If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.



I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (Pitt-Ohio or applicant), by the present permanent authority application, seeks authority to provide the following service:

To transport property (excluding commodities in bulk and household goods and office furniture in use), between points in the counties of Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Clarion, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland.

subject to the following conditions (except as presently
authorized):

FIRST: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities which, because of their size or weight require special handling or the use of special equipment. SECOND: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 24,000 pounds.

THIRD: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 10,000 pounds to, from or between points in Beaver County.

FOURTH: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport money, bullion, securities and other valuables, including checks in process and proof work.

FIFTH: That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service from points in Allegheny County to points in the counties of Armstrong, Butler, Clarion, Greene and Indiana and vice versa.

The scope of the permanent authority application is identical to the application for temporary authority which was previously filed and granted on September 16, 1983.

On the basis of the five conditions specified above, all of the protests which were originally filed have been withdrawn, and the permanent authority application is now unopposed.

Applicant now submits its evidence in support of the application consisting of applicant's verified statement, the verified statements of fifty-two (52) supporting shippers which is set forth in separately bound Volume II, and certain supplemental information in support of the application.

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II. EVIDENCE IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION

A. VERIFIED STATEMENT OF CHARLES L. HAMMEL, III ON BEHALF OF APPLICANT

1. Legal Name and Domicile of Carrier.

Applicant is Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (Pitt-Ohio or applicant), a Pennsylvania corporation, with its principal place of business located at 27th and A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, 15222.

2. Identity and Qualifications of Testifying Witness.

My name is Charles L. Hammel, III and I am President of applicant. I have held this position since the company was incorporated approximately four years ago. I am actively involved in the day-to-day operations of Pitt-Ohio and I am thoroughly familiar with its overall operations, facilities, equipment and authority. I am authorized to present this statement to the Commission in support of our company's application for permanent authority at Docket No. A-102471, F. 1, Am-B.

3. Applicant's Affiliation with Other Carriers.

Certain shareholders, officers and directors of the applicant have certain interests in the affairs of Hammel's Express, Inc. (Hammel's).

Charles L. Hammel, III, Robert F. Hammel, and Kenneth W. Hammel own all of the issued and outstanding stock of applicant in equal shares, and they also are the officers and

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directors of applicant. No other person has any ownership interest in or is an officer or director of Pitt-Ohio.

Charles L. Hammel, III, Robert F. Hammel, and Kenneth W. Hammel each also own 12 percent of the issued and outstanding stock of Hammel's, which is a common carrier holding authority from this Commission at Docket No. A-88995. Their father, Charles L. Hammel, Jr. owns 54 percent of the issued and outstanding stock and is President, Treasurer and a Director of Hammel's. Katherine A. Hammel, the wife of Charles L. Hammel, Jr., owns 10 percent of the stock and is Vice President and a Director. Marie A. Hammel, the mother of Charles L. Hammel, Jr., is Corporate Secretary and a Director.

The applicant does not believe that an "affiliated interest" application is necessary, but the parties are prepared to file such an application if required by the Commission.

4. Authority Sought.

The applicant seeks the following permanent authority:

To transport property (excluding commodities in bulk and household goods and office furniture in use), between points in the Counties of Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Clarion, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland.

subject to the following conditions (except as presently authorized):

FIRST: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities which, because of their size or weight require special handling or the use of special equipment.

SECOND: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 24,000 pounds.

THIRD: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 10,000 pounds to, from or between points in Beaver County.

FOURTH: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport money, bullion, securities and other valuables, including checks in process and proof work.

FIFTH: That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service from points in Allegheny County to points in the counties of Armstrong, Butler, Clarion, Greene and Indiana and vice versa.

5. General Scope of Currently Authorized Operations.

Applicant is currently authorized by this Commission to conduct operations within the scope of the present application as described in the preceeding paragraph pursuant to temporary authority granted by the Commission on September 16, 1983, at Docket No. A-102471, F. 1, Am-B.

Applicant is currently authorized to conduct operations as a motor common carrier under authority at Docket No. A-102471, as follows:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, such commodties as are dealt in by retail shoe stores, from the distribution facility of Kinney Service Corp., in the Township of Hampden, Cumberland County, to points in the counties of Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, Lawrence, Armstrong, Westmoreland, Fayette and Washington.

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It is also authorized at Docket No. A-102471, F. 1, Am-A to conduct motor common carrier operations as follows:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from the facilities of USCO Distribution Services, Inc., located in the Borough of McKees Rocks, Allegheny County, to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa;

subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk.
- 2. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use.

Applicant has recently been granted authority at Docket No. A-102471, F. 1, Am-C, to conduct operations as follows:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property for H. J. Heinz Company, U.S.A., between points in Pennsylvania;

subject to the following conditions:

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk.

In addition, applicant is authorized by the Interstate Commerce Commission to transport general commodities (except Classes A and B explosives, household goods as defined by the Commission, and commodities in bulk), between points in 18 eastern states and the District of Columbia at Docket No. MC-30136 (Sub No. 2). The authority extends from Massachusetts in the northeast to Wisconsin and Missouri in the west, and as far south as North Carolina. Under this authority applicant is authorized to provide service between all points in Pennsylvania on an interstate basis.

Copies of the aforesaid PUC certificates and ICC certificates are attached hereto as Exhibits A and B, respectively.

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Duplicating Authority Which Will Result from Grant of Authority.

Pitt-Ohio is not seeking to duplicate authority and has no objection to a restriction that any duplication of authority resulting from the grant of this application may be construed as a single grant of operating authority.

7. Dual Operations Resulting From Grant of Authority.

Approval of this application will not result in any dual operations since applicant does not hold any contract carrier authority from this Commission.

8. Pertinent Terminal Facilities and Communications Network.

Applicant's main office and terminal is located at 27th & A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, PA. This terminal also has office facilities and parking area for vehicles. The terminal itself is a 29-door facility which is jointly used by applicant and one other carrier.

