORE, for all the foregoing reasons, PP&L, Inc. respectfully requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission extend the time for submission by PP&L of a filing in compliance with the Commission's Opinion and Order in the above-captioned proceeding entered June 15, 1998 until twenty days after the Commission's final action on PP&L's petition for reconsideration that will be filed on or about June 25, 1998.


