

We enclose for filing the original and two (2) copies of a temporary authority application on behalf of Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. The Commission's records will show that all opposition to the permanent application has been withdrawn. 

APPLICANT'S VERIFIED STATEMENT

I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (Pitt-Ohio or applicant), by the present temporary authority application seeks authority to provide the following service:

To transport property (excluding commodities in bulk and household goods and office furniture in use), between points in the counties of Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Clarion, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland.

subject to the following conditions (except as presently authorized):

FIRST: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities which, because of their size or weight require special handling or the use of special equipment.

SECOND: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 24,000 pounds.

THIRD: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 10,000 pounds to, from or between points in Beaver County.

FOURTH: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport money, bullion, securities and other valuables, including checks in process and proof work.

FIFTH: That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service from points in Allegheny County to points in the counties of Armstrong, Butler, Clarion, Greene and Indiana and vice versa.

The scope of the enclosed temporary authority application is identical to the application for permanent authority filed by Pitt-Ohio at Docket No. A-00102471, F.1, Am-B. The aforesaid permanent authority application is now unopposed and it is anticipated that the case will be submitted to the Commission for disposition without oral hearing.

The primary reasons for the present temporary authority application are the recent termination by Breman's Express Company of LTL service within the application area, together with the general unavailability of LTL service in the application area resulting from the reduction in the number of carriers providing such service.

Applicant now submits its verified statement in support of the application.

II. VERIFIED STATEMENT OF CHARLES L. HAMMEL, III ON BEHALF OF APPLICANT

1. Legal Name and Domicile of Carrier.

Applicant is Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (Pitt-Ohio or applicant), a Pennsylvania corporation, with its principal place of business located at 27th & A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, 15222.

2. Identify and Qualifications of Testifying Witness.

My name is Charles L. Hammel, III and I am President of applicant. I have held this position since the company was incorporated approximately four years ago. I am actively involved in the day-to-day operations of Pitt-Ohio and I am thoroughly familiar with its overall operations, facilities, equipment and authority. I am authorized to present this statement to the Commission in support of our company's application for temporary authority in connection with the permanent authority application pending at Docket No. A-102471, F.1, Am-B.

3. Authority Sought.

The applicant seeks the following temporary authority:

To transport property (excluding commodities in bulk and household goods and office furniture in use), between points in the counties of Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Clarion, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland.

subject to the following conditions (except as presently authorized):

FIRST: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities which, because of their size or weight require special handling or the use of special equipment.

SECOND: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 24,000 pounds.

THIRD: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport iron and steel and iron and steel articles and refractories in single shipments weighing more than 10,000 pounds to, from or between points in Beaver County.

FOURTH: That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport money, bullion, securities and other valuables, including checks in process and proof work.

FIFTH: That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service from points in Allegheny County to points in the counties of Armstrong, Butler, Clarion, Greene and Indiana and vice versa.

4. General Scope of Currently Authorized Operations.

Applicant is currently authorized by this Commission to conduct operations in Pennsylvania as a motor common carrier under authority at Docket No. A. 102471, as follows:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, such commodities as are dealt in by retail shoe stores, from the distribution facility of Kinney Service Corp., in the Township of Hampden, Cumberland County, to points in the Counties of Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, Lawrence, Armstrong, Westmoreland, Fayette and Washington.

It is also authorized at Docket No. A. 102471, F.1, Am-A to conduct motor common carrier operations as follows:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from the facilities of USCO Distribution Services, Inc., located in the Borough of McKees Rocks, Allegheny County, to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa;

subject to the following conditions:

- That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk.
- 2. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use.

In addition, applicant is authorized by the Interstate Commerce Commission to transport general commodities (except Classes A and B explosives, household goods as defined by the Commission, and commodities in bulk), between points in 18 eastern states and the District of Columbia at Docket No. MC-30136 (Sub-No. 2). The authority extends from Massachusetts in the northeast to Wisconsin and Missouri in the west, and as far south as North Carolina. Under this authority applicant is authorized to provide service between all points in Pennsylvania on an interstate basis.

Copies of the aforesaid PUC certificates and ICC certificates are attached hereto as Appendices A and B, respectively.

5. Duplicating Authority Which Will Result From Grant of Authority.

Pitt-Ohio is not seeking to duplicate authority and has no objection to a restriction that any duplication of authority resulting from the grant of this application may be construed as a single grant of operating authority.

6. Dual Operations Resulting From Grant of Authority.

Approval of this application will not result in any dual operations since applicant does not hold any contract carrier authority from this Commission.