Applicant also maintains a terminal near the Pennsylvania-Ohio state line in the vicinity of Darlington Township, Beaver County, PA and East Palestine, Columbiana County, OH. Applicant leases 16 doors of the complete terminal, as well as office space and a parking area.

Applicant's operation is set up on a direct dispatch system in order to facilitate the providing of equipment and service to customers. After delivery of a shipment, drivers are instructed to call the main terminal for instructions

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concerning the pickup of return loads, if arrangements have not already been made. Applicant maintains direct telephone communications with its customers in order to coordinate the flow of equipment.

9. Pertinent Equipment.

At its Pittsburgh terminal applicant has assigned seven tractors, seven trailers and one straight truck. At its East Palestine terminal it has assigned five tractors, five trailers and 14 straight trucks.

10. Safety Program.

Applicant maintains a complete safety program which is conducted in compliance with the safety regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, the Federal Department of Transportation, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and the Interstate Commerce Commission. Under this program all drivers are investigated and examined prior to employment. Before a driver is allowed to take charge of the road equipment, he must successfully demonstrate his ability to operate such equipment safely. During the time of his employment he is periodically given safety instructions that require him to meet certain high standards of operation. Our program also includes safety meetings at which films are shown and discussions conducted concerning the safe operation of equipment.

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Pitt-Ohio has implemented a preventive maintenance program which requires the checking and servicing of equipment on a regular basis. Every vehicle is given a routine service check every 12,000 miles to insure that it is safe to operate and to avoid possible breakdowns while on the road. We operate a maintenance facility at our main terminal in Pittsburgh which is equipped with two bays for servicing equipment.

Insurance is maintained by Pitt-Ohio in excess of the Commission's requirements.

11. Type of Service Currently Provided to the Supporting Shippers.

As indicated above, the Commission granted temporary authority to applicant to provide the service proposed under the permanent application on September 16, 1983.

Applicant has been providing service pursuant to the temporary authority for approximately 4 months. The applicant has not encountered any substantial difficulties in connection with providing this service, and, in fact, has provided a consistently reliable and responsible transportation service to the shipping public. This fact has been specifically noted in a number of the verified statements of the supporting shippers who have called upon applicant for service pursuant to the temporary authority. In this connection, it is noteworthy that all of the supporting shippers who originally supported the temporary authority application have also supported the application for permanent authority. Furthermore,

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these shippers are merely a representative sampling of the numerous shippers who have called upon the applicant to provide service pursuant to the temporary authority on a regular basis.

In addition, it should be noted that applicant presently provides similar, if not identical, service to the shipping public with respect to interstate shipments pursuant to its ICC authority.

The specific types of service offered are discussed in greater detail in the next paragraph.

12. Type of Service to be Offered.

Pitt-Ohio is familiar with the transportation requirements of the shippers and is experienced in handling their freight. The applicant has been handling such shipments pursuant to its temporary authority, and also pursuant to its ICC authority.

Service will be made available generally on a five day per week basis during normal business hours. In addition, the shippers will be able to obtain pickup and/or delivery service at other than normal business hours Monday through Friday, and on weekends and holidays.

Pitt-Ohio intends to offer a scheduled pick-up and scheduled delivery service to accommodate the needs of the supporting shippers. This will involve making equipment available at the pick-up and delivery points at pre-designated times so as to avoid congestion and facilitate the loading and unloading procedures of both the shipper and the receiver. This service will be made available in connection with both outbound and inbound traffic for the shippers.

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Applicant specializes in the transportation of general freight, particularly in less-than-truckload quantities. This is the type of operation which applicant expects will be requested by the shippers under the proposed service. However, to the extent it is required, truckload shipments will also be handled. Generally, applicant will be able to provide same day and overnight delivery service between the points which are located within the application area.

We will provide the supporting shippers with suitable equipment immediately upon their request for transportation services.

13. Financial Data.

There is attached to my statement as Exhibit C the latest available balance sheet of Pitt-Ohio. Attached to my statement as Exhibit D is an income statement of applicant for the 12-month period ending with the date of the balance sheet.

The financial documents show that Pitt-Ohio is financially able to provide the proposed service. It is not anticipated that any additional equipment will be required in order to meet the needs of the shipping public, but if necessary, the applicant is willing and able to acquire such additional equipment.

14. Feasibility of Operations.

Pitt-Ohio has developed a sound transportation system under its operations as currently authorized by the PUC and

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the ICC. In operating under the temporary authority, vehicles which are delivering freight pursuant to our previously authorized operations at points in Pennsylvania have been available for assignment to handle intrastate traffic within the scope of this application. This has enabled Pitt-Ohio to minimize deadhead mileage. This service is similar to the service which had previously been provided pursuant to its existing intrastate and interstate authority.

The applicant is presently providing service within the scope of the authority sought in this permanent application pursuant to its temporary authority, and has already proven that it is capable of providing the necessary service to the shipping public. This conclusion is supported by the statements of various supporting shippers who have expressed satisfaction with the service of Pitt-Ohio pursuant to the temporary authority in their verified statements, and also by the minimal number of service complaints received by the applicant during temporary operations.

15. Other Information Deemed Pertinent by the Witness.

Applicant believes that granting the permanent authority sought herein is necessary and proper for the accommodation of the public. The temporary authority was granted at least in part because of the general decline in the availability of LTL common carrier service within the scope of the application.

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Under the circumstances, many of the shippers who supported the temporary application indicated that they had been unable to secure the service necessary to meet their transportation needs. The operations of applicant pursuant to its temporary authority have provided much-needed service to the shipping public. The continuing necessity for this service, as well as Pitt-Ohio's ability to provide the service to the shipping public, are best evidenced by the fact that <u>all</u> of the shippers who originally supported the application for temporary authority have also supported this application for permanent authority.

The denial of the permanent application would reinstitute the various shipping problems described by the supporting shippers in connection with the temporary authority application. Specifically, many of the supporting shippers, as well as many other members of the shipping public, would be without any carrier capable of providing the timely, safe, efficient and economical transportation services which the applicant has provided pursuant to the temporary authority.

