

APPLICANT'S VERIFIED STATEMENTS

I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

By application published in the <u>Pennsylvania Bulletin</u> on June 4, 1983, Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (Pitt-Ohio or applicant) seeks authority as a common carrier by motor vehicle, over irregular routes, to provide the following service, as amended:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, food, food products, food stuffs, supplies, equipment and property (except commodities in bulk) for H. J. Heinz Company, U.S.A., between points in Pennsylvania.

The application was originally protested by Wayne W. Sell Corporation and C. L. Feather, Inc. but those protests were withdrawn by their attorney by letter dated July 14, 1983 on the basis of the amendment excluding the transportation of commodities in bulk. In view of the unopposed nature of the application the Commission then assigned the case for review without an oral hearing.

Applicant now submits its verified statements in support of the application.

II. VERIFIED STATEMENT OF ROBERT F. HAMMEL ON BEHALF OF APPLICANT

1. Legal Name and Domicile of Carrier.

Applicant is Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (Pitt-Ohio or applicant), a Pennsylvania corporation, with its principal place of business located at 27th & A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, PA 15222.

2. Identity and Qualifications of Testifying Witness.

My name is Robert F. Hammel and I am Secretary of applicant. I have held this position since the company was incorporated approximately four years ago. I am actively involved in the day-to-day operations of Pitt-Ohio and I am thoroughly familiar with its overall operations, facilities, equipment and authority. I am authorized to present this statement to the Commission in support of our company's application pending at Docket No. A. 102471, F. 1, Am-C.

3. Applicant's Affiliation with Other Carriers.

Certain shareholders, officers and directors of applicant have certain interests in the affairs of Hammel's Express, Inc. (Hammel's), and certain other shareholders, officers and directors of Hammel's have certain interests in the affairs of Capp Express, Inc. (Capp).

A. Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc.

Charles L. Hammel, III owns 33 1/3 percent of the issued and outstanding stock and is President and a Director. Robert F. Hammel owns 33 1/3 percent of the stock and is Secretary-Treasurer and a Director. Kenneth W.



Hammel owns 33 1/3 percent of the stock and is Vice President and a Director. No other person has any ownership interest in or is an officer or director of Pitt-Ohio.

B. Hammel's Express, Inc.

Charles L. Hammel, III, Robert F. Hammel and Kenneth W. Hammel each own 12 percent of the issued and outstanding stock of Hammel's which is a motor common carrier that holds authority from this Commission at Docket No. A. 88995.

Charles L. Hammel, Jr. owns 54 percent of the issued and outstanding stock and is President, Treasurer and a Director. Katherine A. Hammel, the wife of Charles L. Hammel, Jr., owns 10 percent of the stock and is Vice President and a Director. Marie A. Hammel, the mother of Charles L. Hammel, Jr., is Corporate Secretary and a Director.

The affiliation between applicant and Hammel's is based on the fact that the three shareholders in the applicant also hold minority stock interests in Hammel's.

C. Capp Express, Inc.

Charles L. Hammel, Jr. owns 54 percent of the issued and outstanding stock and is President, Treasurer and a Director. Katherine A. Hammel owns 10 percent of the issued and outstanding stock and is Secretary and a Director. Marie A. Hammel is the Vice President and a Director. Charles L. Hammel, III, Robert F. Hammel and Kenneth W. Hammel each own 12 percent of the issued and outstanding stock of Capp.

The affiliation between applicant and Capp is based on the fact that the three shareholders of applicant also hold minority stock interests in Capp. There may also be an indirect affiliation based on the fact that Charles L. Hammel, Jr. and Katherine A. Hammel both are shareholders, officers and directors of Hammel's and Capp in which their three sons each have minority stock interests.

4. Authority Sought.

By this application, as initially filed, applicant sought common carrier authority as follows:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, food, food products, food stuffs, supplies, equipment and property, for H. J. Heinz Company, U.S.A., between points in Pennsylvania.

As amended, applicant seeks the above authority but has restricted its request so as to exclude the transportation of commodities in bulk. The amended scope of the application is as set forth in the preceding Statement of the Case.