7. Pertinent Terminal Facilities and Communications Network.

Applicant's main office and terminal is located at 27th & A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, PA. This terminal also has office facilities and parking area for vehicles. The terminal itself is a 29-door facility which is jointly used by applicant and two other carriers.

Applicant also maintains a terminal near the PennsylvaniaOhio state line in the vicinity of Darlington Township, Beaver
County, PA and East Palestine, Columbiana County, OH. Applicant leases 16 doors of the complete terminal, as well as office space and a parking area.

Applicant also maintains an eight-door terminal in Paulsboro, NJ. That terminal is equipped to handle both LTL and truckload traffic, and is situated so as to serve the eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey areas.

Applicant's operation is set up on a direct dispatch system in order to facilitate the providing of equipment and service to customers. After delivery of a shipment drivers are instructed to call the main terminal for instructions concerning the pickup of return loads, if arrangements have not already been made. Applicant maintains direct telephone communications with its customers in order to coordinate the flow of equipment.

8. Pertinent Equipment.

At its Pittsburgh terminal applicant has assigned seven tractors, seven trailers and one straight truck. At its East Palestine terminal it has assigned five tractors, five trailers and 14 straight trucks. The Paulsboro, NJ terminal has assigned three tractors, four trailers and four straight trucks.

9. Safety Program.

Applicant maintains a complete safety program which is conducted in compliance with the safety regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, the Federal Department of Transportation, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and the Interstate Commerce Commission. Under this program all drivers are investigated and examined prior to employment. Before a driver is allowed to take charge of the road equipment, he must successfully demonstrate his ability to operate safely such equipment. During the time of his employment he is periodically given safety instructions that require him to meet certain high standards of operation. Our program also includes safety meetings at which films are shown and discussions conducted concerning the safe operation of equipment.

Pitt-Ohio has implemented a preventive maintenance program which requires the checking and servicing of equipment on a regular basis. Every vehicle is given a routine service check every 12,000 miles to insure that it is safe to operate and to avoid possible breakdowns while on the road.

We operate a maintenance facility at our main terminal in Pittsburgh which is equipped with two bays for servicing equipment.

Insurance is maintained by Pitt-Ohio in excess of the Commission's requirements.

10. Type of Service Currently Provided to the Supporting Shippers.

Applicant does not hold any authority currently from this Commission to provide service for the supporting shippers.

However, Pitt-Ohio is authorized pursuant to its interstate certificate to transport general commodities between all points in 18 states and the District of Columbia. Interstate shipments are being handled for many-of the supporting shippers to and from points within the authorized territory.

This application is designed to expand the scope of applicant's service available to the shippers to include intrastate shipments within the application area. At the same time it will assist Pitt-Ohio in conducting a more balanced operation. With the approval of this application, Pitt-Ohio will be able to transport property, subject to the restrictions set forth above, for the benefit of the supporting shippers as well as other similarly situated shippers within the application area.

11. Type of Service to be Offered.

Pitt-Ohio is familiar with the transportation requirements of the shippers and is experienced in handling their freight. Service will be made available generally on a

five day per week basis during normal business hours. In addition, the shippers will be able to obtain pickup and/or delivery service at other than normal business hours Monday through Friday, and on weekends and holidays.

Pitt-Ohio intends to offer a scheduled pick-up and scheduled delivery service to accommodate the needs of the supporting shippers. This will involve making equipment available at the pick-up and delivery points at pre-designated times so as to avoid congestion, and facilitate the loading and unloading procedures of both the shipper and the receiver. This service will be made available in connection with both outbound and inbound traffic for the shippers.

Most of the transportation which applicant renders consists of less-than-truckload shipments from a single origin point to several destination points. This is the type of operation which applicant expects will be requested by the shippers under the proposed service. However, to the extent it is required, truckload shipments will also be handled. Generally, applicant will be able to provide an overnight delivery service between the points which are located within the application area.

We will provide the supporting shippers with suitable equipment immediately upon their request for transportation services.

Applicant specializes in the transportation of general freight, particularly less-than-truckload shipments, which is the type of service required by the supporting shippers.

12. Financial Data.

There is attached to my statement as Appendix C the latest available balance sheet of Pitt-Ohio. Attached to my statement as Appendix D is an income statement of applicant for the 12-month period ending with the date of the balance sheet.

The financial documents show that Pitt-Ohio is financially able to provide the proposed service. It is not anticipated that any additional equipment will be required in order to meet the needs of the shipping public, but if necessary, the applicant is willing and able to acquire such additional equipment in order to serve the needs of the shipping public.