Finally, it should be noted that this application is unopposed. In view of the substantial number of supporting shippers, there would appear to be no reason why the permanent authority application should not be granted.

For all of the above reasons, Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. respectfully requests that the application for permanent authority be granted in its entirety.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application for temporary authority filed September 6, 1983. An application for corresponding permanent authority was filed March 9, 1983. The permanent authority application was opposed by Breman's Express Company, Milo Express, Inc., Citizen's Transport, Inc., Newcomer Trucking, Inc., Gateway Trucking, Inc., and Moore-Flesher Hauling Company. All protests to the corresponding permanent authority application were withdrawn predicated upon the Commission's acceptance of several restrictions. The unopposed permanent authority application as amended has been assigned for review without hearing. The applicant requests temporary authority. be granted pending disposition of the now unopposed permanent authority application.

The applicant sets forth that it is prepared to provide service in the entire territory requested and has the support of 54 shippers for

this service. The applicant has supplied the names and addressses of 54 shippers who intend to support the applicant for permanent authority.

It is our determination that it is in the public interest to grant temporary authority to the applicant pending disposition of the permanent authority proceeding. It is understood, however, that the grant of this temporary authority as the application was amended shall have no bearing whatsoever on disposition of the permanent authority proceeding. The evidence presented by the 54 supporting witnesses will be examined and any modifications or limitations to the authority will be made based upon the evidence in our order relative to the permanent authority requested.

We find:

1. The applicant has a corresponding application for permanent authority on file with the Commission.

2. All protests to that application have been withdrawn upon the applicant's several restrictive amendments.

3. Approval of temporary authority is in the public interest pending disposition of the amended permanent authority application; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application for temporary authority be and is hereby approved granting the following right:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property between points in the counties of Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Clarion, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland.

subject to the following conditions:

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk and household goods and office furniture in use.

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities which because of their size or weight require special handling or the use of special equipment.

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 24,000 pounds.

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That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 10,000 pounds to, from or between points in Beaver County.

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport money, bullion, securities and other valuables, including checks in process and proof work.

That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service from points in Allegheny County to points in the counties of Armstrong, Butler, Clarion, Greene and Indiana and vice versa.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the temporary authority granted herein is effective upon adoption of this order and shall remain in effect pending final disposition of the application for corresponding permanent authority.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall within ten (10) days of the date of entry of this order file a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the grant of temporary authority in this matter shall have no bearing upon final disposition of the application for corresponding permanent authority.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before ten (10) days from the date of entry of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application for temporary authority shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

By application docketed October 3, 1980, Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc., a corporation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, seeks approval of the transfer to it of part of the rights granted to Hammel's Express, Inc., a corporation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, under the certificate issued at A-00088995, Folder 2.

We find the applicant to be fit to hold a certificate of public convenience and that approval of the application is necessary and proper for the continuation of service to the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application for the transfer of part of the rights held by Hammel's Express, Inc., at A-00088995, Folder 2, be approved and that a certificate be issued to the applicant granting the following right:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, such commodities as are dealt in by retail shoe stores, from the distribution facility of Kinney Service Corp., in the township of Hampden, Cumberland County, to points in the counties of Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, Lawrence, Armstrong, Westmoreland, Fayette and Washington;

subject to the following conditions:

1. That the approval hereby given is not to be understood as committing the Commission, in any proceedings that may be brought before it for any purpose, to fix a valuation on the right to be acquired by applicant from the present certificate holder equal to the consideration to be paid therefor, or equal to any value that may be placed thereon by capplicant, or to approve or prescribe rates sufficient to yield a return thereon.

- 2. That applicant shall not record in its utility account any amount representing the riherein granted, in excess of the actual est of such right to the original holder thereof.
- 3. That the applicant charge to Account 1550, Other Intangible Property, \$1.00, being the amount of the consideration payable by it for the right and going concern value attributable thereto; less any amount re-Corded under condition 2 above.
- 4. That the operating authority granted herein, or now held or subsequently granted to the applicant to the extent that it is duplicative shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.
- 5. That the certificate holder shall comply with all of the provisions of the Public Utility Law as now existing or as may hereafter be amended, and Pa. Code Title 52, Chapter 31, as now existing or as may hereafter be amended, and any other rules and regulations as may hereafter be prescribed by the Commission. Failure to comply shall be sufficient cause to suspend, revoke or rescind the rights and privileges conferred by the certificate.
- 6. That the certificate holder shall not transfer, sell or in any way convey any of its outstanding capital stock to any individual, partnership, corporation or any entity, without the prior filing of an application and approval thereof by the Commission under Section 1102(3) of Title 66, PA C.S.A.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation granted herein until it has complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Law and the rules and regulations of this Commission relative to the filing and acceptance of evidence of insurance and a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission by an application filed on February 26, 1982 and which was advertised in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of March 20, 1982. No protests were received and the record is now certified to the Commission without oral hearing. Verified statements were submitted by the applicant and the supporting shipper.

Robert F. Hammel, secretary of Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (or applicant), states in a verified statement that he is familiar with the day-to-day operations of the company and is authorized to submit evidence on its behalf in this proceeding. The company has its principal place of business located at 27th & A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, Allegheny County. It presently holds common carrier authority from this Commission and the Interstate Commerce Commission. The applicant's main terminal is located in Pittsburgh and a second terminal is maintained in East Liverpool, Ohio. As herein pertinent, the Pittsburgh terminal is equipped with 29 loading and unloading doors and is situated within 10 miles of the supporting shipper's warehouse in McKees Rocks. It has daily contact with the shipper since it does provide it with interstate service.

The operating fleet consists of six tractors, eight trailers and 16 straight trucks, all of which are company-owned with the exception of one tractor and one trailer. The equipment is suitable for handling the traffic involved in the proposed service. A comprehensive safety program is administered on a daily basis and insurance is carried in excess of that required by local and federal regulatory agencies.

