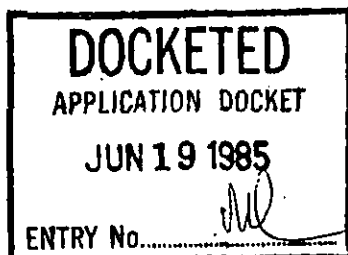

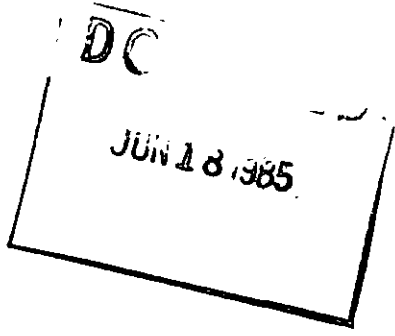

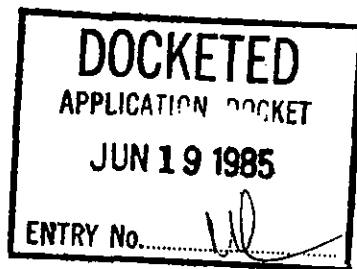

Newcomer Trucking, Inc. has authority, at Docket No. A-00102265, to transport property from points in Allegheny County to points in Armstrong, Clarion, Forest, Jefferson, Greene and Butler Counties, and vice versa, with certain exclusions. At F.1, Am-F of its certificate, Newcomer is authorized to transport property between points in the City of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, and within ten miles of the limits of said city, and, as a Class C Carrier, from points in said territory to points within thirty miles of the limits of Pittsburgh. Protestant Newcomer also has authority to transport property from the City of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, to points on various routes in McKean and Elk Counties, and vice versa. Newcomer has authority at Docket No. A-00102265, F.1, Am-G, to transport property, excluding household goods in use, commodities in bulk, and property which, because of size or weight, requires the use of special equipment, between points in Butler County, and from points in said county to points in Armstrong,

Beaver, Clarion, Greene, Fayette, Forest, Jefferson, Venango,
Washington and Westmoreland Counties, and vice versa.

NEWCOMER TRUCKING, INC.

1. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, to points on the following route and vice versa, excluding service to or from points on the route between Pittsburgh and the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and also excluding service to or from the borough of Shippenville, Clarion County:

Beginning in the city of Pittsburgh, thence crossing the Allegheny River and via Highway Route 28 to Kittanning, thence via Highway Route 66 to New Bethlehem, and Clarion, thence via Highway Route 66 to Fryburg, Clarion County, thence via Highway Route 36 to Leeper, Clarion County, thence via Highway Route 68 to Marienville, Forest County, thence returning via Highway Route 68 to Leeper and continuing on Highway Route 68, via Lucinda to its junction with Highway Routes 66 and 322; thence via Highway Routes 66, 68 and 322; to Clarion, thence via Highway Route 68 through Rimersburg and East Brady, to its intersection with Highway Route 268, thence via Highway Route 268 through Cowansville, to its intersection with Highway Route 28, thence to Kittanning via Highway Route 28, and thence returning to the city of Pittsburgh from Kittanning via Highway Route 28.

with right No. 1 above subject to the following conditions:

a. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use, from points in the Borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and within ten (10) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of the said borough to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa.

b. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport clay products from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and within ten (10) miles of the limits of the said borough, to points in Pennsylvania.

c. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport catalogs for Montgomery Ward & Company between points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, to post offices and stores of the said company within fifty (50) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of the said borough.

d. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport peanut butter and peanut products in truckload lots for the H. B. DeViney Company, Inc., from its plant in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, to points in Pennsylvania.

2. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property over the alternate route between Pittsburgh and the intersection of Highway Routes 268 and 68, near Millerstown, Butler County, via Highway Routes 8 and 68; the purpose of this right being intended to describe merely an alternate route, but the carrier shall not be authorized to pick up or deliver property at any point thereon.

3. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, to points on the following extension, and vice versa:

Beginning in the village of Marienville, Forest County, thence via Highway Route 68 to the borough of Kane, McKean County, thence via Highway Route 219 to the village of Wilcox, Elk County.

4. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from points in the county of Allegheny to points on the following route and extension thereof, and vice versa, excluding service from points in the county of Allegheny to points on the route between Pittsburgh and the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and vice versa, and also excluding service to or from the borough of Shippenville, Clarion County:

Beginning in the city of Pittsburgh, thence crossing the Allegheny River and via Highway Route 28 to Kittanning, thence via Highway Route 66 to New Bethlehem and Clarion, thence via Highway Route 66 to Fryburg, Clarion County, thence via Highway Route 36 to Leeper, Clarion County, thence via Highway Route 68 to Marienville, Forest County, thence returning via Highway Route 68 to Leeper and continuing on Highway Route 68, via Lucinda, to its junction with Highway Routes 66 and 322, thence via Highway Routes 66, 68 and 322 to Clarion, thence via Highway Route 68 through Rimersburg and East Brady to its intersection with Highway Route 268, thence via Highway Route 268 through Cowansville to its intersection with Highway Route 28, thence to Kittanning via Highway Route 28, and thence returning to the city of Pittsburgh from Kittanning via Highway Route 28.