13. Feasibility of Operations.

Pitt-Ohio has developed a sound transportation system under its operations as currently authorized by the PUC and the ICC. Therefore, vehicles which are delivering freight pursuant to these currently authorized operations at points in Pennsylvania will be available for assignment to handle intrastate traffic within the scope of the territory sought to be served pursuant to this application. This will enable Pitt-Ohio to eliminate to the greatest extent possible any deadhead mileage. The present application would allow Pitt-Ohio to provide service on an intrastate basis similar to the service presently being provided on an interstate basis, and to certain shippers on an intrastate basis. It is in applicant's best interests from the standpoint of efficiency and economy to conduct its operations in this

manner, so that empty mileage may be kept to an absolute minimum.

14. Other Information Deemed Pertinent by the Witness.

Applicant believes that the proposed service is necessary and proper for the accommodation of the public.

Recently Breman's Express Company terminated its LTL operations in a substantial portion of the territory which applicant seeks to serve under this application. A copy of Breman's letter to its customers advising them of the termination of LTL service is attached hereto as Appendix E.

Significantly, this action by Breman's is only the most recent in a series of terminations of operations by numerous carriers formerly providing LTL service in this area. Under these circumstances, many shippers have been unable to secure the service necessary to meet their transportation needs, as evidenced by the letters in support of this application submitted by various shippers, as well as continuing requests for service which applicant has received.

By this temporary authority application, Pitt-Ohio seeks to immediately fill the void created by the termination of LTL service by various carriers, and most recently by Breman's, and to provide the shipping public with a dependable and reliable common carrier service.

It should also be noted that the application for permanent authority, which is identical in scope to the application for authority sought herein, is now unopposed. As

discussed above, there is an immediate and urgent need for the proposed service, and Pitt-Ohio strongly believes that the shipping public should not be required to await Commission action on its permanent authority application in order for the applicant to provide the needed service.

For all of the above reasons, Pitt-Ohio respectfully requests that the temporary authority application be granted in its entirety.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission by an application filed on February 26, 1982 and which was advertised in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of March 20, 1982. No protests were received and the record is now certified to the Commission without oral hearing. Verified statements were submitted by the applicant and the supporting shipper.

Robert F. Hammel, secretary of Pitt-Ohio Express, Inc. (or applicant), states in a verified statement that he is familiar with the day-to-day operations of the company and is authorized to submit evidence on its behalf in this proceeding. The company has its principal place of business located at 27th & A.V.R.R., Pittsburgh, Allegheny County. It presently holds common carrier authority from this Commission and the Interstate Commerce Commission.

The applicant's main terminal is located in Pittsburgh and a second terminal is maintained in East Liverpool, Ohio. As herein pertinent, the Pittsburgh terminal is equipped with 29 loading and unloading doors and is situated within 10 miles of the supporting shipper's warehouse in McKees Rocks. It has daily contact with the shipper since it does provide it with interstate service.

The operating fleet consists of six tractors, eight trailers and 16 straight trucks, all of which are company-owned with the exception of one tractor and one trailer. The equipment is suitable for handling the traffic involved in the proposed service. A comprehensive safety program is administered on a daily basis and insurance is carried in excess of that required by local and federal regulatory agencies.

In support of its financial position, the applicant submitted an unaudited balance sheet which indicates that as of May 31, 1982, it had current assets of \$258,347, total assets of \$350,653, and current liabilities of \$137,096 with no long-term liabilities, leaving stock-holders' equity of \$213,557. An unaudited statement of income for the first five months of 1982 discloses that from operating income of \$751,193, it incurred operating expenses of \$674,678, providing a net operating income of \$76,515. It had accumulated retained earnings of \$163,557.

David A. Giroux is vice president-sales for USCO Distribution Services, Inc. (USCO or shipper), which is headquartered in Middlebury, Connecticut, and as here pertinent, operates a warehouse in McKees Rocks, Allegheny County. The witness states in a supporting verified statement that he is responsible for the company's shipping and receiving functions and is authorized to represent it in this application.

USCO is engaged in the warehousing business and operates about 35 facilities at various large metropolitan areas throughout the country including the McKees Rocks warehouse. The McKees Rocks warehouse consists of about 122,000 square feet and is equipped with 10 docks for loading and unloading. It employs 14 persons who conduct operations from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., five days a week.