In support of its financial position, the applicant submitted an unaudited balance sheet which indicates that as of May 31, 1982, it had current assets of \$258,347, total assets of \$350,653, and current liabilities of \$137,096 with no long-term liabilities, leaving stockholders' equity of \$213,557. An unaudited statement of income for the first five months of 1982 discloses that from operating income of \$751,193, it incurred operating expenses of \$674,678, providing a net operating income of \$76,515. It had accumulated retained earnings of \$163,557.

David A. Giroux is vice president-sales for USCO Distribution Services, Inc. (USCO or shipper), which is headquartered in Middlebury, Connecticut, and as here pertinent, operates a warehouse in McKees Rocks, Allegheny County. The witness states in a supporting verified statement that he is responsible for the company's shipping and receiving functions and is authorized to represent it in this application.

USCO is engaged in the warehousing business and operates about 35 facilities at various large metropolitan areas throughout the country including the McKees Rocks warehouse. The McKees Rocks warehouse consists of about 122,000 square feet and is equipped with 10 docks for loading and unloading. It employs 14 persons who conduct operations from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., five days a week.

The items warehoused can be primarily categorized as hospital service products which include every type of material and supply that a medical facility would use in its daily operations. Everything from band-aids to operating tables, including items such as mops, wheelchairs, crutches, etc., are routinely involved. It is undertaking a new program in its distribution operation to serve medical care facilities in Pennsylvania, including members of hospital groups. Initially, it anticipates there will be three to four less-than-truckload shipments per day with each shipment weighing 1,000 to 2,000 pounds. After the program becomes well-established, it believes there will be a sufficient number of orders available to consolidate into full truckloads at the rate of one or two loads per day.

The inbound shipments will consist of hospital supplies and equipment moving from suppliers throughout Pennsylvania. The volume will depend upon market conditions and the availability of products from local suppliers at competitive prices. USCO is responsible for making inbound delivery arrangements from its suppliers and from the warehouse to its customers, paying the freight charges on all outbound shipments and a substantial portion of the inbound.

An appendix to the verified statement indicates there are over 100 hospital and medical facilities that initially are potential customers located in excess of 50 individual communities. Actually, any point in Pennsylvania having medical facilities is a potential point of destination. Presently, the hospitals and medical facilities are receiving their goods on a shipment-by-shipment basis directly from the manufacturers or suppliers. The purpose of USCO's warehouse operation is to eliminate the necessity for each health care facility receiving numerous small shipments. USCO will consolidate the shipments so that each facility will receive all of its weekly supplies on one delivery.

USCO does not know of any carrier which has the authority as well as the equipment and personnel necessary to implement this new distribution program adequately. It has worked closely with the applicant during the planning stages of the operation and feels confident it can perform satisfactorily.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

USCO Distribution Services, Inc., is in the process of implementing a new warehousing/distribution program within Pennsylvania, specializing primarily in the handling of virtually all types of products associated with the medical care industry. The warehouse is located in McKees Rocks, Allegheny County, and by this application, Pitt-Ohio Express seeks authority for the right to transport property from the warehouse to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa, a service which is crucial to the success of the shipper's contemplated program.

USCO will be providing a complete service to the medical industry which will involve the receiving of supplies inbound from various Pennsylvania vendors, placing them in storage and then filling customer orders which are consolidated for shipment on a weekly basis. USCO will provide the additional service of paying the freight and selecting the carrier on all outbound shipments as it will also do for the majority of the inbound movements. The wide variety of commodities involved coupled with the well-dispersed locations of its customers has convinced us that the applicant's request for the broad statewide authority to transport "property" is appropriate and necessary to meet the shipper's overall needs.

We are equally convinced that the applicant is well-qualified to assume the additional authority and provide a responsive service.

- 3 -

The applicant's Pittsburgh terminal is within very close proximity (10 miles) of the shipper's warehouse, making it particularly advantageous to the establishment of a close working relationship so necessary in distribution programs of this nature. The applicant's finances appear exceptionally sound and it operates the type of equipment required by the shipper.

We find:

1. That the applicant has shown that a public need for the proposed service does exist.

2. That the applicant is fit, ready, willing and able to properly provide the service proposed.

3. That approval of the application is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application be and is hereby approved and that the certificate issued to the applicant on March 4, 1981, be amended to include the following right:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from the facilities of USCO Distribution Services, Inc., located in the borough of McKees Rocks, Allegheny County, to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa;

subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk.
- 2. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation granted herein until it shall have complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Law and the rules and regulations of the Commission relative to the filing and acceptance of a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently

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granted to the applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application filed April 18, 1983. Public notice of the application was given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of June 4, 1983. Protests were filed by Wayne W. Sell Corporation and C. L. Feather, Inc. Both protests were withdrawn upon the applicant's restrictive amendment which excludes the transportation of commodities in bulk.

The now unopposed application, as amended, is certified to the Commission for its decision without hearing. The record consists of verified statements entered by the applicant and its supporting shipper. Robert F. Hammel, secretary of Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (Pitt-Ohio or applicant), set forth in his verified statement that he is involved in the day-to-day operations of the applicant and is thoroughly familiar with its operations, facilities, equipment and authority. He is authorized to present a verified statement. As a preliminary matter, it should be noted that certain shareholders, officers and directors of the applicant have interest in the affairs of Hammel's Express, Inc. and Capp Express, Inc. Both carriers are certificated in Pennsylvania. Pitt-Ohio is authorized by the Commission to operate as a common carrier in Pennsylvania holding two specific grants of authority at this time. In addition, the applicant is certificated by the Interstate Commerce Commission to transport general commodities between points in 18 eastern states and the District of Columbia. There will be no duplicating authority by approval of the instant application nor would a dual operation result.