5. General Scope of Currently Authorized Operations.

Applicant is currently authorized by this Commission to conduct operations in Pennsylvania as a motor common carrier under authority at Docket No. A. 102471, as follows:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, such commodities as are dealt in by retail shoe stores, from the distribution facility of Kinney Service Corp., in the Township of Hampden, Cumberland County, to points in the Counties of Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, Lawrence, Armstrong, Westmoreland, Fayette and Washington.

It is also authorized at Docket No. A. 102471, F.1,

Am-A to conduct motor common carrier operations as follows:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from the facilities of USCO Distribution Services, Inc., located in the Borough of McKees Rocks, Allegheny County, to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa;

subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk.
- 2. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use.

In addition, applicant is authorized by the Interstate Commerce Commission to transport general commodities (except Classes A and B explosives, household goods as defined by the Commission, and commodities in bulk), between points in 18 eastern states and the District of Columbia at Docket No. MC-30136 (Sub-No. 2). The authority extends from Massachusetts in the northeast to Wisconsin and Missouri in the west, and as far south as North Carolina. Under this authority applicant is authorized to provide service between all points in Pennsylvania on an interstate basis.

6. Duplicating Authority Which Will Result From Grant of Authority.

Applicant does not hold any permanent authority to provide service for the supporting shipper and will not receive any duplicating authority as a result of a grant of this application.

7. Dual Operations Resulting From Grant of Authority.

Approval of this application will not result in any dual operations since applicant does not hold any contract carrier authority from this Commission.

8. Pertinent Terminal Facilities and Communications Network.

Applicant's main office is located at 27th & A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, PA. At this location it maintains office facilities and has a parking area for several vehicles. There is a 29 door terminal facility at this location which is jointly used by Hammel's and Capp. Applicant's use of the terminal facilities for freight handling purposes is essentially limited to the use of the dock facilities to interline traffic with other motor carriers. Applicant itself does not conduct any dock handling operations of freight at Pittsburgh in the sense that vehicles are unloaded, the freight worked over the dock, and then reloaded on other of applicant's vehicles.

Applicant also maintains a terminal near the PennsylvaniaOhio state line in the vicinity of Darlington Township, Beaver
County, PA and East Palestine, Columbiana County, Ohio. Applicant refers to this as its East Palestine, Ohio terminal.

Applicant leases 16 doors of the complete terminal, as well as office space and a parking area. This terminal is used to handle virtually all of the intrastate and interstate lessthan-truckload traffic handled by the applicant.

Applicant also maintains an eight door terminal in Paulsboro, New Jersey. That terminal is equipped to handle both LTL and truckload traffic, and is situated so as to serve the eastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware areas.

Applicant's operation is set up on a direct dispatch system in order to facilitate the providing of equipment and service to customers. After delivery of a shipment drivers are instructed to call the main office for

instructions concerning the pickup of return loads, if arrangements have not already been made. Applicant maintains direct telephone communications with its customers in order to coordinate the flow of equipment. Pitt-Ohio maintains almost daily contact with the supporting shipper and will be able to provide service to it on short notice and in an efficient manner.

9. Pertinent Equipment.

There is attached to my statement as Appendix 1 a list of the equipment operated by the applicant. The Appendix indicates for each piece of equipment the company number, year, make, registration number, whether owned or leased, and the original cost of the equipment. All of the leased equipment is leased by applicant from Martera, Inc. which is an equipment leasing company whose stock is owned by Charles L. Hammel, Jr. (54%), Katherine A. Hammel (10%), and their three daughters, my sisters, (each 12%).

The company operates 20 straight trucks (identified by an asterisk next to the company number), 14 closed van trailers (the T series equipment), and 20 tractors.

10. Safety Program.

Applicant maintains a complete safety program which is conducted in compliance with the safety regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, the Federal Department of Transportation, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and the Interstate Commerce Commission. Under this program all drivers are investigated and examined prior to employment. Before a driver is allowed to take

charge of the road equipment, he must successfully demonstrate his ability to operate safely such equipment.