The items warehoused can be primarily categorized as hospital service products which include every type of material and supply that a medical facility would use in its daily operations. Everything from band-aids to operating tables, including items such as mops, wheelchairs, crutches, etc., are routinely involved. It is undertaking a new program in its distribution operation to serve medical care facilities in Pennsylvania, including members of hospital groups. Initially, it anticipates there will be three to four less-than-truckload shipments per day with each shipment weighing 1,000 to 2,000 pounds. After the program becomes well-established, it believes there will be a sufficient number of orders available to consolidate into full truckloads at the rate of one or two loads per day.

The inbound shipments will consist of hospital supplies and equipment moving from suppliers throughout Pennsylvania. The volume will depend upon market conditions and the availability of products from local suppliers at competitive prices. USCO is responsible for making inbound delivery arrangements from its suppliers and from the warehouse to its customers, paying the freight charges on all outbound shipments and a substantial portion of the inbound.

An appendix to the verified statement indicates there are over 100 hospital and medical facilities that initially are potential customers located in excess of 50 individual communities. Actually, any point in Pennsylvania having medical facilities is a potential point of destination. Presently, the hospitals and medical facilities are receiving their goods on a shipment-by-shipment basis directly from the manufacturers or suppliers. The purpose of USCO's warehouse operation is to eliminate the necessity for each health care facility receiving numerous small shipments. USCO will consolidate the shipments so that each facility will receive all of its weekly supplies on one delivery.

USCO does not know of any carrier which has the authority as well as the equipment and personnel necessary to implement this new distribution program adequately. It has worked closely with the applicant during the planning stages of the operation and feels confident it can perform satisfactorily.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

USCO Distribution Services, Inc., is in the process of implementing a new warehousing/distribution program within Pennsylvania, specializing primarily in the handling of virtually all types of products associated with the medical care industry. The warehouse is located in McKees Rocks, Allegheny County, and by this application, Pitt-Ohio Express seeks authority for the right to transport property from the warehouse to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa, a service which is crucial to the success of the shipper's contemplated program.

USCO will be providing a complete service to the medical industry which will involve the receiving of supplies inbound from various Pennsylvania vendors, placing them in storage and then filling customer orders which are consolidated for shipment on a weekly basis. USCO will provide the additional service of paying the freight and selecting the carrier on all outbound shipments as it will also do for the majority of the inbound movements. The wide variety of commodities involved coupled with the well-dispersed locations of its customers has convinced us that the applicant's request for the broad statewide authority to transport "property" is appropriate and necessary to meet the shipper's overall needs.

We are equally convinced that the applicant is well-qualified to assume the additional authority and provide a responsive service.

The applicant's Pittsburgh terminal is within very close proximity (10 miles) of the shipper's warehouse, making it particularly advantageous to the establishment of a close working relationship so necessary in distribution programs of this nature. The applicant's finances appear exceptionally sound and it operates the type of equipment required by the shipper. We find: 1. That the applicant has shown that a public need for the proposed service does exist. 2. That the applicant is fit, ready, willing and able to properly provide the service proposed. 3. That approval of the application is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: That the application be and is hereby approved and that the certificate issued to the applicant on March 4, 1981, be amended to include the following right: To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from the facilities of USCO Distribution Services, Inc., located in the borough of McKees Rocks, Allegheny County, to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa;

subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk.
- 2. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation granted herein until it shall have complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Law and the rules and regulations of the Commission relative to the filing and acceptance of a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1982 AND 1981

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements of the Corporation are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, consistent with reporting for federal income tax purposes.

Property is recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided for on the straight-line method based upon the estimated useful lives of the assets. Assets acquired after January 1, 1981 are being depreciated according to the new accelerated cost recovery system, as defined in the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981.

NOTE B - LEASE AGREEMENTS

The Corporation leases revenue equipment on a monthly basis with rentals amounting to \$110,438 and \$84,650 for 1982 and 1981, respectively.

The Corporation also leases terminal facilities with rentals amounting to \$15,450 and \$8,050 for 1982 and 1981, respectively. This lease is for a period of 60 months.

NOTE C - COVENANT NOT TO COMPETE

On May 22, 1979, the Corporation entered into a covenant not to compete agreement with Vincent White for a total consideration of \$125,000. \$75,000 of this total was paid on May 22, 1979 with the balance of \$50,000 payable in two equal installments of \$25,000, due January 1, 1980 and January 1, 1981. These payments are without interest. The January 1, 1980 payment was made on December 28, 1979 and the January 1, 1981 payment was made on December 29, 1980. This agreement is being amortized over thirty-six months.

NOTE D - NOTES PAYABLE

The debt due Martera, Inc. is subject to interest at 8% for 1983.