The applicant operates from a main office in Pittsburgh, Allegheny County. At this location, it maintains office facilities and a parking area for several vehicles. There is a 29-door terminal facility at this location which is jointly used by the applicant, Hammel's and Capp. The applicant also maintains a terminal in Beaver County. This terminal is used to handle virtually all the intrastate and interstate LTL traffic handled by the applicant. A terminal in Paulsboro, New Jersey is equipped to handle both LTL and truckload traffic and is situated to serve eastern Pennsylvania. The applicant's fleet is now comprised of 20 straight trucks, 14 van trailers and 20 tractors. The equipment is subject to a routine maintenance program and is safety inspected on a regular basis.

The applicant has provided service to the supporting shipper in interstate commerce transporting its general commodities between points in the authorized 18 states and the District of Columbia. This traffic is handled on a regular basis in this territory. Pitt-Ohio is familiar with the transportation requirements of the shipper and is experienced in handling its freight. In Pennsylvania, service will be made available on a five-day-per-week basis during normal business hours. In unusual circumstances, the shipper will be able to obtain pick-up and delivery service at other-than-normal business days and hours. The applicant is aware that the supporting shipper is engaged in the production of various foodstuffs which are sold through wholesalers and retailers throughout the Commonwealth. Timely distribution of these products is essential. The applicant will provide Heinz with scheduled pick-up and delivery service to meet its requirements. Multiple pick-up and multiple delivery service will be offered to the shipper. Truckload traffic is expected to move on an overnight basis while less-thantruckload traffic will be overnight or second-day delivery.

As evidence of its financial capacity to render the additional service proposed, the applicant entered a balance sheet and income statement for the year ending December 31, 1982. Pitt-Ohio reports

total current assets of \$256,526, total assets of \$623,478, total current liabilities of \$255,117, and total liabilities of \$283,793. Total revenue of \$1,998,286 produced a net operating revenue of \$166,462 after expenses.

John W. Pinchot, manager of transportation planning for Heinz U.S.A. Division, H. J. Heinz Company (hereinafter shipper or Heinz), set forth in his verified statement that he is responsible to oversee the integration of the Heinz transportation system in order to meet inventory and customer service requirements. He is authorized to support motor carriers for operating authority. Heinz is a major manufacturer of canned and preserved food products. Within Pennsylvania, it has three facilities. It has a manufacturing plant in Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, a customer service center in Pittsburgh which is a full-line warehouse facility and a customer service center-distribution facility at Mechanicsburg, Cumberland County. Outbound shipments are made from these three facilities. In addition, the Pittsburgh, Allegheny County plant receives inbound shipments from other points in Pennsylvania. Commodities such as salt, sugar and bottle caps move into this facility. Within the scope of this application, it is expected the applicant will be tendered at least 40,000 pounds of freight each week. This is a minimum-volume figure and the volume could increase substantially. The outbound traffic from the three Pennsylvania facilities will range from LTL shipments of 2,500 to 19,000 pounds to truckload shipments between 20,000 pounds and 42,000 pounds. Approximately 93 percent of all outbound traffic moves in truckload lots. Shipments move to grocery store chains and distributors, as well as food service customers throughout the Commonwealth.

The applicant will be expected to provide overnight delivery service for truckload traffic. The shipper's normal distribution pattern ivolves a call to a carrier one day for pick-up the next day with delivery overnight. The shipper schedules deliveries to coincide with customer requirements. The applicant will be expected to provide multiple stop-off delivery service. To a lesser extent, split pick-up service is used with shipments moving to the Pittsburgh manufacturing plant. Between October 15 and April 15, equipment must be provided by the motor carrier capable of protecting products from freezing. It is expected the availability of the applicant's service will aid Heinz in meeting its requirements in Pennsylvania.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

The applicant seeks amendment to its common carrier certificate to permit service for one shipper, H. J. Heinz Company between points in Pennsylvania. In response to a protest filed by two carriers, the applicant has excluded the transportation of commodities in bulk. It does not appear the exclusion of bulk commodities will affect either the operations of the carrier or the service required by the shipper.

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Pitt-Ohio handles traffic for the supporting shipper in interstate commerce. By virtue of this service, it is familiar with the requirements of the shipper. It has a suitable fleet of van equipment to provide service and has stated its willingness to provide scheduled pick-up and delivery service and provide overnight service for truckload quantities which is required by the shipper.

The applicant seeks authority to provide service for the shipper between points in Pennsylvania. A grant of authority in this matter will permit the applicant to provide service between the shipper's plant and distribution facilities and from those facilities to its customers. As well, such a grant of authority will permit the applicant to provide inbound transportation of materials and supplies used in the manufacturing process. Although it appears only three shipper facilities are involved, two in Allegheny County and one in Cumberland County, we are inclined to grant a comprehensive between points authority limited to service "for" the shipper. Such a grant of authority will permit the applicant to meet any changing needs of the shipper as they occur. The broad territorial authority was not opposed by any relevant interested carriers. We conclude a grant of such authority is reasonable based upon the information before us.

As the authority is requested concerning the commodities to be transported, we find that the inclusion of property in the commodity description totally encompasses the other portions of the description being food, food products, foodstuffs, supplies, and equipment. In the authority we grant here, we will use the commodity description, "property", with the understanding that it includes food, food products, foodstuffs, supplies and equipment.

We find:

1. The applicant has the experience, equipment and fitness necessary to provide the proposed service, as amended.

2. The supporting shipper desires the service of the applicant to aid it in meeting its distribution requirements in Pennsylvania.

3. Approval of the application, as amended, will permit the applicant to provide a comprehensive transportation service for the supporting shipper.

4. The commodities, food, food products, foodstuffs, supplies and equipment are included within the term "property".

5. Approval of the application, as amended, is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application, as amended, as modified, be and is hereby approved and that the certificate issued March 4, 1981, as amended, be further amended to include the following right:

- 4 -

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property for H. J. Heinz Company, U.S.A., between points in Pennsylvania;

subject to the following condition:

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein, to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the carrier, should not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation granted herein until it shall have complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Law and the rules and regulations of the Commission relating to the filing and acceptance of a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.



NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - UNAUDITED

FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1982 AND 1981

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements of the Corporation are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, consistent with reporting for federal income tax purposes.

Property is recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided for on the straight-line method based upon the estimated useful lives of the assets. Assets acquired after January 1, 1981 are being depreciated according to the new accelerated cost recovery system, as defined in the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981.

NOTE B - LEASE AGREEMENTS

The Corporation leases revenue equipment on a monthly basis with rentals amounting to \$110,438 and \$84,650 for 1982 and 1981, respectively.

The Corporation also leases terminal facilities with rentals amounting to \$15,450 and \$8,050 for 1982 and 1981, respectively. This lease is for a period of 60 months.

NOTE C - COVENANT NOT TO COMPETE

On May 22, 1979, the Corporation entered into a covenant not to compete agreement with Vincent White for a total consideration of \$125,000. \$75,000 of this total was paid on May 22, 1979 with the balance of \$50,000 payable in two equal installments of \$25,000, due January 1, 1980 and January 1, 1981. These payments are without interest. The January 1, 1980 payment was made on December 28, 1979 and the January 1, 1981 payment was made on December 29, 1980. This agreement is being amortized over thirty-six months.

NOTE D - NOTES PAYABLE

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The debt due Martera, Inc. is subject to interest at 8% for 1983.

B. VERIFIED STATEMENTS OF SUPPORTING SHIPPERS

This application is supported by fifty-two (52) supporting witnesses which include many of the largest shippers in the involved territory as well as a large number of smaller shippers and receivers.

Because of their substantial volume, the verified statements of the supporting witnesses have been separately bound in Volume II as Appendix A-1 to these verified statements. A complete list of the supporting witnesses is attached to this volume as Appendix A.

Without discussing in detail here the specific evidence of the supporting shippers, suffice it to say that the verified statements contain all of the information required by the Commission as well as certain supplemental information including the names and qualifications of the witness, general description of the company, the volume and frequency of use which the shipper intends to make of the proposed service, representative points of origins and destinations to and from which the traffic of the shippers move, the nature of the commodities involved, the type of service required by the supporting witnesses and the reasons why the shippers require the proposed service.

Applicant strongly believes that the testimony of the fifty-two (52) supporting witnesses taken as a whole clearly supports the granting of the application in its entirety. As more fully set forth below, the testimony of the supporting

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witnesses indicates that they have traffic moving to and from all of the major points in the application territory as well as a large number of smaller points and that the supporting shippers collectively ship and receive a wide variation of commodities sufficient to amply justify the granting of authority to transport property generally except commodities in bulk and household goods and office furniture in use.

C. ANALYSIS OF REPRESENTATIVE ORIGINS AND DESTINATIONS

As indicated above, the supporting shippers collectively ship and receive a substantial volume of traffic moving to, from and between all of the fifteen counties involved in the application territory.

In that connection, applicant has prepared a detailed analysis of representative origins and destinations to and from which the supporting shippers have traffic moving in each of the involved counties which is attached hereto as Appendix B. That analysis shows a total of 140 representative points throughout the application territory to and from which shippers have traffic moving.

Applicant submits that this analysis demonstrates the broad territorial scope of the traffic controlled by the supporting shippers and evidences the need for a grant of authority to serve the entire application territory.

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D. ANALYSIS OF REPRESENTATIVE COMMODITIES SHIPPED AND RECEIVED BY SUPPORTING WITNESSES

In order to demonstrate the broad range of commodities shipped and received by the supporting witnesses, applicant has prepared as Appendix C a representative list of commodities controlled by the supporting shippers and receivers. The list which contains a total of 94 commodities and commodity groups does not purport to contain all of the commodities shipped or received by the fifty-two (52) supporting witnesses but is merely representative of their collective traffic.

Suffice it to say that the evidence of commodity flow strongly supports the granting of authority to transport property generally.

III. CONCLUSION

For all of the reaons set forth above, the applicant respectfully requests that this application for permanent authority be granted in its entirety.



2. Identity and Qualifications of Witness.

I am Raymond DiPasquale, the Traffic Manager for Allegheny Bindery Corporation and my address is as shown above. I have been the Traffic Manager since 1963 and I have been employed by them for 20 years. As Traffic Manager, my responsibilities include all matters relating to arranging for transportation for Allegheny Bindery. I have been authorized to submit this verified statement in support of the application of Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc., Docket No. A. 102471, F. 1, Am-B.

3. General Description of Company.

Allegheny Bindery is in the business of binding and packaging paper stock which is shipped from our production facility located at 3700 Bigelow Boulevard, Pittsburgh, PA. This plant ships between 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. and we have two loading doors.

4. Volume and Frequency of Intended Use.

If this application is approved, we would tender approximately 100,000 lbs. of LTL shipments per month to Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. This is an average as the volume would vary from month to month. All of these shipments are working the

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scope of the authority sought by Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. and would constitute 90% of our total shipments per month.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

We intend to have delivered from our Pittsburgh facility all of those shipments which are within the scope of the authority sought as listed on a List of Representative Origins and Destinations which is attached to my statement.

6. Type of Service_Required.

Our requirements are such that we have to have scheduled delivery and pickup at our facility and some of our customers require scheduled pickup and delivery. Also, we frequently require expedited delivery service.

7. Similar Applications Supported.

We have not supported any similar applications for operating authority within the past year.

8. Other Evidence in Support of Application.

Over the past several years, there has been a general decline in the availability of service in the area covered by this application, particularly with respect to LTL service. A substantial number of carriers have either terminated LTL service, or have gone out of business altogether. The most recent example of this trend was the termination of LTL service by Breman's Express Company. This trend has resulted in a void in the availability of service in the area which Pitt-Ohio seeks to serve in this permanent application.

periods we sometimes triple these amounts. We will use Pitt-Ohio Express on 90% of these shipments which are covered by the authority sought.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

There is attached to my statement a List of Representative Origins and Destinations which shows that our company ships to a number of the points covered by this application.