During the time of his employment he is periodically given safety instructions that require him to meet certain high standards of operation. Our program also includes safety meetings at which films are shown and discussions conducted concerning the safe operation of equipment.

Pitt-Ohio has implemented a preventive maintenance program which requires the checking and servicing of equipment on a regular basis. Every vehicle is given a routine service check every 12,000 miles to insure that it is safe to operate and to avoid possible breakdowns while on the road. We operate a maintenance facility at our main terminal in Pittsburgh which is equipped with two bays for servicing equipment.

Insurance is maintained by Pitt-Ohio in excess of the Commission's requirements.

11. Type of Service Currently Provided to the Supporting Shipper.

Applicant does not hold any authority currently from this Commission to provide service for the supporting shipper. However, Pitt-Ohio is authorized pursuant to its interstate certificate to transport general commodities for Heinz between all points in 18 states and the District of Columbia. Interstate shipments are being handled for Heinz on a regular basis within this authorized territory.

12. Type of Service to be Offered.

Pitt-Ohio is familiar with the transportation requirements of the shipper and is experienced in handling its freight. Service will be made available generally on a five day per week basis during normal business hours. In unusual circumstances the shipper will be able to obtain pickup and/or delivery service at other than normal business hours Monday through Friday, and on weekends and holidays.

Pitt-Ohio is aware that since the supporting shipper is engaged in the production of various food stuffs which are sold through various wholesalers and retailers throughout Pennsylvania, the timely distribution of the products is essential to its operations. Pitt-Ohio intends to provide Heinz with a scheduled pickup and scheduled delivery service. This will involve making equipment available at the pickup and delivery points at predesignated times so as to avoid congestion, and facilitate the loading and unloading procedures of both the shipper and the receiver. This service will be made available in connection with both outbound and inbound traffic for the shipper.

Pitt-Ohio intends to make available to Heinz a split pickup service involving any combination of its facilities as the need may arise. It will also provide a multiple stop-off delivery service to any compatible combination of destinations.

Insofar as truckload traffic is concerned, applicant intends to provide an overnight delivery service between any two points in Pennsylvania. On less-than-truckload traffic, it proposes to provide as a general rule an overnight delivery service between points which are located within approximately 150 miles of eachother, and a second day delivery service for all the other points.

Depending upon the nature of the commodity involved, applicant will make available to the supporting shipper refrigerated and heated trailers in order to protect the commodities from damage due to weather conditions. Applicant intends to conti-ue working closely with the supporting shipper and will make whatever adjustments are necessary in its service from time to time in order to meet any changing needs of the shipper in the future.

13. Financial Data.

There is attached to my statement as Appendix 2 the comparative financial statements of the applicant for calendar years 1981 and 1982 which are the latest available. The balance sheet portion of the financial statement shows that the total shareholders' equity more than doubled from December 31, 1981 to December 31, 1982. It also shows that in both years the company operated at a profit and that in 1982 its income from freight revenue increased by approximately 33% and that its retained earnings almost tripled. Because of the growth of the company additional commitments in equipment and terminal facilities were incurred in 1982.

The financial documents show that Pitt-Ohio is financially able to provide the proposed service. It does not anticipate that any additional equipment, facilities or employees will be necessary to serve Heinz.

14. Feasibility of Operations.

As illustrated by the statement of the supporting shipper, it has a greater volume of traffic outbound to points in Pennsylvania than inbound to its facilities from suppliers and vendors. To that extent, the operations encompassed by the authority here proposed will not be totally in balance on a load for load basis. However, applicant does hold extensive interstate operating authority and is currently generating interstate freight throughout Pennsylvania. Therefore, vehicles which are delivering freight for the supporting shipper at points in Pennsylvania will be available for assignment to handle interstate traffic so as to eliminate to the greatest extent possible any deadhead mileage. Likewise, on inbound shipments it will not be necessary to dispatch empty equipment to a distant point for pickup. Applicant instead will use equipment which is terminated in the vicinity of the shipper of the inbound traffic and that equipment will be used to handle the freight inbound to the supporting shipper. In that way, maximum utilization will be made of the equipment and empty miles will be kept to an absolute minimum. It is in applicant's best interests from the standpoint of efficiency and economy to conduct its operations in such a way that empty mileage is kept to an absolute minimum.



FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1982 AND 1981

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements of the Corporation are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, consistent with reporting for federal income tax purposes.

Property is recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided for on the straight-line method based upon the estimated useful lives of the assets. Assets acquired after January 1, 1981 are being depreciated according to the new accelerated cost recovery system, as defined in the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981.

NOTE B - LEASE AGREEMENTS

The Corporation leases revenue equipment on a monthly basis with rentals amounting to \$110,438 and \$84,650 for 1982 and 1981, respectively.

The Corporation also leases terminal facilities with rentals amounting to \$15,450 and \$8,050 for 1982 and 1981, respectively. This lease is for a period of 60 months.

NOTE C - COVENANT NOT TO COMPETE

On May 22, 1979, the Corporation entered into a covenant not to compete agreement with Vincent White for a total consideration of \$125,000. \$75,000 of this total was paid on May 22, 1979 with the balance of \$50,000 payable in two equal installments of \$25,000, due January 1, 1980 and January 1, 1981. These payments are without interest. The January 1, 1980 payment was made on December 28, 1979 and the January 1, 1981 payment was made on December 29, 1980. This agreement is being amortized over thirty-six months.

NOTE D - NOTES PAYABLE

The debt due Martera, Inc. is subject to interest at 8% for 1983.

Pursuant to regulation 1.248-1(c), the Corporation elects to amortize organizational expenses over a sixty-month period beginning with May 1, 1979. Organizational expenses amounted to \$1,173.

NOTE F - FRANCHISES

The Corporation is writing off the cost of the Interstate Commerce Commission operating rights resulting from the enactment of the Motor Carrier Act of 1980 and the deregulation of motor carriers. This is being done over a sixty-month period beginning with July 1, 1980.

III. VERIFIED STATEMENT OF JOHN W. PINCHOT FOR HEINZ USA DIVISION, H. J. HEINZ COMPANY

1. Legal Name and Domicile of Supporting Company.

Heinz USA Division, H. J. Heinz Company has its main offices at 1062 Progress Street, Pittsburgh, PA 15212.

2. Identity and Qualifications of Witness.

My name is John W. Pinchot. My business address is 1062 Progress Street, Pittsburgh, PA 15212. I am the Manager, Transportation Planning for Heinz. I have been employed by the company for 17 years and have held my present position for ten years.

As Manager of Transportation Planning it is my responsibility to oversee the integration of the Heinz USA transportation system in order to meet inventory and customer service requirements at a reasonable cost to the company. In order to accomplish these aims it is my function, when necessary, to support motor carriers for operating authority.

I have been authorized to submit this verified statement in support of the application of Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. at Docket No. A. 102471, Folder 1, Am-C.

3. General Description of Company.

Heinz is a manufacturer of canned and preserved food products such as ketchup, pickles, baby food, private label soups and private label baby foods. Attached to my statement as Appendix 1 is a list of the complete product line of Heinz

Within Pennsylvania Heinz has three pertinent facilities. It has a manufacturing plant in Pittsburgh at 1062 Progress Street. This facility manufactures many of the products set forth on Appendix 1. In Pittsburgh at 1600 West Carson Street Heinz has a Customer Service Center which is a full line warehouse facility that handles all of the products manufactured or distributed by Heinz.

It also has a Customer Service Center located at 300 West Heinz Street, Mechanicsburg, PA.

The Pittsburgh Customer Service Center is a warehouse containing approximately 250,000 square feet of storage space. The Mechanicsburg Customer Service Center is a similar type facility which serves the central and eastern portion of Pennsylvania.

The Pittsburgh plant ships from 6:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., and receives inbound freight from Noon to 10:00 p.m. The Pittsburgh Customer Service Center ships from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. The Mechanicsburg Customer Service Center ships from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

There are 30 loading and 15 unloading doors at the Pittsburgh plant, 26 doors at the Pittsburgh Customer Service Center, and 28 doors at the Mechanicsburg Customer Service Center.