Extension beginning in the village of Marienville, Forest County, thence via Highway Route 68 to the borough of Kane, McKean County, thence via Old Highway Route 219 to the village of Wilcox, Elk County;

with right No. 4 above subject to the following conditions:

a. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use, from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and within ten (10) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of the said borough to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa.

b. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport clay products from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and within ten (10) miles of the limits of the said borough, to points in Pennsylvania.

c. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport catalogs for Montgomery Ward & Company between points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, to post offices and stores of the said company within fifty (50) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of the said borough.

d. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport peanut butter and peanut products in truckload lots for the H. B. DeViney Company, Inc., from its plant in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, to points in Pennsylvania.

e. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport property from, to or between the stores and warehouses of the G. C. Murphy Company;

with rights Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 above subject to the following conditions:

A. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk in tank vehicles;

B. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport property requiring the use of drop-frame trailers, winch trucks or tractors and/or pole trailers.

To interchange property, as authorized by the certificate; in the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, with Class A carriers, Class B carriers, and Class D carriers operating over regular routes, subject to the provisions of Pa. Code Title 52, Chapter 31.

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, except household goods and commodities in bulk, from points in the county of Allegheny, to points in the county of Greene and vice versa; with the right to interchange property with Class A, B and D carriers so authorized at points in the county of Allegheny;

- (d) That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service to or from the facilities of Glenshaw Glass Company in the county of Allegheny.
- (e) That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service to or from the facilities of Datafold Forms, Inc., in the township of Franklin, Greene County.

To transport, as a Class D carrier, property (excluding household goods in use; property in bulk and property which, because of size or weight, requires the use of special equipment), from points in the County of Allegheny to points in the Counties of Armstrong, Clarion, Forest and Jefferson, and vice versa;

Provided that no right, power or privilege is granted to transport:

(1) Property to or from the facilities of Amax, Inc. and Climax Molybdenum Corp.

(2) Shipments of iron and steel and iron and steel articles, which weigh in excess of 10,000 pounds from one consignor to one consignee, from points in Allegheny County to the Boroughs of Aliquippa and Ambridge, Beaver County, and vice versa.

1. To transport, as a Class A carrier, property between the cities of Butler, Butler County, and Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, via Saxonburg, Culmerville, Curtisville and Russellton, over the following route:

Beginning in the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, thence via Highway Route 8 to Saxonburg Boulevard, thence via Saxonburg Boulevard to Saxonburg, Butler County, thence via an unnumbered highway route to the city of Butler, Butler County; with the right to use Highway Route 8 as an operating route only between the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, and the city of Butler, Butler County, excluding the right to render service between points on said route except as authorized herein.

2. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property from points in the county of Allegheny to points on the following route, and vice versa:

Beginning in the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, thence via Highway Route 8 to Saxonburg Boulevard, thence via Saxonburg Boulevard to Saxonburg, Butler County, thence via an unnumbered highway route to the city of Butler, Butler County; with the right to use Highway Route 8 as an operating route only between the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, and the city of Butler, Butler County, excluding the right to render service between points on Highway Route 8, except as otherwise authorized;

with right No. 2 immediately above subject to the following conditions:

(a) That no right, power or privilege is granted to render service to or from the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, except as hereinabove authorized.

(b) That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport property requiring the use of carryalls, winch trucks, winch tractors or pole trailers.

3. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property from points in the borough of East Butler, Butler County, to points in the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, and vice versa, excluding the right to serve intermediate points.

4. To interchange property with connecting Class A carriers in the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, and to participate in through routes and joint rates with said connecting carriers and to interchange equipment in emergencies.

5. To transport, as a Class A carrier, property between Pittsburgh and Westwood, Allegheny County, via Crafton and Thornburg.

6. To transport, as a Class B carrier, property between points in the city of Butler, Butler County, and within three (3) miles of the limits of the said city.

7. To transport, as a Class C carrier, property for Colbert and Matlick, Nicks Radiator & Body Shop, Standard Motor Company, John Kemper, Franklin Glass Corporation, Hoffman Auto Parts Company, Butler Hardware Company, American Mirror Works, Standard Oil Company, Watson Standard Paint and Glass Company, and L. & L. Auto Parts Company and Valvoline Oil Company from points in the city of Butler, Butler County, and within three (3) miles of the limits of the said city to points within thirty (30) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of the city of Butler and to points in the county of Allegheny;

with rights Nos. 6 and 7 immediately above subject to the following condition:

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use.

8. To transport, as a Class D carrier, office records and similar property to be stored in the underground warehouse of National Underground Storage, Inc., from points in the county of Allegheny and the city of Butler, Butler County and within an airline distance of three (3) statute miles of the limits of the said city, to the said warehouse located in the townships of Marion and Cherry, Butler County, and vice versa.

That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport commodities in bulk.