6. Type of Service Required.

For purposes of maintaining their inventory, it is necessary for our customers to have scheduled delivery. We have a considerable volume under 5,000 pounds and we need a carrier who has the operating authority, equipment, terminal facilities, etc. necessary to adquately meet our transportation needs.

7. Similar Applications Supported.

Allegheny Toro Distributing has not supported a similar application at any time.

8. Other Evidence in Support of Application.

The general level of available LTL service in the application area has declined in recent years. Numerous carriers have gone into bankruptcy or otherwise terminated their operations, while others which have continued to operate no longer provide LTL service.

Several months ago, Breman's Express Company joined the list of carriers which terminated the LTL operations. We had used Breman's for some time for a considerable volume of

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our shipments. This general loss of available service, and particularly the loss of LTL service, has created problems for us in meeting our transportation needs.

We have recently been tendering most of our freight in this area to Pitt-Ohio under its temporary authority. Also, we have used Pitt-Ohio in the past for interstate shipments as well. Pitt-Ohio has provided the quality transportation services which we require, and we feel that Pitt-Ohio is capable of filling the void created by the decline in available service.

For these reasons, we support Pitt-Ohio Express in their application for permanent authority from the Public Utility Commission.

3. General Description of Company.

Our company ships insulated copper wire or cable and electrical fittings and supplies from our facility in Pittsburgh, PA. Our shipping operations are conducted from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on a five-day per week basis utilizing three loading and unloading doors.

4. Volume and Frequency of Intended Use.

Our facility ships approximately 60 shipments per month, weighing approximately 100,000 pounds. All of these shipments

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are within the scope of the authority sought by Pitt-Ohio and we anticipate that ⁹⁰% of these shipments would be tendered to the applicant if this application is granted.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

There is attached to my statement a list of representative origins and destinations indicating that Gemco ships to points throughout the application area, including points in Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland Counties.

6. Type of Service Required.

We need dependable motor carrier service available and a carrier who has the operating authority, terminal facilities, equipment, etc. necessary to service our accounts.

7. Similar Applications Supported.

We have not supported a similar application.

8. Other Evidence in Support of Application.

In recent years, a number of carriers have either terminated less-than-truckload service or ceased their trucking operations completely in the area covered by this application. The most recent example of this was the termination of LTL service by Breman's Express Company. We used the services of Breman's extensively for some time and we now find that we do not have adequate motor carrier service available.

We have been using Pitt-Ohio under their temporary authority as well as on interstate shipments pursuant to their ICC authority. We are convinced that Pitt-Ohio is

3. General Description of Company.

Gipson Bearing & Supply is engaged in the distribution of bearings, soaps, abrasive cloths, grinding wheels and other related commodities used by steel mills and other manufacturing plants. Our facility in Homestead, PA ships and receives freight from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily using two loading doors.

Volume and Frequency of Intended Use.

Normally, we ship seven shipments per day weighing 5,000 pounds. Our inbound shipments total 15 per Metrici

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weighing approximately 500 pounds. If this application is granted to Pitt-Ohio Express, we anticipate giving them 100% of these shipments.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

There is attached hereto a list of representative origins and destinations, indicating that our company ships to and receives from points throughout the application area.

6. Type of Service Required.

Our business relies on dependability and service. Our requirements are such that we must have scheduled delivery and pickup at our facilities and some of our customers require scheduled delivery. Also, we frequently require expedited delivery service.

Our company ships eight shipments per week totalling 50,000 pounds. All of these shipments are within the scope of the authority sought by Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. and they would ship 80% of the total shipments for us.

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5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

There is attached to my statement a list of representative origins and destinations which shows that our company ships from our facility to a number of the points covered by this application, including Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland Counties.

6. Type of Service Required.

Our company ships and receives substantial quantities of freight between points in Pennsylvania and we have a need for less-than-truckload general freight operations in areas to and from which we have traffic moving. We need a carrier for these areas with the required operating authority, equipment and terminal facilities.

7. Similar Applications Supported.

We have not supported a similar application during the past year.

8. Other Evidence in Support of Application.

Recently, there has been a reduction of carrier available in our area to provide less-than-truckload service. 1. Legal Name and Domicile of Supporting Company.

Heinz U.S.A., division of H.J. Heinz Company, has its main offices at 1062 Progress Street, Pittsburgh, PA 15212.

2. Identity and Qualifications of Witness.

My name is Ronald C. Davis. My business address is 1062 Progress Street, Pittsburgh, PA 15212. I am the Coordinator, Transportation Planning for Heinz. I have been employed by the company for 3 1/2 years and have held my present position for 2 years.

As Coordinator of Transporation Planning it is my responsibility to integrate Heinz U.S.A. transportation matters in order to meet inventory and customer service requirements at a reasonable cost to the company. In order to accomplish this, it is my function, when necessary, to support motor carriers for operating authority.

I have been authorized to submit this verified statement in support of the application of Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. at Docket No. A. 102471, F. 1, Am-B.

3. General Description of Company.

Heinz is a manufacturer of canned and preserved food products such as ketchup, pickles, baby food, private label soups and private label baby foods. Attached to my Death FTFD ment as Appendix 1 is a list of our complete product fither by and JAN17 1984

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Within Pennsylvania Heinz has two pertinent facilities to this application. It has a large multi-line production plant in Pittsburgh at 1062 Progress Street. This facility manufactures many of the products set forth on Appendix 1. In Pittsburgh at 1600 West Carson Street, Heinz has a Customer Service Center which is a full line warehouse facility, containing approximately 250,000 square feet of storage space, that handles all of the products manufactured or distributed by Heinz.

The Pittsburgh plant ships from 6:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., and receives inbound freight from 12:00 noon to 10:00 p.m. The Pittsburgh Customer Service Center ships from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

There are 30 loading and 15 unloading doors at the Pittsburgh plant and 26 doors at the Pittsburgh Customer Service Center.