In addition to making outbound shipments of the commodities shown on Appendix 1, the Pittsburgh plant receives inbound shipments from other points in Pennsylvania of salt, sugar and bottle caps.

4. Volume and Frequency of Intended Use.

Upon approval of this application, the applicant will be tendered at least 40,000 pounds of freight each week. This is a minimum volume figure and could fluctuate drastically as a result of the large volume of freight which Heinz has moving between points in Pennsylvania, as described in greater detail in the next section of this statement.

5. Specific or Representative Origins and Destinations.

The outbound traffic from our three Pennsylvania facilities ranges from LTL shipments in the 2,500 pound-19,000 pound range to volume or truckload shipments weighing between 20,000 pounds and 42,000 pounds. Approximately 93% of the total outbound traffic is moved in lots of 40,000 pounds or more. These shipments move to grocery store chains and distributors as well as food service customers such as restaurant chains and suppliers.

There is attached to my statement as Appendix 2 a list of representative points in Pennsylvania to which our three facilities make shipments. Also shown on Appendix 2 are the annual number of truckloads to each point and the approximate total volume to each point in pounds.

As shown by Appendix 2, the Pittsburgh manufacturing plant ships to customers throughout the state including a sizable volume of traffic to the Mechanicsburg Customer Service Center. The total volume from the manufacturing plant consists of approximately 1,356 truckloads which weigh in excess of 57,000,000 pounds.

The Pittsburgh Customer Service Center ships to points throughout western Pennsylvania and its annual volume is approximately 300 truckloads weighing a cumulative 12,500,000 pounds.

The Mechanicsburg Customer Service Center, which I previously indicated serves primarily the eastern part of Pennsylvania, annually makes approximately 800 truckloads weighing a total of approximately 32,000,000 pounds.

The total outbound volume from these three facilities to points in Pennsylvania is therefore in excess of 100,000,000 pounds a year. Heinz would have no difficulty in tendering to the applicant at least 40,000 pounds of freight each week.

The inbound shipments to Pittsburgh are all truckload shipments weighing between 40,000 and 43,000 pounds each. Inbound traffic amounts to approximately 15 truckloads and 649,000 pounds of salt each year from Clarks Summit; about 42,000 pounds of sugar each year from Philadelphia; and approximately 47 truckloads of bottle caps weighing 1,900,000 pounds annually from Hazelton.

Type of Service Required.

It is critically important that Heinz have overnight delivery service in order to meet the requirements of its customers. Heinz' normal distribution pattern involves a call to a carrier on one day, for pickup the next day, with delivery on the third day. Carriers therefore are normally given up to 24 hours advance notice of when shipments will be available to them. They are scheduled in for deliveries and are expected to call the customer for an appointment

before attempting delivery. But in any event, the time in transit from the time of pickup to the time of delivery is expected to be on an overnight basis. Because of the large volume of traffic Heinz ships and receives daily it is essential that carriers provide a scheduled pickup service. And because of the necessity of making appointments with customers, a scheduled delivery service is required.

Heinz has a pool truck pricing program in effect which makes multiple stop-off delivery service a daily requirement, particularly in connection with the two Customer Service Centers. These two service centers build loads for multiple stop-off deliveries whenever there are reasonably compatible combinations of destinations involved at the same time.

To a somewhat lesser extent, split pickup service is used in connection with the Pittsburgh area plant and Customer Service Center.

Between October 15 and April 15 equipment must be provided by a motor carrier which is capable of protecting many of the products from freezing.

7. Similar Applications Supported.

Approximately 11 months ago Heinz supported an intrastate application filed by Hammel's Express, Inc. at Docket No. A. 88995, Folder 2, Am-F which sought authority to transport property insofar as Heinz is concerned from the two Pittsburgh area facilities to points in Pennsylvania on and east of U. S. Highway 15, and vice versa. It is

my understanding that the Hammel's application is awaiting an initial decision by the Administrative Law Judge assigned to the case and that that application proceeding may not be concluded for some time.


