





Newcomer Trucking, Inc. holds authority, at Docket No. A-00102265, which authorizes the transportation of property from points in Allegheny County to points in Armstrong, Clarion, Forest, Jefferson, Greene and Butler Counties, and vice versa, with certain exclusions. Newcomer also holds authority, at F.1, Am-G, which authorizes the transportation of property, between points in Butler County, and from points in said county to points in the Counties of Armstrong, Beaver, Clarion, Greene, Fayette, Forest, Jefferson, Venango, Washington and Westmoreland. At F.1, Am-F of its certificate, Newcomer is authorized to transport property between points in the City of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, and within ten miles of the limits of said city, and, as a Class C carrier, from points in said territory to points within 30 miles of the limits of Pittsburgh. Protestant Newcomer also has authority to transport property from the City of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, to points on various routes in McKean and Elk Counties, and vice versa. In addition, other authority of this protestant may be in conflict with that sought by this application as more fully set forth on Appendix B hereto.

NEWCOMER TRUCKING, INC.

1. To transport, as a Class D carrier, property, from the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, to points on the following route and vice versa, excluding service to or from points on the route between Pittsburgh and the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and also excluding service to or from the borough of Shippenville, Clarion County:

Beginning in the city of Pittsburgh, thence crossing the Allegheny River and via Highway Route 28 to Kittanning, thence via Highway Route 66 to New Bethlehem, and Clarion, thence via Highway Route 66 to Fryburg, Clarion County, thence via Highway Route 36 to Leeper, Clarion County, thence via Highway Route 68 to Marienville, Forest County, thence returning via Highway Route 68 to Leeper and continuing on Highway Route 68, via Lucinda to its junction with Highway Routes 66 and 322; thence via Highway Routes 66, 68 and 322; to Clarion, thence via Highway Route 68 through Rimersburg and East Brady, to its intersection with Highway Route 268, thence via Highway Route 268 through Cowansville, to its intersection with Highway Route 28, thence to Kittanning via Highway Route 28, and thence returning to the city of Pittsburgh from Kittanning via Highway Route 28.

with right No. 1 above subject to the following conditions:

a. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use, from points in the Borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and within ten (10) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of the said borough to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa.

b. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport clay products from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and within ten (10) miles of the limits of the said borough, to points in Pennsylvania.

c. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport catalogs for Montgomery Ward & Company between points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, to post offices and stores of the said company within fifty (50) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of the said borough.

d. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport peanut butter and peanut products in truckload lots for the H. B. DeViney Company, Inc., from its plant in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, to points in Pennsylvania.

a. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport household goods in use, from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and within ten (10) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of the said borough to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa.

b. That no right, power or privilege is granted to transport clay products from points in the borough of New Bethlehem, Clarion County, and within ten (10) miles of the limits of the said borough, to points in Pennsylvania.