4. Volume and Frequency of Intended Use.

The outbound traffic from these two Pennsylvania facilities is approximately 982 loads annually ranging from LTL shipments in the 2,500 pound - 19,000 pound range to volume or truckload shipments weighing between 20,000 pounds and 42,000 pounds. Approximately 92% of the total outbound traffic is moved in lots of 40,000 pounds or more. These shipments move to grocery store chains and distributors as well as food service customers such as restaurant chains and suppliers.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

There is attached to my statement as Appendix 2 a list of representative origins and destinations indicating desti-

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nations to which we actually shipped from our two facilities during a representative three (3) month period from July through September of this year. Of course, this is a limited period of time, and we ship to other points as well, but this demonstrates that we ship to virtually the entire application area.

6. Type of Service Required.

It is critically important that Heinz have overnight delivery service in order to meet the requirements of its Heinz' normal distribution pattern involves a customers. call to a carrier on one day, for pickup the next day, with delivery on the third day. Carriers therefore are normally given up to 24 hours advance notice of when shipments will be available to them. They are scheduled in for deliveries and are expected to call the customer for an appointment before attempting delivery. In any event, the time in transit from the time of pickup to the time of delivery is expected to be on an overnight basis. Because of the large volume of traffic Heinz ships and receives daily, it is essential that carriers provide a scheduled pickup service. Because of the necessity of making appointments with customers, the scheduled delivery service is required.

Heinz has a pool truck pricing program in effect which makes multiple stop-off delivery service a daily requirement, particularly in connection with the Customer Service Center. This service center builds loads for multiple stop-off

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deliveries whenever there are reasonably compatible combinations of destinations involved at the same time.

To a somewhat lesser extent, split pickup service is used in connection with the Pittsburgh area plant and Customer Service Center.

Between October 15 and April 15, equipment must be provided by a motor carrier which is capable of protecting many of the products from freezing.

7. Similar Applications Supported.

Approximately 7 months ago, Heinz supported an intrastate application filed by Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. at Docket No. A. 102471, F.1, Am-C which sought authority to transport food, food products, foodstuffs, supplies, equipment and property for H.J. Heinz Company, U.S.A. between points in Pennsylvania. This application is presently pending, but the authority has not yet been granted.

In addition, we supported an application filed by Pittsburgh-Fayette Express, Inc. at Docket No. A. 00100948, F. 1, Am-E which is presently pending.

8. Other Evidence in Support of Application.

In recent years, a number of carriers have either terminated LTL service or ceased trucking operations altogether in the area covered by this application. The most recent example of this trend was the termination of LTL service by Breman's Express Company. We find that we do not have



All of these shipments are within the scope of the authority sought by Pitt-Ohio and we anticipate that 90% of these shipments will be tendered to the applicant if this application is granted.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

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





Our company ships and receives substantial quantities of freight between points in Pennsylvania and we have a need for less-than-truckload general freight operations in areas to and from which we have traffic moving. We need a carrier for these areas with required operating authority, equipment, terminal facilities, etc.

7. Similar Applications Supported.

Midland-Ross has not supported any similar application during the last year.

8. Other Evidence in Support of Application.

1. Legal Name and Domicile of Supporting Company.

2. Identity and Qualifications of Witness.

I am Lester Neilly, the President of Neilly Canvas Goods Company and my address is as noted above. I have been with the company for seven years and have been its President since 1976. Neilly Canvas ships nylon, canvas and neoprene tarpaulins used by railroads, truckers, construction companies and industry to cover their materials from the weather. We ship from our Pittsburgh facility during the hours of BOCKE to 4:30 p.m. utilizing one loading door.

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4. Volume and Frequency of Intended Use.

Our company ships approximately 10 shipments per weighing from 70 pounds to 1,000 pounds each to the points covered by the application. If Pitt-Ohio Express is granted

the authority, we will use their services on 100% of these shipments.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

Attached is a list of origins and destinations which shows that we ship to a number of counties in the application area including Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland Counties.

6. Type of Service Required.

Neilly Canvas Goods is not a large shipper. However, we have frequent deliveries which are extremely urgent. Normally, we process our goods for same day shipping and require overnight service. We therefore must have a reliable and dependable carrier.

7. Similar Applications Supported.

Neilly Canvas has not supported a similar application in the past year.

8. Other Evidence in Support of Application.

In recent years, a number of carriers have either terminated their less-than-truckload service or ceased trucking operations all together in the area covered by this application. With Breman's Express Company terminating their services, there is a further reduction in the number of carriers available in our area. We had used Breman's in the past and now find that the present motor carrier service is inadequate.

2. Identity and Qualifications of Witness.

My name is John R. Rihn and I am the Traffic Manager for Neville Chemical Company. My business address is as noted above. I have been employed by Neville for 15 years and I have held my present position since 1982. Part of my responsibility in this position is the handling of our transportation needs.

I have been authorized to submit this verified statement in support of the application of Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. at Docket No. A. 102471, F. 1, Am-B.

3. General Description of Company.

Neville Chemical Company ships synthetic resins which are described as resin coal tar, chlorinated paraffin and chemicals from our facility in Neville Island. This facility ships between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m. daily and has six loading doors.

4. Volume and Frequency of Intended Use.

On a monthly basis, we ship approximately 5,000 pounds to Erie County, covering three shipments. Our total volume reaches approximately 5,000 pounds to Indiana and DO

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Butler Counties covering approximately three shipments. Our total shipments to the application area for this period would be approximately ten, with an estimated weight of 30,000 pounds. Neville Chemical anticipates that 80% of these shipments would be tendered to the applicant if this application is granted.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

I have attached to my statement a list of representative origins and destinations indicating that our company ships to many points throughout the application area including points in Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland Counties.

6. Type of Service Required.

Neville Chemical's less-than-truckload shipments to the application area are in substantial quantities.
