



Dear Mr. Ernst:

Kinney Shoe Corporation supports the application of Pitt-Ohio Express for temporary authority between the western Pennsylvania points indicated on the attached supplement.

Our company ships substantial quantities of freight between points in Pennsylvania. We were recently advised that Breman's Express Company had terminated less-than-truckload general freight operations in areas to and from which we have traffic moving. This fact coupled with the general reduction of the number of carriers available in our area to provide less-than-truckload service has resulted in our not meeting our transportation needs. We know of no other carrier that has the operating authority, equipment, terminal facilities, etc., to adequately meet our transportation needs.

Our company ships the following commodities: shoes and related articles from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania to Franklin, Oil City, Meadville and Erie, Pennsylvania. Each shipment approximates 500 - 1,000 pounds weekly and they move on schedule for delivery the same day of each week.

Our company intends to support the application of Pitt-Ohio Express for permanent operating authority. We have not supported any similar application during the last year.

Kinney Shoe Corporation has an immediate and urgent need for the service of Pitt-Ohio Express. Our company respectfully requests the Commission to grant temporary authority to Pitt-Ohio Express as soon as reasonably possible in order to meet this immediate need for service.
